

Our goal is to expand the depth and breadth of cultural activity by improving arts facilities, supporting diverse art forms and providing opportunities for local artists to flourish without needing to leave their community.

Donor Profile: Jack Misener

An avid traveller with a passion for woodworking, Walter John (Jack) Misener was known as an intensely private man who loved the outdoors. When he passed away in 2004 at the age of 82, he left the bulk of his estate to Vancouver Foundation. The Walter John Misener Memorial Fund reveals the full extent of Jack's generosity.

By all accounts Jack lived a simple yet active life. An excellent student, he graduated from John Oliver Secondary School in 1939. Following service in the army, Jack discovered the career that suited his meticulous nature: accounting. After 25 years with MacMillan Bloedel, he embraced his other love, travelling extensively to exotic destinations.

"We are a pioneer stock family and have always valued basic necessities without the need to acquire bigger, better or new," explains Cathrine Leighland, Jack's first cousin once removed. "Jack's favourite pastime was to get in his old pick-up and head out to his cabin to chop wood."

An only child who never married and had no children, Jack was diagnosed with liver cancer in December 2004, succumbing a few weeks later to the disease. In his Will, he left the entire residue of his estate to Vancouver Foundation. "From what I gather, Jack had a plan for quite some time to leave this kind of legacy," says Leighland.

"As an accountant, he must have known about the work that Vancouver Foundation does and wanted to contribute."

Jack's foresight included establishing a Discretionary Fund, which enables Vancouver Foundation to make grants where they are needed most.

Thanks to this legacy, a grant has already been made to the Michael J. Fox Theatre Society and many more worthy projects will receive support in the future.

"Vancouver Foundation was a wonderful choice and one that our family supports," says Leighland. "The Foundation has the scrutiny to ensure money from the fund is used well in a number of different areas. Jack's generosity is a wonderful closing gesture to his life."

Grant Highlight: Kelowna Ballet Society


Ballet Kelowna provides opportunities for young professional Canadian dancers to develop their talent and launch their careers in a creative, nurturing environment. Since 2002, 17 dancers have trained with the company, gaining exposure and electrifying audiences across BC with their performances.

In 2005, with the assistance of a \$5,000 grant from Vancouver Foundation, Ballet Kelowna commissioned emerging BC choreographer Simone Orlando, herself a gifted dancer, to create a new addition to their repertoire. Following months of development and rehearsals, Simone created a powerful ballet that challenged the dancers emotionally and physically while showcasing their skill. *I Remember You* depicts a compelling love story and a woman's courage set amidst the devastation of war.

"The whole experience was very enriching for me and for the young dancers at Ballet Kelowna," says Simone of her first professional choreography commission. "I really felt that I was able to touch the audience through the dancers and fulfill the creative vision I had for this piece. I am so grateful to have had this wonderful opportunity."

As a result of her work, Simone was awarded the 2006 Clifford E. Lee Award from The Banff Centre, one of the most important awards given to emerging Canadian choreographers. *I Remember You* continues to be performed extensively as the company tours the province and has helped establish Ballet Kelowna as another centre for choreographic development in British Columbia.

Encouraging Youth Involvement

Too often, young people today get a bad rap. Speed. Violence. Drugs. These are some of the negative stereotypes we hear about.

The facts tell a different story. Studies show that increasingly, youth are taking on more active, meaningful roles in civic life. They are making proactive choices about their own health and well-being and engaging in their communities through volunteerism and participation in local organizations.

Vancouver Foundation knows that supporting youth efforts is critical. It gives young people the opportunity to share their unique knowledge and insights and enables them to make a direct, positive and lasting impact on their community.

Donor Profile: Vancouver Sun

For the Vancouver Sun, the newspaper business and corporate philanthropy go hand in hand. In addition to *Raise-a-Reader*, CanWest's national children and family literacy program, the paper has supported more than 750 non-profit organizations to date through the Vancouver Sun Children's Fund. The Fund provides grants to BC-based charities that serve children and youth with special challenges.

From helping teenage mothers finish high school to providing


school supplies for children from low-income families, the Children's Fund Society has accomplished a remarkable amount in its history. Last year alone, the Fund provided grants to 37 organizations across the province, many of which directly benefited youth at risk.

"Many of our grants to organizations supporting youth are for preventive programs or leadership programs," explains Margaret Vistaunet, the Fund's Administrator. Youth organizations that have received financial assistance from the Fund include the Kiwassa Neighbourhood Services Association for their junior leadership program and the Muscular Dystrophy Association of Canada to provide workshops for youth with Muscular Dystrophy.

"We play a leadership role in this community as the major daily newspaper," adds Jamie Pitblado, Vice President, Promotions & Community Investment for the Pacific Newspaper Group, about a key reason why the Children's Fund was launched. "Along with that comes a responsibility to try and build a better community."

In an effort to strengthen the Fund even further, in 2004 the Society transferred its administration and granting functions to Vancouver Foundation. The expert volunteers who sit on the Children, Youth and Families Advisory Committee help the Vancouver Sun by using their in-depth knowledge of community issues to award grants. Says Jamie, "The partnership has been a very successful one for us. Vancouver Foundation is a well-respected organization and one that we feel very proud to be a part of."

Grant Highlight: Community Education about Adolescent Sexuality

ABBOTSFORD SCHOOL DISTRICT

Having a baby before you are ready to handle all of the new responsibilities can be a scary thing, especially for teenagers. Vanessa Skotnitsky, a former high school dropout, was only 18 years old when she became pregnant. The mother of a healthy baby girl, today Vanessa is back in school and volunteering her time as part of Community Education about Adolescent Sexuality (CEAS), a partnership between the Abbotsford School District and Abbotsford Community Services created to educate young people about the issues and challenges of teen pregnancy.

"The Abbotsford School District doesn't allow sex education in the schools," explains coordinator Becky Edwards, "When we started, Abbotsford had the second highest teen pregnancy rate in British Columbia. That's why this program was created."

As part of the program, Becky—herself a young parent—and a handful of others like her travel to schools in

the district, sharing their personal experiences with kids in grades 7 and 8. "Middle school students seem to be the most receptive to our message," she explains. "In the beginning, we had 150 parents coming through *New Beginnings*, a local school-based program for pregnant or parenting adolescents and young adults. Today, thanks to CEAS, that number has dropped to 50."

In 2005, CEAS received an \$8,000 grant from Vancouver Foundation to document their successful program model so that other communities could learn from it. "We're extremely appreciative of the encouragement and support from Vancouver Foundation," says Becky. "We believe our current success is directly related to the funding support we've received from the Foundation over the years."

Creating Healthy Communities

Over the years, advances in medicine have enhanced the quality of life and extended the lifespan for people throughout our province. Since the 1960s, Vancouver Foundation research grants have played a part, funding projects with wide-ranging health impacts—from studies to assist practitioners who look after our frail and elderly, to research into emerging health concerns of children in remote communities.

By providing funding for innovative research, student bursaries in the health sciences and skills development, Vancouver Foundation is piloting new approaches to community health and ensuring British Columbians play an active role in the well-being of their communities.

Grant Highlight: Early Intervention Dental Health Research Project

Many Canadian children grow up never experiencing a cavity, thanks to regular check-ups and daily oral hygiene. But for some Aboriginal children without ready access to oral health services and education, the opposite is true—their decay rates are two to five times higher than their non-Aboriginal peers.

In 2003, the Q'wemtsin Health Society—a Kamloops-based non-profit organization that provides health services to six local First Nations Bands in the Thompson region—established the Early Intervention Dental Research Project in an effort to help improve the odds. "A lot of communities are isolated, so just getting to a dentist is difficult," explains Jennifer Melville, a dental hygienist hired by the Society. "In partnership with Health Canada's Children's Oral Health Initiative (COHI), we've established toothbrush programs at the different schools and we also apply regular fluoride varnishes to help slow down and prevent decay."

For Cindy Andrews, a COHI aide who has three children in the program, the benefits are clear. "When I started with the program, about 75% of the kids in my band had a least one cavity so being able to educate them about dental health and take away some of their fears about the dentist is a big accomplishment," she says.

In 2005, the Society received a \$50,000 grant from Vancouver Foundation to help fund their project, a three-year initiative that involves hiring community based educators to work with parents and document the outcomes of the program. "The funding will go a long way towards helping us change ingrained behaviours and attitudes," says Jennifer. "We can't thank Vancouver Foundation enough."

Grant Highlight: Northern Medical Program at UNBC

Imagine not having access to a doctor when you need one or having to wait months for crucial surgery. These are the issues facing the residents of B.C.'s northern and rural communities on a daily basis due to a critical shortage of local physicians and health-care professionals. In response, the Northern Medical Program—a partnership between University of British Columbia and the University of Northern British Columbia—was established in 2004. It's goal? To train medical students in the north for rural and northern practice.

"By establishing the Northern Medical Program, we are helping to educate future physicians on the wonderful lifestyle and collegial opportunities that exist in northern locations,"

explains Dr. Lorna Medd, the Public Health Officer in Prince George.

In order to better understand the issue, in 2004 Dr. David Snadden, Associate Vice-President of Medicine at UNBC and Associate Dean of the Northern Medical Program at UBC, embarked upon an exciting new study to help refine the selection process for the Northern Medical Program. The aim: to improve the chances of recruiting students who will be more likely to live and work professionally in a northern environment.

To support Dr. Snadden's research, Vancouver Foundation provided a \$33,000 grant. "It's hard for researchers in medical education to get funding, especially if you're doing this kind of qualitative research," he says. "I can't overstate how important this funding has been to us."

Opening Doors to Learning

It is hard to imagine being unable to read a story to a child or fill out a job application form without help. But today in British Columbia, this is too often the reality for many people.

Quality, accessible education for all citizens throughout their lives is critical in building strong, healthy communities. Thanks to the generosity of those who recognize the importance of education, Vancouver Foundation is a strong supporter of programs and initiatives that allow people to reach their full potential through lifelong learning.

Donor Profile: Chan Kent Family

When Bob Chan Kent speaks of his grandfather, successful businessman and philanthropist Charles Chan Kent, his admiration shows. A Chinese immigrant, Charles started Aero Garment Ltd., one of Vancouver's largest privately-owned clothing manufacturers, in 1925. From the beginning, his desire to enhance the lives of the city's immigrant population was unwavering.

"My grandfather wanted to establish a philanthropic foundation to help promote post-secondary education for Chinese immigrants, who were underprivileged at the time," says Bob, who is following in his family's footsteps as President of Vancouver-based women's clothing distributor, Quantum Apparel Group Inc.

The result was the Charles Chan Kent Golden Wedding Foundation, established in 1964 to provide financial assistance through a scholarship fund to Chinese students at University of British Columbia, University of Victoria and Simon Fraser University. In 2004, scholarship funding was expanded to include students enrolled in the Fashion Design and Technology Program at Kwantlen College. A family institution that spans three generations, Bob is spokesperson for the family foundation while his father, Robert, is President.

In 2000, the Chan Kent family transferred management of their fund, which now provides scholarships

to any student regardless of nationality, to Vancouver Foundation. Bob says his family immediately embraced the move. "We agreed together that Vancouver Foundation could provide the kind of leadership necessary to manage the Fund in perpetuity so that more people could benefit," he says. "Knowing that the Foundation will keep my grandfather's philanthropic goals alive is very important to all of us."

Grant Highlight: Immigrant Services Society of BC

Over the past decade, British Columbia has seen an increase in the number of refugees arriving in our province. Escaping violence and hardship, families come to start over, seeking safety and opportunities denied in their native country. The barriers faced particularly by refugee children are significant. Many have spent much of their young lives living in poverty in refugee camps without access to formal education.

In 2005 Afghanistan was the leading source of re-settled refugees in Burnaby. Recognizing the challenges faced by refugee children entering public school, Immigrant Services Society of BC (ISS-BC) partnered with the Burnaby School District and the Afghan community to find solutions.

With a \$25,000 grant from Vancouver Foundation, ISS-BC developed a multi-pronged strategy to enhance services for refugee children and youth to help them integrate more effectively into their school and community. The plan includes homework clubs

supported by interpreters, a bulletin to inform administrators of refugee arrivals, and presentations to key decision-makers such as School Superintendents and ESL Consortium members to provide them with the information they need to implement supports for refugee children.

This program was so successful, it has been expanded and similar initiatives are now underway to serve other refugee communities.

"It was my dream to go to school. I could not do that in Afghanistan," says Afghani refugee Gulsoom Qurban, who had no formal education when she arrived in Canada with her family in 2004. Now in grade 10 at Burnaby Central Secondary, she attends an interpreter-supported homework club each week to get help with her studies.

She adds, "When I am finished, I will go to university of course."

Building Aboriginal Strength

Aboriginal people have long recognized that vibrant communities are built over time through the experience, knowledge, skills and courage of strong community leaders. As First Nations seek an equal share in the social and economic benefits of our province, leadership ability becomes more important than ever.

Vancouver Foundation supports projects that develop aboriginal leadership by providing culturally appropriate educational opportunities and encouraging First Nations youth to complete high school and pursue post-secondary education. Many of these projects enable First Nations to strengthen the capacity of their communities and manage their natural, human and financial resources.

Our goal is to help First Nations people across BC reach their full potential.

Grant Highlight: Aboriginal Front Door Society

Aline LaFlamme understands the huge impact of unconditional acceptance and compassion. As Executive Director of the Aboriginal Front Door Society, Aline has seen people transform before her eyes as a direct result of the Society's healing projects.

"Our clients struggle with addiction, homelessness and other wellness issues everyday," she says, "and there are so many examples of the ways the Front Door Society is making their lives better." She tells the tale of one woman who is now clean and sober after living on the street for most of her adult life, and a young man plagued with addiction issues who says the organization has given him hope.

Established in 2003, the Society offers a wide range of programs, including traditional drumming and singing, arts and crafts and a drug and alcohol-free drop-in space. Their most powerful project, however, is their weekly Healing Circle, a place where people can talk freely about their issues in a non-judgemental, encouraging environment.

For Tom Whonnock, a 50-year-old aboriginal man living on the street, the power of the circle can't be overstated. "The healing circle has given a lot of people a voice because

many of us are hurting," he says. "Thanks to the circle and the Society, I'm walking with my head up a little bit more now."

Aline is particularly grateful for a \$90,000 grant from Vancouver Foundation for their Staying Alive project, which allowed them to help fund a number of the Society's initiatives. "The Foundation has given us more than just money," she says. "They have helped us, encouraged us and literally kept us alive, and for that we will be forever grateful."

Grant Highlight: En'owkin Centre Okanagan Indian Educational Resources Society

Logan Willfong has nothing but good things to say about his class field trip to the En'owkin Centre, an indigenous cultural, educational and creative arts institution in the Okanagan Valley. Logan, a grade 4 student at Wiltse Elementary School in Penticton, visited the Centre last year with his classmates, planting wild rose bushes to help restore endangered habitat as part of the Centre's Locatee Lands Project. Locatee lands are passed on from generation to generation and are a unique model of aboriginal land ownership.

"My class really enjoyed the field trip," he says eagerly, "because we learned about the environment and the First Nations people. We also got a chance to draw some of the different plants in the area and see local wildlife."

Developed in 2005, the Locatee Lands Project was created as a long-term restoration and conservation initiative to educate the public about the rare cottonwood ecosystem surrounding the Centre, which is on the Penticton Indian Reserve. "The reserve is located

on two lots that contain a number of different habitat features and species that are severely endangered," explains Executive Director Jeanette Armstrong. "We work with students, public sector groups and community groups to not only educate them about the land, but to help restore it as well."

For Jeanette, the project is about more than just habitat restoration and stewardship—it's about restoring cultural practices and knowledge to the Okanagan's indigenous people. "Finding ways to engage our community in connection with the land—that's what our culture was and is," she says. In 2005, the Centre received a \$30,000 grant from Vancouver Foundation. "We're a non-profit society with limited resources," says Jeanette, "so we couldn't have done this comprehensive project without Vancouver Foundation's help."

Supporting Seniors

British Columbia is home to a growing population of seniors from diverse backgrounds. Gender, income and culture are just a few of the factors that create challenges for people as they age. While many seniors enjoy long and healthy lives, others struggle with loneliness, poverty, disability and despair.

Vancouver Foundation is committed to fostering dignity, independence, fairness and security for people throughout their lifespan. We support projects that help seniors strengthen their community of support and enhance their personal safety, health and well-being.

Donor Profile: Elizabeth Murray

If you ask Elizabeth Murray about her life's passions, you'll get a simple yet heartfelt response. First on the list is her beloved home Scottish heritage; a close second is her long-time work with seniors.


A former BC Tel employee and avid traveller, Elizabeth has been active in Vancouver's senior's community for over a decade, organizing social activities as the Program Coordinator at the Oakridge Seniors' Centre, a popular gathering spot for over 500 local residents. In 2005, she established the Elizabeth Breeze Murray Endowment Fund at Vancouver Foundation as a way to make a lasting contribution to senior's organizations like Oakridge.

"In 2004, the Board of Directors at Oakridge Seniors Centre started a permanent endowment fund at Vancouver Foundation to help support their activities," she says. "I knew about the Foundation's excellent reputation, and as a result of the Board's decision, decided to start my own donor-advised fund there as well."

For Elizabeth, senior's centres are more than just bricks and mortar; they provide a much-needed source of social contact and support. "Senior's organizations provide a healthy outlet for many people who would otherwise be inactive," she explains. "As a senior myself, I know how important a sense of community can be."

Grant Highlight: BC/Yukon Society of Transition Houses

It's something nobody likes to talk about, but for women suffering abuse, it is all too real. While family violence has increasingly received attention in recent years, many women continue to suffer in silence.

In 2001, the BC & Yukon Society of Transition Houses launched a project to identify the needs of older women who were victims of violence and abuse within their families. In their report, *Silent and Invisible*, researchers found that older women are less likely than younger women to report family violence, share their experience with friends and relatives, or seek help from women-serving agencies.

"It's a very difficult problem for women in their 60s, 70s and 80s to deal with," says Jill Hightower, co-author of the report. "Women of this generation were raised at a time when you didn't share family secrets or talk about abuse. The problem truly is silent and invisible."

Researchers also found that even if older women are aware that help exists for victims of abuse, they think it is only for younger women.


Vancouver Foundation provided a \$50,000 grant for a *Safe Homes* pilot project to provide accessible, appropriate shelter for older women escaping abuse and for the development of resource materials that will help them deal with this issue. In 2005, networks of support groups were established at Safe Homes in Creston, Penticton and Victoria. The groups have become a critical part of the program, giving women the peer support they need to deal with their situation and improve their lives.

"Not a lot of foundations are interested in older women's issues but Vancouver Foundation recognized its importance right away," says Jill. "Their support has made a big difference in the lives of these older women."

Geographic Impact of Grants

With a long-standing provincial mandate, Vancouver Foundation distributes grants across British Columbia. Often grants are awarded in one area but have a farther reaching impact.


In 2005, non-profit organizations in more than 150 cities, towns and villages in BC benefited from more than \$35 million in grants from Vancouver Foundation.





AGENCY ENDOWMENT & DESIGNATED GRANTS








2005 Investment Structure


Vancouver Foundation at a Glance
