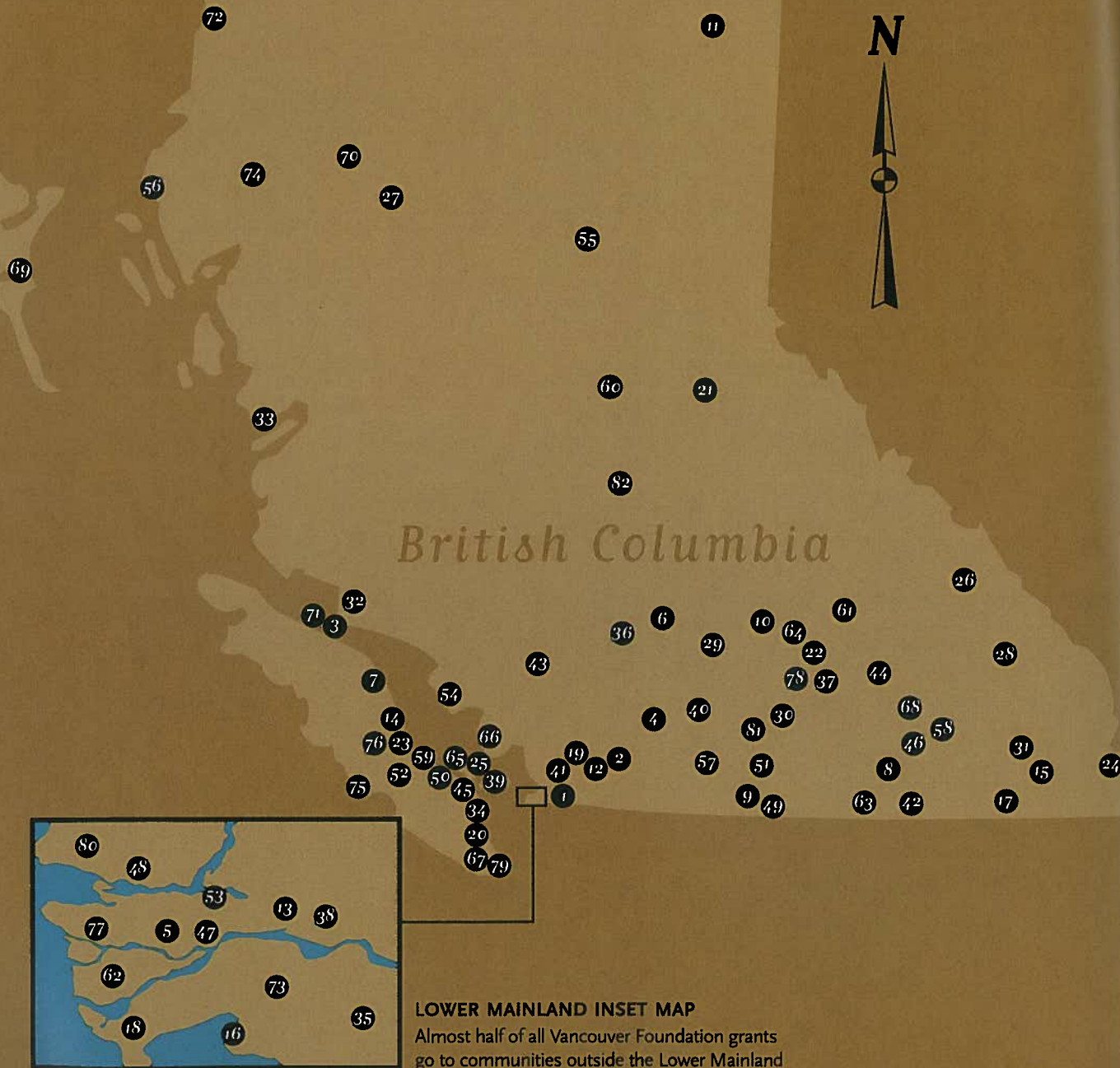
Our Mission

The Power of Legacy

Annual reports provide an opportunity to pause, reflect on past accomplishments and give voice to a vision for the future. This is especially true of this 2002 report, as last year we spent time thinking about and preparing for a historic milestone that will already have been achieved by the time you read this: Vancouver Foundation's 60th anniversary. Our purpose is simple—to ensure we continue to strengthen communities across the Province for another 60 years and beyond.

Fortunately, we have had a role model to guide us. A visionary woman who through a single act of generosity helped create the largest community foundation in Canada. Her name is Alice MacKay.

The world in which she lived was very different from today. Many of the social services we now take for granted did not exist: there was no national welfare program, no unemployment insurance, no publicly funded daycare. Universal health care, which we as Canadians are so proud of, was still years away. People were left to fend for themselves in a way that is easy to forget.

However, Alice MacKay saw the hardships endured by those less fortunate than herself and she decided to do something about it. In her will she left a \$1,000 bequest to help improve the quality of life in BC. Ms. MacKay's gift inspired industrialist W.J. VanDusen to join in her mission. VanDusen and nine local business leaders gave \$10,000 each to create a permanent \$101,000 endowment fund to be administered by a new organization called Vancouver Foundation. And so, from one woman's desire to give back to her community, and from one man's vision, Vancouver Foundation was born.

And what a legacy it has become. Today Vancouver Foundation manages over 800 separate endowment funds worth approximately \$500 million. Since 1943, we have granted nearly \$500 million in income from these funds to non-profit groups throughout the Province. These grants have supported thousands of projects, from theatre productions and salmon habitat restorations, to medical research and crisis centres. Last year alone, we distributed \$32 million to hundreds of organizations, supporting many important initiatives that otherwise might never have been realized.

But the numbers only tell part of the story. To really understand the impact of our grants, you need only see the smile on the face of a child playing with a kitten for the first time. Or listen to an inspiring violin concerto performed by a young virtuoso. Or share in the pride of an inner-city neighbourhood which has worked together to build its own community centre.

W.J. VanDusen understood the importance of creating permanent endowment funds, providing income to forever support both the needs and the hopes of future generations. By creating the base for an unrestricted fund, he ensured the flexibility required to help our communities. Many of the grants highlighted in our 2002 Annual Report have been paid from the VanDusen Foundation which, along with the Alma VanDusen Fund, are among our largest and oldest funds. Sixty years later, VanDusen's vision is still having a significant impact, proving that while you cannot predict the future, you can certainly prepare for it.

Planning for the future and delivering responsible stewardship in the present requires wise legal counsel. Over the last decade we have relied on the expertise of Fasken Martineau DuMoulin LLP, through Leo Amighetti and his colleagues Edgar Frechette and Darrell Wickstrom, to guide our efforts to be informed and prudent in response to the needs of our donors and the administration of their funds.

Vancouver Foundation takes its responsibility for managing funds very seriously. We understand the importance of safeguarding our permanent endowment funds so that they will benefit communities across the Province for hundreds of years to come. Due to the 7.9% drop in market values during 2002, we were obliged to draw upon previously retained returns from investments (we have had some very good years!) to maintain the 5.5% distribution policy during 2002. Even after allowing for grant distributions and the market drop—the capital of the fund continues to exceed the amount of contributed principal by \$72 million. Nevertheless, the Board of Directors considered it prudent to reduce the distribution rate by 0.5% commencing January 1, 2003 and this will be reviewed as the year progresses.


In order to enhance Vancouver Foundation's ability to meet the needs of its donors and potential friends and supporters, a Professional Advisors Committee was created in 2002. Along with the Development Committee, this new committee will oversee a range of initiatives that are designed to secure our funding base. We are also launching a comprehensive professional advisors program to raise awareness of Vancouver Foundation within the community of lawyers, financial planners, and insurance advisors and trust officers.

Our organization is distinguished by the volunteers who serve on the Advisory Committees in each program area and on the Board of Directors. We have thanked a number of valued volunteers who completed their terms during this past year and we wish to also acknowledge our retiring board members; Ms. Shamin Lalani, Mr. Robert H. Lee and Mr. Jim Doyle. Their expertise, energy and interests represent the crucial resource that our volunteers lend to the work of the Foundation and our standing in the field of philanthropy.

As Canada's largest community foundation, Vancouver Foundation is providing leadership and collaborating with governments and community groups to develop a new vision for the philanthropic sector. Moreover, we are working with philanthropists to achieve their charitable dreams that will significantly impact British Columbia for decades to come.

We invite you to join us as we celebrate Vancouver Foundation's 60th Anniversary.

Preventing Hunger

Karen Sabourin knows first hand what it's like to be a hungry child. Growing up in stark poverty, she lived in a household where there was often little or no food. As a young girl, she would lie awake for nights on end crying for something to eat. Aside from some painful memories, her childhood has seriously impacted her health as an adult. Last year, her doctor told her she had developed severe Osteoporosis, attributable to poor nutrition in her youth.

"I knew that there could be damage from poor nutrition in one's youth that's irreversible," said Sabourin. "I was shocked to be told at the age of 47 that my health problems stemmed directly from my childhood and that the quality of life I will have for the rest of my life was determined in those first few years."

Determined to save other Lower Mainland children from malnutrition, Sabourin co-founded UsMoms in 2001. Operating out of the Frog Hollow Neighbourhood House in East Vancouver, UsMoms provides one box of free organic food every week to single parent families who are in financial distress and are not able to meet their family's nutritional requirements.

In 16 months, UsMoms built partnerships with 10 food suppliers. They donate the food, and a team of volunteers helps Sabourin sort and distribute it every Thursday afternoon. Beginning with just seven families in 2001, the program now serves 215 families. With an ongoing concern for children and families, Vancouver Foundation approved a \$90,000 grant to help this program grow. Over a three-year period, this money will make it possible for UsMoms to lease a warehouse, purchase a commercial fridge and hire a coordinator to increase food distribution to the 2,000 families on the waiting list. A buyer's club food co-op will also be established for families to purchase good quality food at reasonable prices.

Vancouver Foundation funded this program because it is innovative, and goes beyond a short-term solution. "Instead of just preventing hunger, it focuses on building self esteem and helping parents increase their employability," said Eva Robinson, Program Director for the Children, Youth and Families Committee. "When individuals gain confidence and self reliance, they become more responsive parents."

"Kids who aren't eating properly start the day off in trouble," said Sabourin. "On top of health problems, if you don't have proper nutrition your brain doesn't function well and the chemical imbalances create behavioural problems, learning disabilities and extreme passivity, which can affect your future."

UsMoms also runs a number of programs to enhance parents' self reliance so that they are able to better manage their families nutritional needs over the long term. Sabourin says many of the parents using UsMoms suffer from poor self-esteem and have little work experience. A series of courses on employment skills and parenting are designed to help parents gain confidence in their abilities.

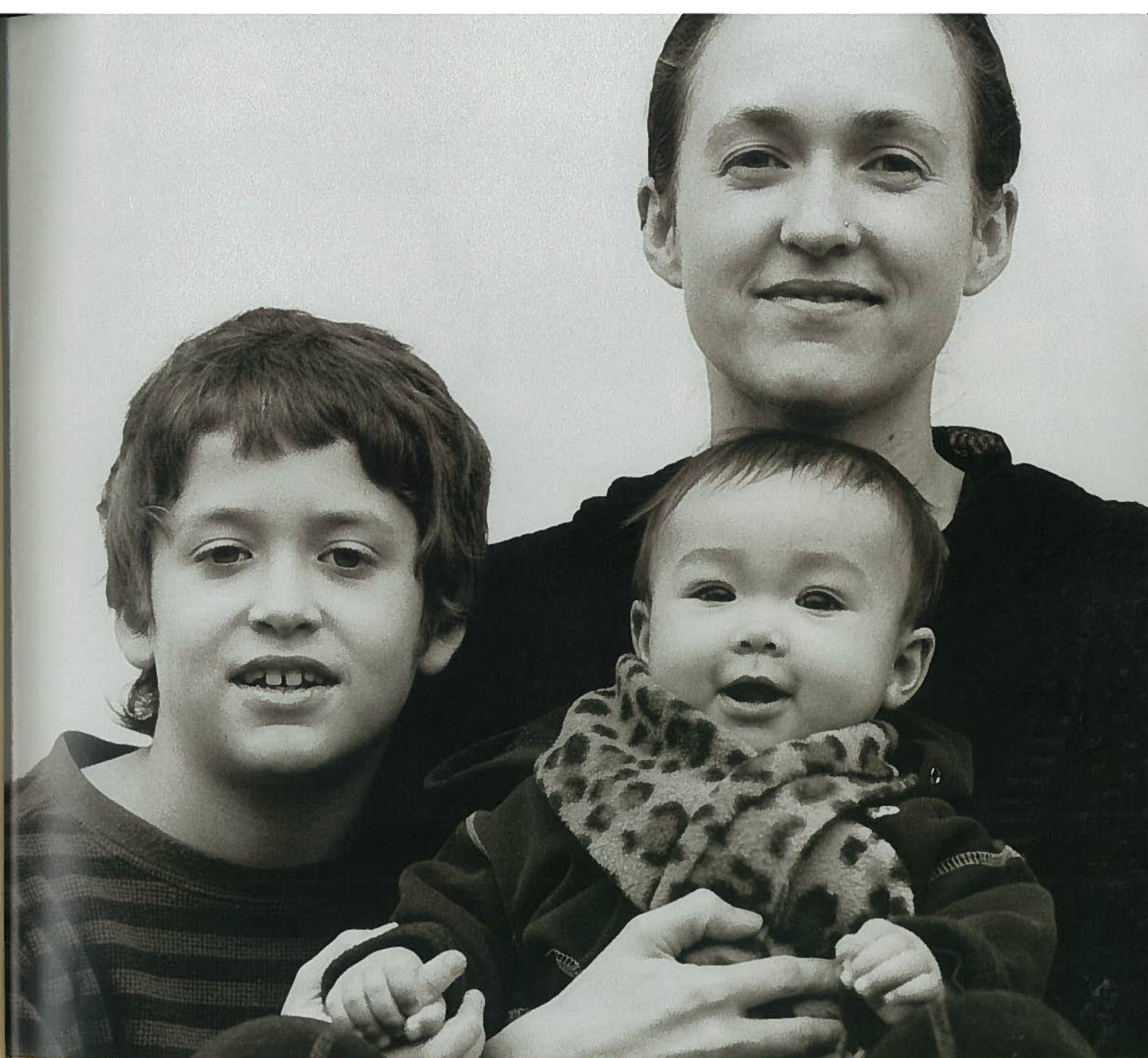
So far, UsMoms appears to be working. "We've achieved an 82% success rate," said Sabourin. "This means that the parent is participating in a self-reliance program, there is a measurable improvement in their child's activities in school and that they have made a voluntary effort to better manage the nutrition levels in the family."

Dawn Zoe is one of those success stories. Estranged from her partner, she entered the program 11 years ago as a pregnant single parent with an eight-year-old son. She had been working part-time as a waitress, but was forced to quit because of persistent nausea. Her social network had also dwindled and she was having trouble making ends meet.

"When I started with UsMoms, I was feeling pretty alone," said Zoe. "I was having trouble buying enough healthy food for me and my son and I didn't have the emotional support that I needed to take care of my family."

Today, Zoe is President of the UsMoms Board of Directors and is working on an application for a Canada Council grant to help her produce a music CD. She is also collaborating with the Déjà Vu collective to stage a musical dance production at the Vancouver East Cultural Centre later this Spring.

Most importantly, she says she has started to believe in herself again, something the grant from Vancouver Foundation has made possible. "One of the really valuable things about UsMoms is the reminder that a lot of the skills you gain as a mother are good assets for the workplace. You learn to value your experience."

Since 1964, the George W. Norgan Fund, an unrestricted fund, has supported community organizations and projects like the UsMoms initiative.

As well as contributing \$25,000 toward UsMoms, this fund made 18 grants in 2002, totalling \$282,715.

Teaching Ethics

Should we produce genetically modified food? Are business leaders responsible to anyone other than their shareholders? Can euthanasia ever be justified? These are just some of the tough questions students involved in the Ethics Initiative at Pearson College tackle every day.

Located on the wooded shores of Pedder Bay on Vancouver Island, Pearson College was founded in 1974 in commemoration of Canadian Prime Minister Lester B. Pearson. Its mission is to enable students to transcend nationalism, respect diversity, promote international understanding and become agents for change in a global society.

Vancouver Foundation's Education Committee approved the college's application for a three-year \$100,000 grant. "Peer discussion of ethical dilemmas is seen to be the most effective way of communicating these principles in schools, and with a very diverse student population, we were delighted to support Pearson's wish to share their program with other B.C. schools," said Valerie Hunter, Program Director for the Education Committee.

Every year, 200 students come on full scholarship from across Canada and around the world to complete the final years of high school and their first year of college. Selected for their passion for internationalism and a demonstrated commitment to community service in their home countries, students are expected to focus their energy on academics, residential life and community service once they arrive at Pearson College.

"We've essentially got 200 young people who want to change the world and make it a better place," said Stuart Walker, president of Pearson College. "It's an exciting, vibrant atmosphere with a lot of debate and exchange of ideas."

Over the past few years Walker and other teachers began to notice that much of the debate seemed to only focus on the what, where and how of global issues. "The difficult questions of why, and topics such as religion and culture were being avoided for fear of offending beliefs and value systems of others," he said. "We thought we needed to elevate the level of discussion so these ethical issues could be examined."

With the help of a grant from Vancouver Foundation, Pearson College launched an Ethics Initiative in the fall of 2001. This grant enabled speakers to be brought on campus to examine the role of ethics in an educational setting. Teachers were given special training on how to approach ethical issues in the classroom and a series of "ethics cafes" were held throughout the year to encourage students to discuss difficult ethical issues.

"Our goal was to provide students with a framework for understanding and talking about ethics," said Cynthia Mackenzie, Director of the Ethics Initiative. "We wanted to give them the concepts and language to examine real life ethical problems in a non-threatening manner so they could come up with their own solutions."

Last year, Mackenzie and her students took the Ethics Initiative one step further and developed an ethics curriculum that was used in more than 20 high schools in Victoria, Surrey and Richmond. In the spring and fall of 2003, Pearson College will host a series of ethics conferences throughout the province in order to get young people thinking about ethics in their own lives.

Dian Caturini came to Pearson College from Indonesia two years ago, and has been involved as a student in the Ethics Initiative from the beginning. "I never considered the ethical dimension of things before," she said. "Now I know how to analyze a problem and see both sides of every issue. It's changed the way I think."

Engendering that type of personal transformation in others is exactly what Mackenzie hopes to achieve with the Ethics Initiative, made possible through the support of Vancouver Foundation. "It's pretty exciting to see the light bulb turn on in someone's face," she said. "It means the discussion has gone beyond who can make a better point and has become personalized so that they have a better understanding of their own values, beliefs and motivations."

"It is wonderful working with Vancouver Foundation," said Grant Monck, Director of Development. "The grant has made possible this exciting new initiative in the area of international education, ethics and values."

Illuminating History

From the park outside the Vancouver Museum, the Joyce Walley Learning Centre catches the eye. Reflecting the waters of False Creek, and the North Shore mountains, this two-story glass structure is a bright and vibrant epicentre of exploration.

The Joyce Walley Learning Centre is named for the late Joyce Walley, an active education volunteer and trustee at the Museum. With the support of Vancouver Foundation, and a generous lead donation from Mrs. Walley's husband Dr. Ken Walley, the construction and opening of the Joyce Walley Learning Centre at the Vancouver Museum in 2002 marked the completion of a significant milestone in a multi-phased renewal plan.

"We recognized that this new centre will both preserve the City's heritage and educate people of all ages and backgrounds," said Valerie Hunter, Program Director for the Arts and Culture and Education Committees. "This is why we granted the museum \$150,000."

As the largest civic museum in Canada, the Vancouver Museum has been in existence almost as long as Vancouver itself, accepting and cataloguing a treasury of objects, memories and stories estimated to have a value in excess of \$45 million. Located at Vanier Park, a part of Vancouver that represents traditional common ground for three First Nations, the Museum is committed to working with the community to nurture 10,000 years of collective memory.

After thirty years, the story of Vancouver is undergoing a major facelift. Drawing on the expertise and support of the community, the new Vancouver Stories galleries will illustrate the rich and diverse history of the City in an engaging and relevant manner. The Joyce Walley Learning Centre, an integral part of the project, provides state-of-the-art educational opportunities to augment the exhibition galleries.

"Our goal throughout the ongoing revitalization program has been to connect with the community in new ways," said Pauline Thompson, CEO of the Vancouver Museum. "We'd like to see people discussing the exhibits and bringing their own personal perspectives to them. We want people who come to the museum to say, 'I recognize myself in that place.'"

In the Joyce Walley Learning Centre, large-scale exhibits form learning clusters where families, student groups and others can engage history on a gut level. The exhibits showcase stories, memories and artifacts from the people who have lived and worked in Vancouver's diverse neighbourhoods, using their experiences to illuminate the City's history. Visitors can rummage through the actual suitcases of city immigrants, leaf through high-school yearbooks, read personal diaries and listen to the voices of local First Nations in their own language.

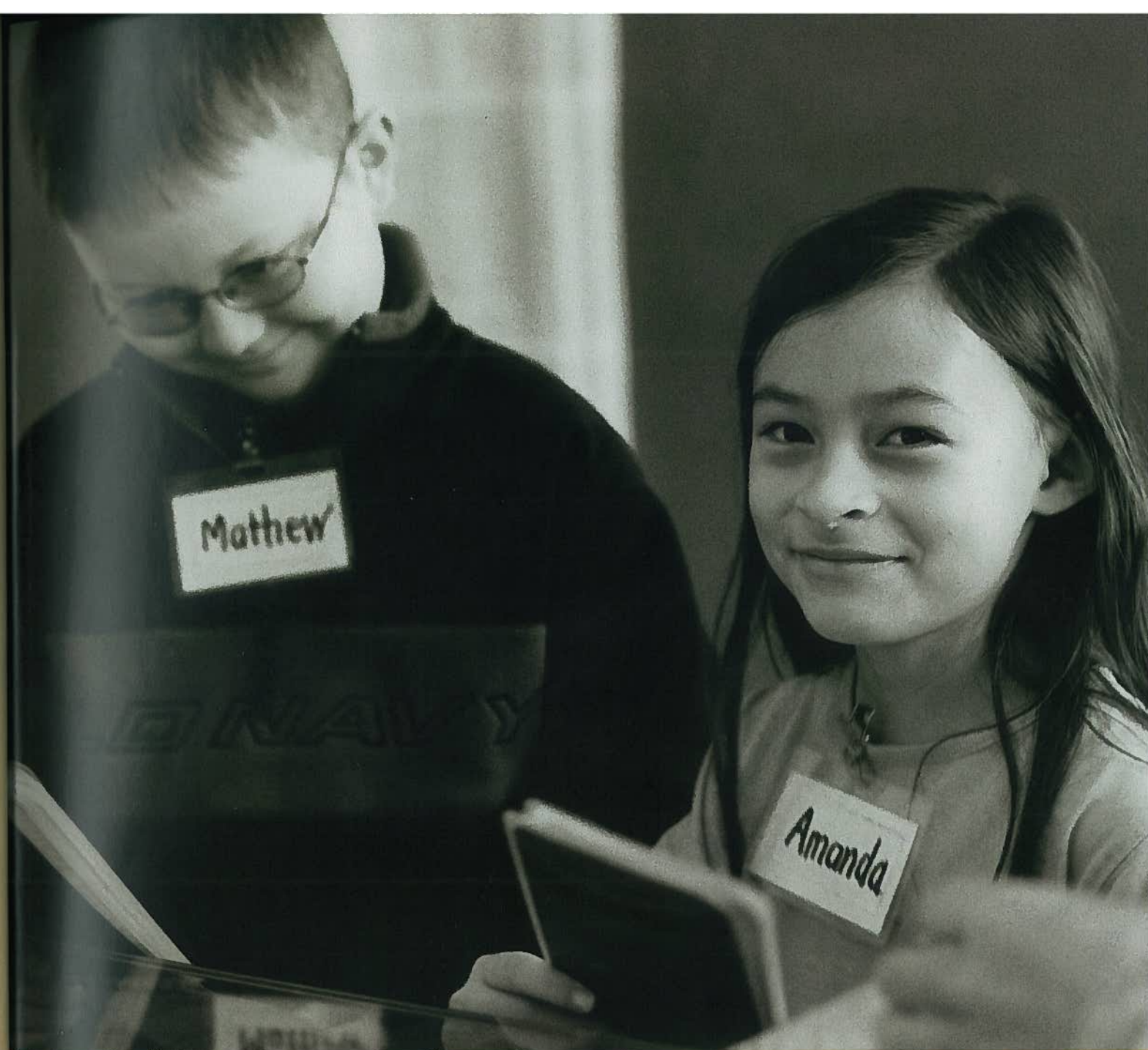
The first Vancouver Stories gallery covers the 1950s with its colourful street photos and White Spot experience, complete with a 1955 Ford Fairlane Victoria. The galleries showcase testimony from extraordinary 'ordinary' people and challenge visitors — long-time residents, recent immigrants and tourists alike — to recognize and value their own roles in history. Visitors weave their own way through the challenging stories, building their capacity for wise decision-making as parents and children, as neighbours and as citizens.

Looking ahead, Thompson hopes the reinvigorated Vancouver Museum can increase Vancouver's civic pride and contribute to its quality of life. Thanks to the grant from Vancouver Foundation, this will be possible. "Vancouver is already one of the finest cities in the world," she said. "We can improve that by understanding more about how we got here."

Building Healthy Communities

For generations, the Nuxalk First Nations fished the rich waters off BC's central coast where the Bella Coola River finishes its 70-kilometre journey through mountains and spills into the Pacific Ocean. But today, the once bountiful runs of sockeye salmon have all but disappeared, taking with them a way of life and a vital staple of the band's diet. Now, junk food has partly replaced this staple.

The result has been an explosion of diabetes. "This is a serious medical concern," said Sarah Chivers, Vancouver Foundation's Program Director for the BC Medical Services Foundation. "We provided a \$5,000 development grant to the University of Northern British Columbia to find out more about the prevalence of diabetes among the Nuxalk First Nation."

"One of the biggest problems in our community are the sugar stores," said Bill Tallio, health and wellness coordinator for the Nuxalk band in Bella Coola. "There must be at least seven or eight of them for a population of about 1,200. That is one store full of pop and chips for every 150 people. The effect on people's diet and health has been huge."

Throughout the 1980s and 1990s, Tallio watched with alarm as the number of diabetes cases in Bella Coola appeared to grow. Even his brother and sister contracted the illness. However, there was only anecdotal evidence to suggest the incidence of diabetes was increasing.

"It was obvious there was something going on," said Tallio. "But we didn't really know who had diabetes, what type they had and the extent of it in the population. Without this basic information, it's difficult to come up with effective treatment and prevention strategies."

Tallio teamed up with Dr. Harvey Thommasen, Chair of Community Health at UNBC. Thommasen's interest in diabetes in Bella Coola sprang from his experience working as a family doctor in the community for 10 years. Together, they developed a health survey and collected baseline data on a number of health-related issues.

Thanks to the grant from Vancouver Foundation, Thommasen and Tallio have been able to input the data they gathered into spreadsheets. By conducting a statistical analysis on this data, they developed a picture of the situation in Bella Coola.

What they discovered was far worse than anyone had imagined. In 1988, there were an estimated 14 diabetics in Bella Coola. Today, there are 120, or 10% of the entire population.

"BC is far behind other provinces in First Nations health research," said Thommasen. "By building a good quality health database the Nuxalk band can develop their own programs and be better able to obtain health care funding."

Tallio agrees. "We can use this information to help raise awareness of the seriousness of the situation," he said. "We're planning to launch a series of proactive education campaigns in the schools from kindergarten on up. We've started handing out booklets on healthy foods that will help manage the symptoms of diabetes and prevent the onset of the disease in young people. I'd also like to bring back some of the fitness programs we used to run."

Tallio hopes his plans will help reduce diabetes in his community. "Diabetes is a real killer," he said. "But we can beat it."

"I am thrilled Vancouver Foundation has assisted us," Thommasen said. "The grant made these initiatives possible."

The Robert and Florence Filberg Fund was established in 1976. In 2002 this fund provided \$1,353,623 for 75 projects including the \$5,000 development grant to the University of Northern British Columbia, for a study of diabetes in Bella Coola.

Promoting Animal Welfare

For as long as she can remember, Mary Anne Hajer has loved cats. So when the retired schoolteacher saw a feature in her local paper about the Richmond Homeless Cats Society, she knew she had to get involved.

"A couple of years ago, I volunteered for a feeding and cleaning shift at the Society and I've been there ever since," said Hajer.

The Richmond Homeless Cats Society was founded in 1989 when Carol Reichert, President of the Society, began taking homeless cats into her own home. "I didn't have a plan in mind when it all got started," said Reichert, "but we've grown, and now we're a place that helps a lot of cats."

Eventually a shelter was built for feral cats—cats that are born in the wild—as well as for tame cats that for various reasons are without a home. Located on six acres of land, this shelter includes buildings, decks, and yards. "Many of our cats do eventually find homes," said Reichert, "but many are also unadoptable."

Stray cats became such a concern in Richmond that in 2001, the city passed a bylaw stating that cats within their jurisdiction must be spayed or neutered. Realizing that people knew very little about the bylaw, and about the feral and stray cat population, Reichert decided to raise awareness by using educational materials. These have been made possible through a \$20,000 grant from Vancouver Foundation, which was provided because the Animal Welfare committee recognized the importance of public awareness to animal wellbeing.

Some of the educational materials are being developed by Hajer, in particular an 8-page activity booklet which she distributes to school children in kindergarten and grade one. "The idea came to me when I discovered that many children had never been near a cat as it is not a part of their culture," said Hajer, "I was reading to a little girl and she had no concept of the word 'purring.'"

When Hajer visits local schools, she is accompanied by a peachy-coloured domestic long hair cat named Honey Bear. "When I first took him from the Richmond Homeless Cats Society and into a classroom, I wasn't sure how he'd be," said Hajer, "but he came right out of his carrier and strolled up to the children."

During a typical visit, Hajer shows the children a laminated chart of a growing cat, which ties in with an animal lifecycle element of the school curriculum. "I wanted children to experience cats, but also wanted something that was educationally sound," she said.

She then gives the children an opportunity to visit with Honey Bear, and explains how to care for cats. Finally, she gives them the booklet to take home. As well as containing fun, cat-related activities, it provides a message for their parents about the Richmond Homeless Cats Society, and explains how spaying and neutering can control the cat population.

The response to Hajer's program has been very positive. "Schools have been extremely welcoming," she said.

The first class she visited was so enthusiastic, they raised money for the Society by doing chores at home, and holding a bake sale. "This was their initiative," Laurie Beausoleil, teacher at Devon Gardens Elementary School, said of her grade 1 and 2 students. "They sure raised awareness with their parents about the spaying and neutering issue."

While the Richmond Homeless Cats Society will be a lifetime sanctuary for unadoptable cats, Reichert believes that raising awareness will help reduce the number of homeless cats. Since education begins with children, she's thrilled with Hajer's initiative. "For years, I'd been looking for someone to start a program in the schools," she said, acknowledging that funding from Vancouver Foundation has made this possible. "This way we're educating children about cats and getting the message out about spaying and neutering as well."

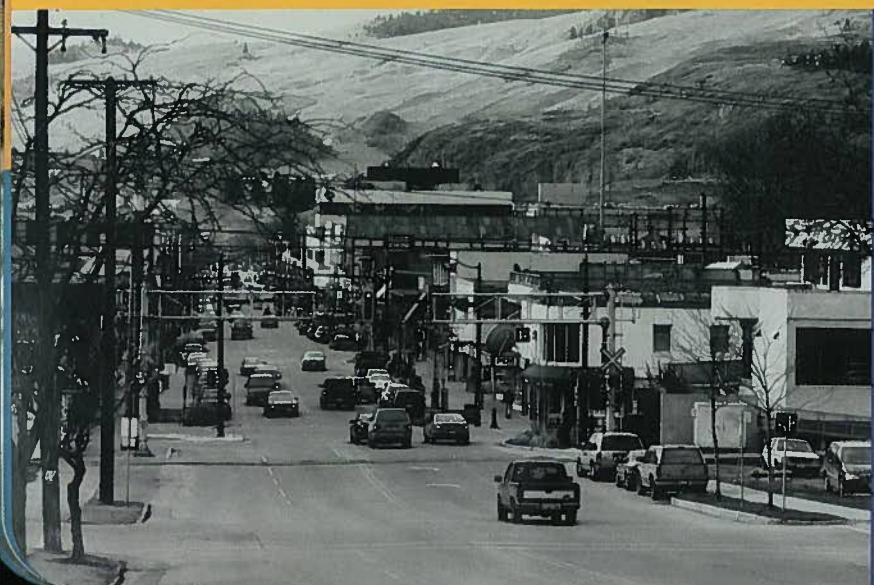

Increasing Environmental Awareness

With its majestic mountains, temperate climate, and diverse opportunities, Vancouver is one of the world's most livable cities. As a result, its population is growing and this, in many cities, means traffic congestion and diminishing green space. In Vancouver, however, regional planners are managing population growth by following the concepts espoused by Smart Growth BC.

These "smart growth" concepts refer to a responsible way to develop communities, recognizing that if we are to accommodate population growth and land development, we need to minimize impacts on the environment. Smart growth involves building in areas that are already developed, preserving parkland, and promoting neighbourhoods where shops and services are within walking distance.

Since its incorporation as a non-profit society in 1999, Smart Growth BC has been working to create more livable communities. Recognizing the importance of sustainability, Vancouver Foundation is supporting Smart Growth BC with a two-year \$90,000 grant, which will allow them to increase their outreach strategies and impact land-use planning and decision-making.

"Vancouver Foundation was one of our first funders," said Cheeying Ho, Executive Director of Smart Growth BC. "They supported two of our major publications: the BC Sprawl Report and the Smart Growth Toolkit."

The Smart Growth Toolkit, one of several successful initiatives carried out by Smart Growth BC over the past three years, dispels some of the myths about smart growth and provides practical suggestions like a planning and development list.

Thanks to this educational tool, people outside Vancouver are playing an active role in the future of their communities. For example, in Vernon, Eric Kowalski, Executive Director of Social Planning Council for the North Okanagan, formed a smart growth planning committee after becoming aware of Smart Growth BC's toolkit. "Vernon has been discovered in the last few years," Kowalski said. "The growth needs to be managed."

This province-wide interest includes work in Greater Vancouver with the Sustainable Region Initiative, in which Smart Growth BC is a partner. In this capacity, they provide guidance on addressing issues like deteriorating air quality, use of land and growth management.

Now, the grant from Vancouver Foundation will allow these initiatives to move nation-wide. "We're hosting a strategy meeting here in Vancouver that will bring together organizations from across Canada," said Ho. "The plan is to set up a Smart Growth Canada Network. This meeting also overlaps with a meeting of smart growth leaders from the US." A report comparing the costs of sprawling retail developments with those of smart growth development will further raise awareness of the issue.

Smart growth will happen in regions where people understand its importance, and are working together to make it happen. The May 2003 strategy meeting, which has been made possible through Vancouver Foundation's grant, is a recognition of Vancouver as a smart growth leader. Which is why it is no mistake that Vancouver is voted one of the world's most livable cities.

Through a generous bequest, Mr. Ernest Gaston McCorkell established this fund in his family's name. As an unrestricted fund, he has supported projects and organizations tackling environmental issues, museum upgrades and Hispanic youth projects. In 2002 this fund made 9 grants totalling \$132,898.

Fostering Confidence

Imagine a place where you can feel safe. A place where you know you are accepted, no matter your background, your situation or your behaviour. This is what the WISH Drop-in Centre has become for women working in the sex trade in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside.

Located in the First United Church at the corner of Gore and Hastings Streets, WISH—Women's Information Safe House—offers a safe place where women can shower, sleep and eat a hot meal. Open six evenings a week, the centre currently welcomes at least 120 women per night.

"It's somewhere the girls can come to be themselves," said one of the women who calls herself a regular at the centre.

In a small room off the main gathering area, several women sit together, eating and talking and taking part in creative activities. This is the WISH Learning Centre, and here a program called Including Our Voices is entering its second year. Thanks to a \$24,200 grant from Vancouver Foundation, women are building on literacy and creative skills developed in the first year, which was also funded by a \$29,760 grant from Vancouver Foundation.

"The Learning Centre is an eye in the middle of the storm," said Karen Duddy, Executive Director of the WISH Drop-in Centre. "It's a haven for women who want to get away from the chaotic atmosphere found in other parts of the centre and develop their voices."

The atmosphere in the Learning Centre is different. The walls are decorated with artwork and poems written by women who frequent the centre. While women are still coming and going, they are also focused on various projects, like crafting lanterns from jars, and writing short stories about other women who have impacted their lives. One woman surfs the Internet on the centre's computer, while another sifts through books.

"This is a place that has really helped me," said a woman sewing a cushion. "It's built up my confidence, my self-esteem, and has given me a better outlook on life."

She has also written a poem about her mother. "We're going to do other things here too," she said. "They want me to teach rug-hooking, and maybe chocolate-making as well."

Developing skills is the main purpose of the Including Our Voices program. "It is needed as much as the health programs we have at WISH," said Duddy. "By learning, women will be empowered for personal and social change."

Presently, the Learning Centre is open three evenings a week. Through the Including Our Voices program, women are not only expressing themselves creatively, and learning valuable skills such as how to use computers, but they are also taking a leadership role in the WISH Advisory Group, where they can help to plan the activities at WISH.

"Many of the women who participate in the Advisory Group come from Including Our Voices," said Duddy. "It's an extension of them finding their voice."

When Duddy reflects on the results they're seeing now—including a monthly newsletter published by the program and a Learner-to-Learner initiative where women are involved in activities beyond the centre—she's optimistic about the future. "It's been very, very successful," she said. "Thanks to the grant from Vancouver Foundation, the program has been able to continue building on its initial successes. It's helped the women develop skills they've lost because of their circumstances, and gives them the sense that there's a possibility they'll get back into normal life."

The successful Including Our Voices program at the WISH drop-in centre was funded by the Dr. William Keith Burwell Fund. Since 1981, this fund has been helping disadvantaged children and adults. Not only did this fund provide 14 grants totalling \$173,150 in 2002, but it has made a total of 95 grants totalling \$1,012,728 since 1996.

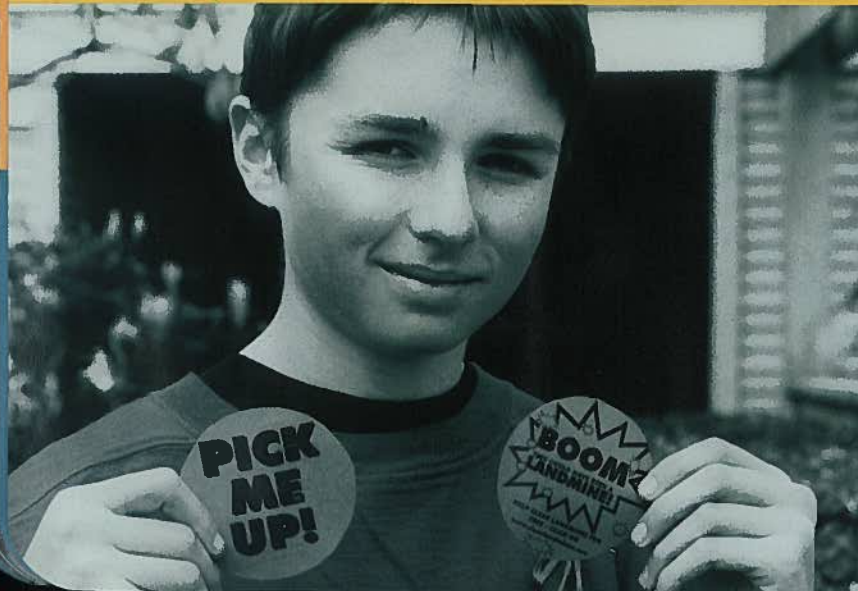

Tapping Into Youth Capacity

In the Lower Mainland, young people are raising awareness of global issues, and it's all because of a Canadian Red Cross program called Youth TAP (Training-Action-Power). Thanks to a two-year \$30,000 grant from Vancouver Foundation's Youth Philanthropy Council, this program offers a series of training workshops designed to equip youth with skills that will allow them to make a difference in the world.

"Youth have a lot of great ideas," said George Chandler, Global Education Coordinator for the Lower Mainland region. "But often they need training and support in order to take action. In global education, building awareness is important but not sufficient. We want to help youth develop their capacity to act through training and ongoing mentoring."

This project has the full support of Vancouver Foundation's Youth Philanthropy Council (VFYPC). Desiring to strengthen youth involvement in their community, VFYPC supports youth oriented programs through grants and volunteerism, promoting philanthropy and leadership among their peers.

"We're supporting Youth TAP because it not only allows youth to become global facilitators but provides resources to allow them to become leaders in a way that is relevant to today's society," said Etienne Mahe of VFYPC. "We were encouraged by the number of youth involved, and the fact that it will be a great legacy."

In January 2003 at a two-day conference, the Canadian Red Cross Global Education Program launched Youth TAP. Here, they presented workshops that covered topics ranging from how to build a culture of peace to how to approach the media in order to get your message across.

"The Youth TAP workshops gave me a huge amount of confidence," said Alex Nataros, leader of the Third WAG (World Awareness Group). "Especially the one on leadership, and the one on reaching the media. Often you think, as a student, that you can't reach the media, but this workshop gave me the confidence to do so and a template to use."

Nataros formed the Third WAG after he attended the Canadian Red Cross Global Issues Symposium for Youth in November 2002. To raise awareness of global issues in Port Moody Secondary School and the surrounding community, the Third WAG applied what they learned at the Youth TAP conference in the week leading up to Canadian Landmine Awareness Week. After contacting two local newspapers, the Coquitlam Now and the Tricity News, their initiatives were featured in articles that resulted in members of the community telephoning to ask how they could become involved.

"We never expected this response," said Nataros, "because when we were petitioning earlier, we found a huge amount of resistance to global issues."

At the school, the Third WAG added a new shoe to a growing pile every 30 minutes, symbolizing how often someone in the world is either maimed or killed by a landmine. As well as selling Landmine Awareness T-shirts, they distributed butterfly ribbons and discs that read, "Pick Me Up," on one side, and "Boom - this could have been a landmine," on the other. They also held a raffle for tickets donated by the Vancouver Giants on the Friday after school.

Youth TAP coordinator, Lisa Shebib, is thrilled by what Youth TAP has helped groups like the Third WAG accomplish. "With our workshops, we're equipping youth at a young age," she said. "We're building skills they can use to make a difference in the world."

In the second year, Youth TAP plans to build on the connections they've established with youth through the initial workshops by training more facilitators and engaging more youth groups like the Third WAG.

The Third WAG meets regularly, and plans to continue its campaign toward raising awareness of global issues. Nataros is quick to give credit to the Youth TAP program, made possible through the support from Vancouver Foundation. "Lisa, George and everyone at the Red Cross and Youth TAP are doing a great job."

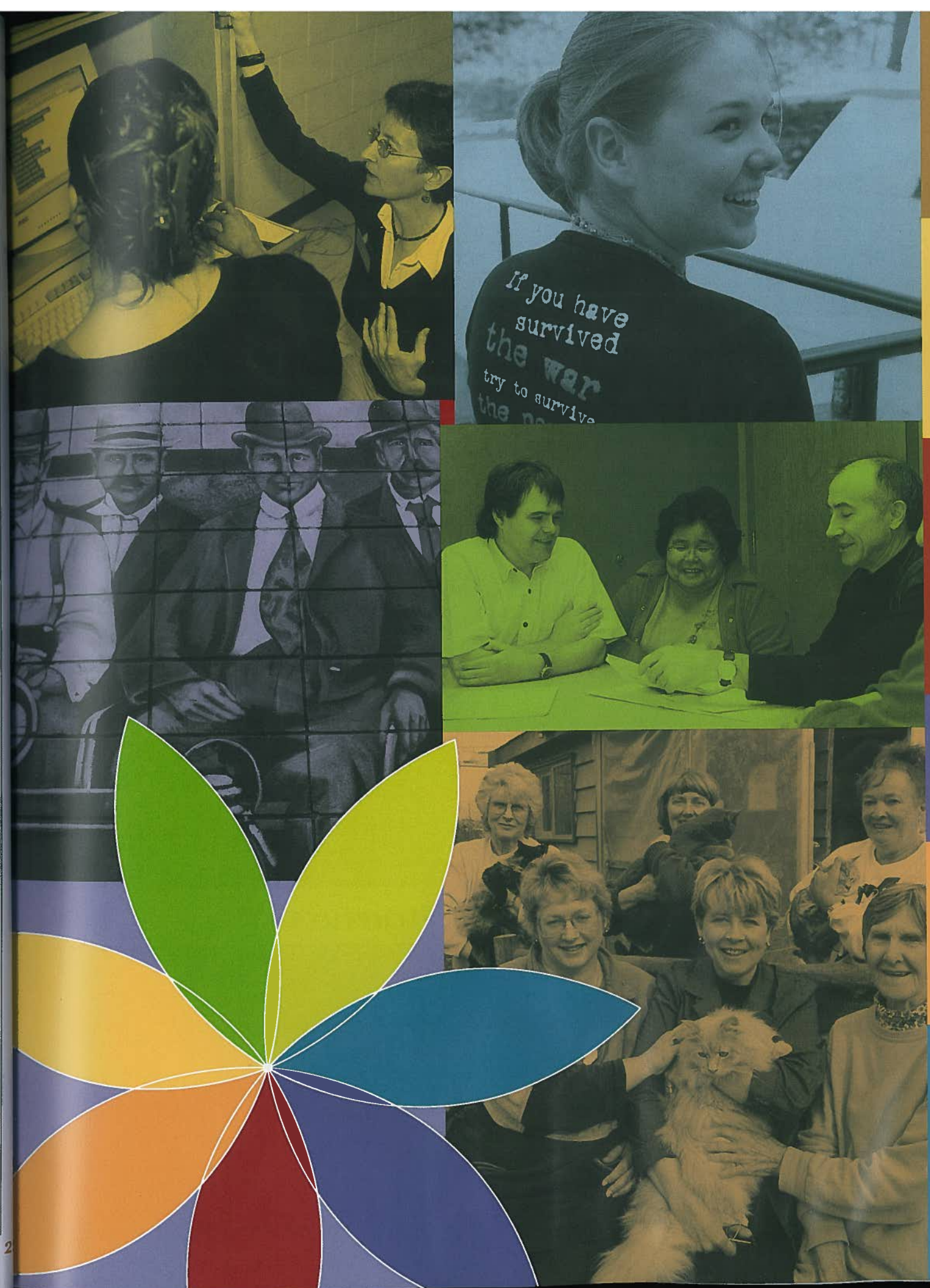

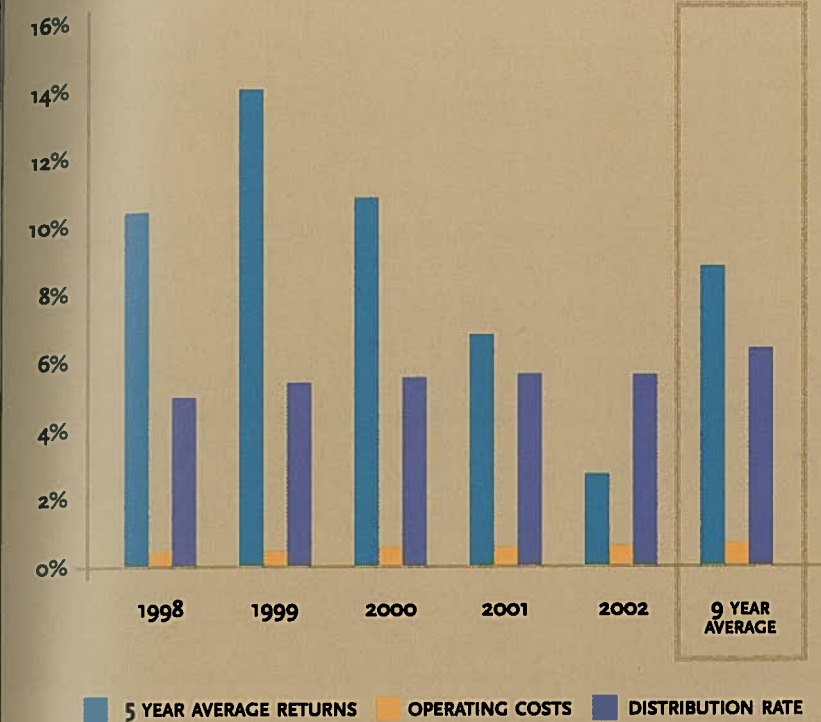

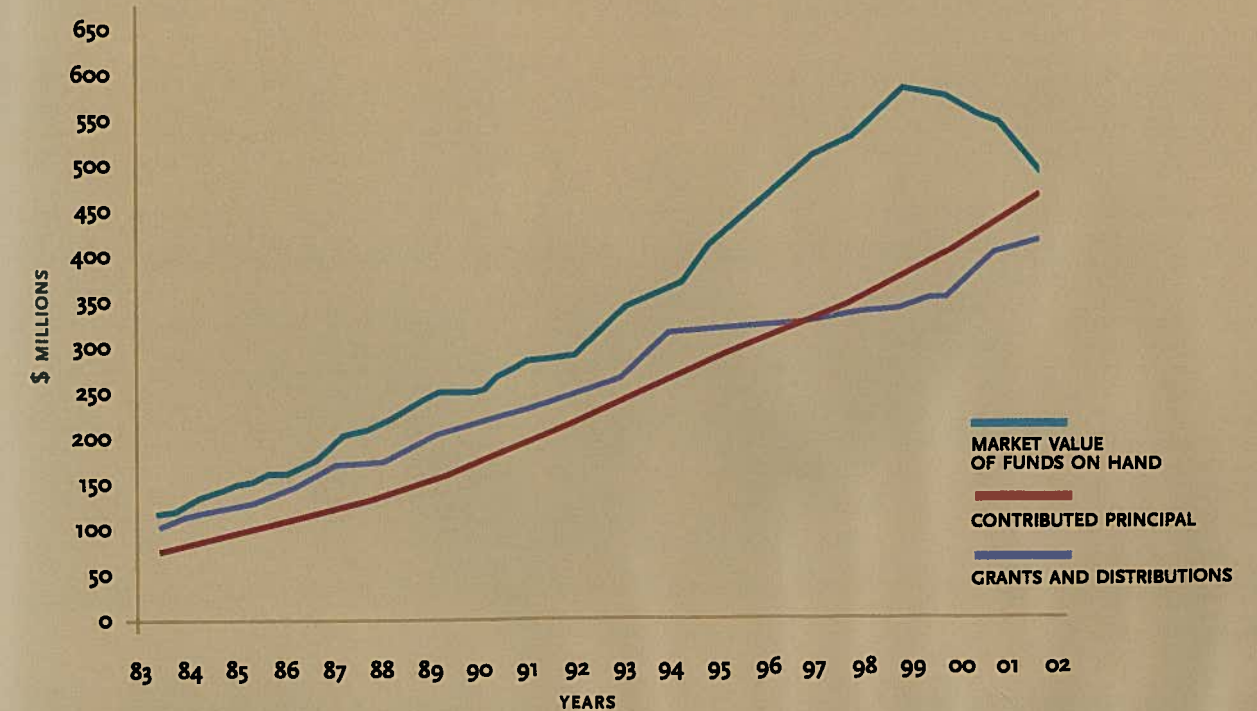
Rates of Return and Distribution

Notes to Financial Statements

1 Purpose and Status

Vancouver Foundation (the "Foundation") was established in 1943 and became incorporated through an Act of the Provincial Legislature in 1950.

The income from funds donated and bequeathed to its endowment is used to provide for charitable purposes throughout British Columbia. The Foundation serves three major constituencies: its donors, the charitable sector and the community.

The Foundation is registered with the Charities Division, Canada Customs and Revenue Agency and is classified as a public foundation. As such, it is exempt from federal income taxes and can issue charitable donation receipts.

2 Nature of the Funds

The Foundation follows the restricted fund method of accounting for contributions to the Consolidated Trust Fund and Other Trust Funds.

The Consolidated Trust Fund holds resources contributed for community endowment. The Board of Directors exercises discretionary control over the investment of these assets and the distribution. Income earned on the Consolidated Trust Fund resources are reported in the Consolidated Trust Fund and at the discretion of the Board of Directors are either retained in the Consolidated Trust Fund or transferred to the Distribution and Administration Fund.

The Other Trust Funds hold resources over which the Foundation does not exercise discretionary investment control and which are administered in accordance with specific directions from the donors. Distribution of these resources is administered in accordance with the specific directions from the donors.

The Distribution and Administration Fund represents resources authorized and allocated for grants and distributions.

3 Significant Accounting Policies

INVESTMENTS

Investments within the Consolidated Trust Fund are valued at current market prices on the last business day of the fiscal period.

Investments within the Other Trust Funds and the Distribution and Administration Fund are stated at cost and any realized gains or losses arising from investment transactions are included as part of contributed principal. Should the carrying value of these investments exceed market value, the investments are written down to market value if management considers that there is a permanent impairment in value.

FIXED ASSETS

The Foundation capitalizes the cost of major capital additions and amortizes the cost of these assets over their estimated useful lives. Lease inducements received in conjunction with the Foundation's lease are offset against the cost of leasehold improvements. Management has determined the estimated useful lives to be:

Computer and office equipment.....	3 to 5 years straight-line
Office furniture.....	10 years straight-line
Leasehold improvements - net of lease inducements.....	straight-line over the term of the lease (10 years)

Operating expenses for 2002 include amortization of fixed assets of \$96,390 (2001 - \$67,276).

REVENUE RECOGNITION

Contributions for endowment are recognized in the Consolidated Trust Fund when received and deeds of gifts have been approved. Restricted contributions are recognized in the Other Trust Funds when received.

Bequests are recorded upon receipt of the donated assets. Bequests in a form other than cash or marketable securities are recorded at values determined by the Board of Directors.

Interest on bonds, mortgages and short-term notes is accrued as earned. Dividends, which have been declared, are recorded as income on the date of record set for the dividend.

GRANTS

Grants are recorded when paid by the Foundation.

COMPARATIVE FIGURES

Certain comparative figures have been reclassified to conform with the presentation adopted for 2002.

4 Investments

CONSOLIDATED TRUST FUND

The bonds and debentures in the Consolidated Trust Fund are represented by Canadian fixed interest bonds and debentures, with a weighted average term to maturity of 9.3 years (2001 - 9.0 years). The effective interest rate on these bonds and debentures is 4.5% (2001 - 4.9%). As at December 31, 2002, the bonds and debentures cost was \$184,629,605 (2001 - \$196,964,951).

5 Commitments

In addition to the amounts presented under "Funds pending distribution", the Foundation has committed to grants totalling \$740,000 (2001 - \$871,000) which are payable from future returns. Payment of these grants is conditional on the recipients meeting certain criteria and providing certain supporting information.

In December 2002, the Foundation has expanded its leased office space in order to accommodate the British Columbia Unclaimed Property Society which will sublease a majority of this additional leased office space.

- how the income is to be used (charitable purposes of fund)
- whether it is to be an open or closed fund
- the amount of money you wish to start the fund with (the initiating capital)
- if you are a non-profit organization establishing an agency endowment fund, we will need your BC Society registration number, your Federal Charity registration number, a copy of the Society's Constitution and By-laws, and a copy of your most recent annual report and financial statements.

Using this information, we will have our legal advisor draw up a Deed of Gift (a trust document setting out the terms of the fund) for your review. We encourage you to discuss the draft deed of gift with your own legal and financial advisors to make sure it accomplishes your wishes.

Initiating the Fund

Once you are sure the deed of gift is acceptable, it should be signed and returned to Vancouver Foundation with a cheque for the initiating capital. The minimum initiating capital for a fund is \$10,000; start-up funds are also available if you are unable to contribute \$10,000 at one time.

The staff of the Foundation then establish the fund and present it to the Foundation's Board of Directors. We will provide you with copies of the counter-signed deed of gift for your records.

How to Apply for A Grant

VANCOUVER FOUNDATION SUPPORTS A WIDE RANGE OF PROJECTS THAT ARE OF BENEFIT TO BRITISH COLUMBIANS. FUNDED ACTIVITIES OFTEN PROVIDE A DIRECT SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY, OR TAKE AN INNOVATIVE APPROACH TO A COMMUNITY CONCERN.

Letter or Inquiry

To begin, all grant applicants must submit a letter of inquiry outlining the proposed project. In less than four pages the letter should:

- introduce your organization and its mandate
- state the community priorities the project will address
- detail the scope of the project, including a timeline
- demonstrate community support for the project
- provide a detailed budget, including funding from Vancouver Foundation and other sources.

One of our Program Directors will review your proposal to determine basic eligibility. If the project qualifies, you will be invited to submit a formal application, by a specified deadline.

Application Process

A thorough assessment of the application will be completed before it goes forward to the appropriate Advisory Committee.

The Advisory Committee considers your application and makes a recommendation to the Foundation's Board of Directors. You will receive written notification of the board's decision, along with terms and conditions of the grant (if approved) approximately 12 weeks after the deadline.

Vancouver Foundation has three annual deadlines (the first Friday in January, April and September). Letters of intent should be submitted at least five weeks prior to the application deadline.

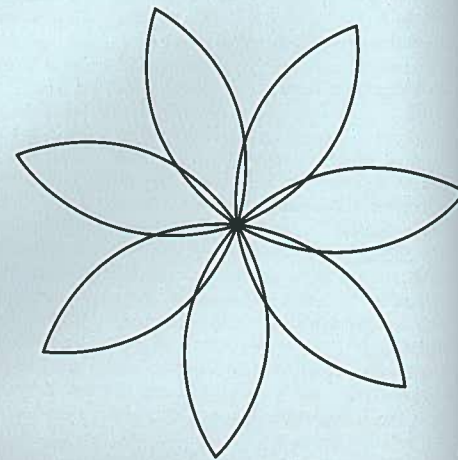
