Chairman's Report

In my report for 1969 reference was made to legislation to amend the British Columbia Succession Duty Act which was then before the Provincial Legislature. These amendments became law in April, 1970 and govern all charitable, religious and educational organisations in this Province in respect of testamentary gifts that may be made to them. Vancouver Foundation continues to enjoy exempt status within the provisions of the B.C. Succession Duty Act as amended.

The report for 1970, which accompanies these comments, is the twenty-seventh issued by Vancouver Foundation, and reflects the uninterrupted growth of the Foundation since its original formation in 1943. Our assets increased by 10% in the year 1970, and distributions made by us for charitable objects in that year increased to \$1,467,930 from a figure of \$1,117,228 in the previous year.

The concept of a Community Foundation to serve a given geographical area in all charitable endeavours is gaining wider recognition in Canada and the United States. Public accountability, permanence, and sound investment and administrative advice with a knowledge of community needs provided by a representative body of citizens, all serve to give proven confidence to those whose circumstances enable them to contemplate provision for the needs of society and its environment. Vancouver Foundation is so structured that donors – large and small – either through lifetime gifts or by Will, may designate the object of their beneficence or may elect to leave this discretion to be exercised by our Directors from year to year according to the changing circumstances of the times.

In an era of rapid change and complexity, the flexibility afforded by the ninety Funds under the administration of Vancouver Foundation offers a wide scope for the deployment of funds constructively. In addition to the accounting recorded herein for 1970 there are further funds of which we have been advised, but have not yet received, which will ensure expansion of our activities.

An organisation such as Vancouver Foundation, dependent as it is upon voluntary support, can fill no more than a fraction

of the needs of worthy causes in our midst; but, by co-operating with Government and other agencies, it is possible to give encouragement and help that yields rewarding dividends in advancing the mental, moral, cultural and physical improvement of the inhabitants of Greater Vancouver and the area we serve.

This is our purpose, and with the continued recognition of our benefactors, Directors and Officers, whose past support is gratefully acknowledged, I can assure expansion of this work in future years.

Distribution Committee Report

In the year 1970 Vancouver Foundation made a record distribution of \$1,467,930 at an administration cost of \$56,156 to charitable, educational and religious organisations in the Community. \$829,872 of this total represented income which flowed either by designation of the original donors or as a return on endowment capital entrusted to the Foundation by such organisations as The Children's Hospital, Vancouver Symphony Society, Vancouver Art Gallery, Boy Scouts and others. The amount disbursed under discretionary authority of our several Distribution and Advisory Committees aggregated \$638,058. The United Community Services of Greater Vancouver received \$122,859 in all: \$98,859 being by designation from endowment funds, and the remaining \$24,000 being allocated by our Committee for special purposes. The United Church of Canada in the many facets of its work in British Columbia was the largest recipient under the heading of "Religious Organisations", a large part of this total being by designation of the donors.

In response to the Appeal in 1970 made by The Salvation Army for capital funds, Vancouver Foundation has committed a grant of \$150,000 over three years from several Funds under our administration to cover the full cost of the Mount Pleasant Centre to be built by The Salvation Army under this Appeal.

During 1970 The B.C. Medical Services Foundation received a grant of \$300,000 from the Stabilisation Fund of the Medical Services Association. One-half of this was added to the capital of the Foundation, and the other half together with income of \$89,504 was committed to medical services and research throughout the Province in 1970/71. The Fund is now providing a significant amount annually for medical studies at Universities and Hospitals in British Columbia. Included in the total for 1970 was a grant of \$25,000 for a Rubella Vaccine Programme among young children, this augmenting funds provided by Government and Public Health authorities.

The Board of Parks and Recreation in Vancouver was able to proceed with two further creative playgrounds in 1970 through a grant of \$35,000 provided by Vancouver Foundation. These playgrounds at Columbia Park and Garden Park will be opened for use in the Spring of 1971. A grant of \$20,000 was also authorised for the educational programme at The Vancouver Aquarium in 1970/71. Under the heading of "Educational Grants" a total of \$58,200 was paid in 1970 by way of bursary aid to 150 students – including 30 students in Fine Arts – at various Universities, Colleges and Schools in British Columbia. This was a substantial increase over previous years, and our grants enabled many students to continue their studies in a year when employment opportunities were scarce.

In addition to their endowment fund income, civic cultural bodies such as The Vancouver Symphony Society, Vancouver Opera Association, The Playhouse Theatre, Vancouver Art Gallery and The Junior Symphony Society received grants aggregating \$52,000 from The George W. Norgan Fund and other Funds of Vancouver Foundation in support of their programmes in the Arts.

From time to time throughout the year Vancouver Foundation has published "Foundation News" which has highlighted a number of organisations who have received grants from us, some less significant in amount. However, by providing this support, and drawing attention to the work of these organisations in our Newsletter, we believe that enccuragement has been given to worthy objects that will enrich and improve the opportunities and needs of many citizens in our Community. Each application for discretionary funds is carefully screened by officers of Vancouver Foundation before presentation to the Distribution Committee which meets quarterly to review these requests.

Investment Committee Report

Investors had more than their share of drama in 1970 with markets declining mid-year to their lowest levels in recent years; then they turned around and finished the year with a strong recovery. By the year end, therefore, North American Stock Markets had not drastically varied from their levels of the previous year, as shown by the following indices:

Toronto Stock Exchange Industrial- 6.4%New York Stock Exchange Composite- 2.3%Dow Jones Industrial+ 4.8%

Canadian Stock Markets, having performed somewhat better than their American counterparts in 1969, fell back into line by faring worse in 1970.

Interest rates increased and bond values declined to record levels during the year. This trend reversed itself in December, and at the year end the bond markets were staging a strong recovery.

The Foundation's assets increased in 1970 by \$1.89 million to \$22.65 million, reflected by changes in our portfolio mix as follows:

Considerable advantage can therefore be seen to have been taken of the record high interest rates, resulting in an increase in the average gross return on our portfolio to 6.30%. The overall portfolio recorded a 1.00% decline in relative market values.

Principal Funds as at December 31, 1970

Principal Funds consist of Closed and Open Funds. Closed Funds are personal Funds of the individuals establishing such Funds. Open Funds are Funds to which any person may make a lifetime gift or bequest.

CLOSED FUNDS

The Harold Scanlon Foley Junior, Memorial Fund

Established by Mr. and Mrs. Harold S. Foley in 1952 in memory of their son. Income designated for educational purposes.

The VanDusen Foundation

Established by W. J. VanDusen in 1952 and added to in subsequent years. Income designated for the general objects of Vancouver Foundation.

The W. J. VanDusen Forestry Fund

Established by W. J. VanDusen in 1952. Income designated for the study of Forestry in British Columbia.

Alex Sereth Fund

Established under the Will of Alexander Sereth on July 14, 1954, the income designated to provide support and maintenance for needy persons convalescing after a surgical operation.

H. R. MacMillan Educational Fund

Established by H. R. MacMillan in 1955 and added to in subsequent years. Designated for teaching and research in Forestry and Fisheries, for other Funds at The University of British Columbia and the Union College of British Columbia and for other educational purposes.

Lord Strathcona Fund

Established in 1956 by order of the Supreme Court of British Columbia. The assets of the Fund are the residue of a gift made in 1913 by the first Lord Stratheona for assisting Old Country gentlewomen in becoming established in British Columbia. The income of the Fund is now used for designated educational and health assistance in British Columbia.

Percy Shallcross Fund for Youth Training

Established in 1956 by the late Mrs. Percy Shallcross in memory of her husband. The income of the Fund, which is paid to the Central City Mission, is designated for the education of boys in British Columbia along physical and undenominational Christian lines.

The William E. and Emily Ross Fund

Established in 1957 by the late William E. Ross of Burnaby and added to under his Will. Income designated in part for the Buchanan Memorial Sunset Lodge, in part for handicapped children in obtaining an education, and for assistance of orphan boys and boys of working mothers in attending camp.

Security Fund

This Fund, the residue of a Workshop Fund for ex-servicemen following the first World War, was placed by its Trustees with the Vancouver Foundation in 1946. It is used for the benefit of the families of those who have served in the active Canadian Forces, according to recommendations from the Family Service Agency of Greater Vancouver.

Hon. W. C. and Ruth Wynn Woodward Fund

Established by the Will of the late Hon. W. C. Woodward for religious, educational and other welfare purposes.

Alma VanDusen Fund

Established in 1958 by the late Mrs. Alma VanDusen with a gift of \$100,000.00 and added to by her in subsequent years for general charitable purposes within the powers of Vancouver Foundation.

1970 Additions \$60,000.00

Edward J. Meilicke Fund

Established in 1959 by the late Edward J. Meilicke with a gift of \$1,820.00 and added to by his Will for the establishment of a bursary for a student or students taking studies leading to a Bachelor of Science degree at The University of British Columbia.

The Williamson Foundation

Established in 1959 by the late Alan H. Williamson, O.B.E. with a gift of \$300,000.00, for the assistance, directly or indirectly, of retarded or emotionally disturbed persons under the age of 21 years. Additional gifts in memory of the late Alan H. Williamson were made totalling \$1,725.00.

The Norman Russell Lang Memorial Fund

Established in 1959 under the Will of the late Nellie McKee Lang with a bequest of \$50,000.00. The income designated to be used, either directly or indirectly, for the care or benefit of sick, crippled or underprivileged children.

Frederick J. Dawson Fund

Established in 1960 under the Will of the late Frederick J. Dawson with a bequest of \$50,000. Income may be distributed in the discretion of the Directors for any of the authorized objects of Vancouver Foundation.

The William Harold Malkin Fund

Established in 1960 under the Will of the late William Harold Malkin with a bequest of \$50,000. The income of the Fund is to be added to the income of the General Fund annually and paid to the United Community Services of the Greater Vancouver area.

Ellen Ethel McHattie Memorial Bursary Fund

Established in 1960 under the Will of the late Charles T. McHattie with a gift of \$6,000. The income of the Fund is to be made available annually for a graduate student registered in the Social Work Course at The University of British Columbia, or for an undergraduate in the second, third or fourth year of Arts and Science at the University planning to enter the Social Work Course.

Hugo E. Meilicke Fund

Established in 1960 by Hugo E. Meilicke with a gift of \$10,000, and added to by him in subsequent years. The income of the Fund is to be paid annually for a period of twenty years to The University of British Columbia for any purpose at The University of British Columbia approved by the President and Board of Governors of the University which will further the work of the University.

James B. Russell Fund

Established in 1961 under the Will of the late James B. Russell with a gift of \$23,365.83. The income of this Fund is to be used annually in the discretion of the Directors of Vancouver Foundation in forwarding the study at The University of British Columbia of the subject of Geriatrics.

The Helen Pitt Fund for Fine Arts

Established in 1961 by Mrs. Helen Pitt of Vernon, B.C. with a gift of \$10,000 and added to by her subsequently. The income of this Fund is to be expended in the granting of annual Scholarships, Bursaries or Awards from time to time to students in the Fine Arts particularly painting, who show ability, talent, need and worthiness in these pursuits, and who wish to further their education in this field in British Columbia or elsewhere.

1970 Additions \$15,000.00

Herman Bischoff Foundation

Established in 1961 by the late Marie C. E. A. Bischoff with a gift of \$20,000 and added to subsequently. The income of the Fund is to be paid annually (1) to the United Community Services of the Greater Vancouver Area to provide recreational and social activities and services for handicapped persons residing in the Greater Vancouver area in such manner as the United Community Services may determine; and, (2) to the Medical Faculty of The University of British Columbia for neurological research.

Established in 1962 by Mrs. Henry A. Bulwer in memory of her husband with a gift of \$10,000.00. The income of the Fund is to be used for assistance to and the alleviation of suffering among the aged.

Established in 1962 by H. R. MacMillan with a gift of \$1,000,000. The Fund is designated for:

The Vinten Fund

Established in 1962 by Mr. and Mrs. H. B. Norris with a gift of \$5,000 and added to by them in 1965. The income of the Fund is to be paid annually to The University of British Columbia for the assistance of a student who is proceeding to courses in Engineering, and for educational aid.

The Mark and Phae Collins Fund

Established by the late Mark Collins and Mrs. Collins in 1963. The income of the Fund is to be distributed annually for general charitable and educational purposes.

The Andrew Baker Fleck Foundation

Established by the late B. W. Fleck in 1963 and added to in 1964. The income of the Fund is to be distributed annually for-

- (a) Medical Research.
- (b) Summer Camp Fees for needy children.

When a gift is made to the General Fund, or to an already established Special Fund, a letter addressed to Vancouver Foundation should accompany the gift, specifying the Fund to which the gift is to be applied and the acknowledgment of Vancouver Foundation (which is a non-profit organization for charitable purposes within the meaning of the Income Tax Act) will complete the transaction. Any gift may be made anonymously.

If the donor wishes to establish a Special Fund or Foundation, either under his or her own name, or in any name to be associated perpetually with such Special Fund or Foundation, a Deed of Gift will be prepared which will declare the purposes to which the gift and the income to arise therefrom are to be devoted. The donor may specify therein the investments which may be made, the persons, if any, upon whose discretion he relies in distributing moneys from the Fund and may make any special provisions which are within the wide charitable objects of Vancouver Foundation and do not conflict with its simple rules of administration.

2. BY WILL. The testator who wishes to make a testamentory gift to Vancouver Foundation will be advised by his or her solicitor that by Will he or she may make the same choice of a gift to Vancouver Foundation as might have been done by lifetime gift, namely, a devise or bequest to the General Fund, to any Special Fund, or the creation of a Fund or Foundation to be devoted to a particular object or several charitable or educational objects and bearing such name as may be desired.
