











# How to mark your work with an open license

CONTENT TYPE	WHERE TO PLACE CC LICENSE INFORMATION	WHAT TO INCLUDE (REQUIREMENTS)
 <p>Online Text/ Webpage</p>	<p>Webpage <b>footer</b></p>	<p><b>Minimum requirement:</b> The name and full URL (hyperlink) to the applicable license; a copyright notice stating the author(s), date and copyright.</p>
 <p>Online Image or Audio</p>	<p>Immediately <b>below or next to</b> the content. Recite at the <b>beginning or end of</b> the original audio file/broadcast audio reciting the type of CC license used</p>	<p><i>This work is licensed under CC-BY version 4.0 <a href="https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by/4.0">https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by/4.0</a></i></p>
 <p>Online Video or Presentation</p>	<p>Immediately below or next to the content and include a <b>copyright screen/page</b></p>	<p>© 2014, [Name of Author(s)]. Some Rights Reserved.</p> <p>If your content incorporates third party works, specify which elements are not CC licensed, and include proper attribution for all third party works.</p>
 <p>Link to Document, Image, Video or other content</p>	<p>Immediately <b>below or next to</b> the link</p>	<p><b>Optional:</b> a CC license icon that includes a CC logo linked to the appropriate CC license deed. Best practice is to use the <a href="#">CC license chooser</a> to generate a machine-readable CC license.</p>
 <p>Collection of Documents for Download (example: a zip file)</p>	<p>Immediately <b>below or next to</b> the download link and include a <b>text file</b> with the CC license in the download; where appropriate, place CC mark in content. Include a text file called <b>LICENSE.txt</b> in the zip file that identifies license terms for the included works, particularly where not directly marked (as with images).</p>	
 <p>Offline Text/ Document</p>	<p><b>Cover page</b> or include a <b>copyright page</b></p>	
 <p>Offline Image</p>	<p>Immediately <b>below or near</b> the image, if included in another work. In a <b>separate text file</b> if distributed standalone (or create a zip file, see above)</p>	
 <p>Offline Video</p>	<p><b>Title screen</b> or include a <b>copyright screen</b></p>	
 <p>Offline Presentation</p>	<p><b>Title page</b> or include a <b>copyright page</b></p>

 Offline Audio	Recite at the <b>beginning or end of</b> the original audio file/broadcast audio reciting the type of CC license used.	<p><b>Minimum requirement:</b> “This work is licensed under [License Name], a copy of which is available online at [URL]...”</p> <p><b>Optional:</b> Recite the name of the author(s), date and copyright.</p>

## TIPS

For online content, use the Creative Commons **license chooser** which can be found at [creativecommons.org/choose](https://creativecommons.org/choose).

Copy and paste the HTML code into your webpage or website.

**Benefits:** The code: makes it easier for others to provide you proper attribution; increases the chance your work will be found in online searches; and provides editable text to suit your needs. For instance, if your content is composed of the work of third parties, you can specify which parts of your content are under a CC license and which parts are offered under other terms. For online and offline content, **Creative Commons icons** can be found at [creativecommons.org/about/downloads](https://creativecommons.org/about/downloads)

If you are marking work that contains content **already licensed under a Creative Commons license**, follow the example below:
