



The Chairman's Report

Vancouver Foundation has operated for 30 years under the Vancouver Foundation Act 1950 which is a Statute of the Legislature of British Columbia establishing this non-profit, charitable organization to acquire all the assets of a similar society created in 1943 by the Vancouver Welfare Federation. At the time this legislation was passed in 1950 the assets of the society were in the order of \$200,000.

In the 30 years since then those assets have grown through thousands of donations and bequests, large and small, as well as through appreciation in value to a total approximating \$78,000,000.

In 1980 it seemed necessary and appropriate that the Provincial Legislation be amended to reflect and provide for the wider functions and community representation of the Foundation. Approval of such amended Legislation was obtained in August 1980 and subsequently proclaimed. Basically these amendments add four dimensions to our Charter.

- 1. The Board of Directors is enlarged to 12 residents of British Columbia each serving voluntarily for a four year term. We welcome Mrs. Beverly Field, Mrs. B.O. Dryvynsyde and Mr. H. Clark Bentall as new members of the Board to complete its complement. During the year Mr. Clifford Shirley also joined the Board as a replacement for Mr. Duncan Campbell representing the Pacific Sub-Section of the Canadian Bankers Association.
- 2. The Board of Directors is given further discretion to disburse Foundation funds for charitable purposes anywhere in British Columbia and particularly having regard to the area wherein a donor normally resides at the time a gift is made to the Foundation.
- 3. The objects of Vancouver Foundation now include the promotion of recreational activities and the conservation of human, natural and heritage resources.
- 4. The Foundation is empowered to manage funds entrusted to it by another charitable organization authorized to operate in British Columbia

and registered under the Income Tax Act (Canada).

Under the will of the late W.J. Van-Dusen the bulk of his estate was bequeathed to The Pincher Foundation which had been established by Mr. VanDusen to be administered by Trustees "for the public welfare". Vancouver Foundation has been appointed to manage these funds and to recommend the distribution of the income therefrom for charitable purposes in British Columbia in conformity with its own mandate and charter. By adding these managed funds to those under the direct control of Vancouver Foundation we are able to state that assets aggregating in excess of \$100,000,000 have been placed under our administration "for the public welfare".

Recently the name of The Pincher Foundation was changed to the W.J. VanDusen Foundation and its income, as distributed by Vancouver Foundation in combination with its own disbursements, helped produce the exceptional increase in giving referred to later in this report. We anticipate that this growth in combined distributions will continue in 1981 though not at the same rate as in the last year, but nevertheless reflecting in some measure the increased, but inflationary return that can be expected from the funds under our management.

While 1980 has been a year of uncertainty and problems it has been a year in which many citizens of British Columbia have enjoyed benefits from the resources, from land appreciation and development as well as cherished privileges to enjoy freedom and the environment in which we live. It is our hope that many will respect this as an opportunity to use Vancouver Foundation as a vehicle to benefit the community in which they reside and thus, fellow citizens of this and future generations.

Executive Director's Report

The past year was unusually significant for the Foundation as our Chairman's report indicates. Besides changes in our governing Act there was an extraordinary increase in overall disbursements which was materially influenced by our association with the W.J. VanDusen Foundation. That increase, from \$5,103,556 in 1979 to giving of \$7,506,492 in 1980, was extremely gratifying.

Significant as well at another level was our Board's acceptance of 15 new Endowment Funds which brought to 188 the number of such Funds under our administration as the year ended. More than half these new Funds were established by non-profit charitable organizations and we have taken considerable satisfaction from that fact. It is our firm contention that an endowment can help protect such organizations from undue dependence on government funding, guard against the vagaries of annual public solicitations and help ensure that worthwhile services are maintained.

As regards disbursements, we received 271 applications for aid in 1980 of which we accepted 196 for funding by grants totalling \$4,870,878 of income over which our Directors had discretionary control. An additional 101 disbursements representing \$2,635,614 were made from the income or in some instances from the capital and income of Funds whose objects had been designated by donors. The work connected with the administration of our 188 Funds and of the Foundation as a whole was accomplished at a net cost of \$214,763 or 2.65% of gross revenue, an encouraging improvement over the 3.49% cost figure in 1979.

All those associated with Vancouver Foundation through its Board of Directors and Advisory Committees contribute their time without compensation and our need for that time in 1980 was extreme. This annual report will, we trust, amply demonstrate the value of the contributions those volunteers made to their community and this Province through the Foundation. In the course of the year Miss Niki Gamm resigned from our Cultural Advisory

Committee to take a foreign assignment and we also regretfully accepted for reasons of health the resignation of one of the original members of our Education Committee, Mr. Dean H. Goard.

It is a pleasure to close this report by acknowledging the efforts of our small but highly competent and versatile staff. The calibre of our administration is a measure of their efforts and in that regard we feel we can take a high degree of satisfaction.



Investment Committee Report

The program outlined in the 1979 report to taking advantage of the higher prices in the stock market and the higher rates of return available on fixed income securities to improve the overall return was continued in 1980.

Of the total invested assets of \$73,698,313 some \$60,184,319 are held in the Consolidated Trust Fund. This is made up of all the assets of 173 Funds and a portion of the assets of 7 Funds. The Funds hold "units" in the Consolidated Trust Fund. In 1980 the distribution per unit increased from 82¢ to 91¢, or by 11%, and the unit price improved from \$9.7068 to \$9.9662.

Almost all the assets in the Consolidated Trust Fund are marketable securities, with approximately 37% in common shares or securities convertible into common shares, and 59% in cash and short term notes, bonds and debentures. The balance includes some \$2,664,144 in mortgages and real estate of which \$1,150,000 was invested in land near Squamish, purchased to lease to the North Vancouver School Board. This was an attractive investment (with a full pay-out on the lease) and also enabled the School District to keep in place a valuable nature program that would otherwise have been lost.

Mention should also be made of a special "Capital Projects Fund" which has been established and is held under the category of "Other Trust Funds". This was created by setting aside funds to be available to lend on security at less than market rates to help finance projects that would not qualify for outright capital grants, or to agencies that have an ongoing capital raising campaign, or have been promised grants from alternative sources such as government, out of which the loan will be repaid. At the year end loans totalling \$70,000 were outstanding and a further \$150,000 committed.





We have examined the statement of financial position of Vancouver Foundation as at December 31, 1980 and the funds' income statement for the year then ended. # Notes to Financial Statements

**December 31, 1980** 

1. The Consolidated Trust Fund comprises those assets over which the Foundation exercises discretionary investment control within guidelines established by the Board of Directors. The Other Trust Funds comprise those assets which are administered in accordance with specific directions from the donors and/or which do not qualify under the British and Canadian Insurance Companies' Act as consolidated trust fund investments.

During the year Consolidated Trust Fund contributed principal was increased by \$4,634,153 (1979 - \$1,983,233) transferred from Other Trust Funds contributed principal.

2. Summary of accounting policies:

The following accounting policies used by Vancouver Foundation are stated here to assist in understanding the Foundation's financial statements.

- (a) Bequests and grants Bequests are recorded upon receipt of the donated assets. Bequests in a form other than cash or marketable securities are recorded at values assigned by the Board of Directors. Grants are recorded when paid by the Foundation.
- (b) Investments —
  Investments within the Consolidated Trust Fund are valued at current market prices on the last business day of the fiscal period. Unrealized gains or losses arising as a result of the revaluation of investments to current market prices as well as any realized gains or losses arising from investment transactions are reflected as capital surplus. Investments within the Other Trust Funds are stated at cost and any realized gains or losses arising from investment transactions are included as part of contributed principal.
- (c) Investment Income Interest income on bonds, mortgages and short-term notes is accrued as earned. Dividend income is recorded when received.
- (d) Office equipment and leasehold improvements are recorded and expensed when paid.
- (e) Administrative expenses and trust companies' fees are recorded when paid.
- Vancouver Foundation has commitments for grants totalling \$1,802,458 payable in 1981 and 1982 out of distributable income.
- 4. With effect from January 1, 1980, Vancouver Foundation has acted as agent for the W.J. VanDusen Foundation. Accordingly, the assets of that foundation are not included in these financial statements. Certain 1979 figures have been reclassified to indicate the effect of this agency arrangement which, while not formalized until later, was in fact operative during that year.







# How to Make use of Vancouver Foundation

Vancouver Foundation is a nonprofit corporation established by the Legislature of British Columbia under the Vancouver Foundation Act 1950. It is registered as a Public Charitable Foundation under the Income Tax Act of Canada and is authorized to issue receipts for taxation purposes under the Act.

#### 1. Lifetime Gifts

Under its rules of administration Vancouver Foundation will carry out the wishes of a donor provided these are charitable in nature and conform with the provisions of these Statutes.

A letter or Deed of Gift will declare the purposes of a gift and the income to arise therefrom. This will be officially acknowledged by Vancouver Foundation. Any gift may be made anonymously.

Directions may be given to establish a SPECIAL FUND bearing the name of the donor or any other name to be associated perpetually with the gift and any subsequent additions thereto. To establish a SPECIAL FUND the initial gift must be in the minimum amount of \$10,000. A SPECIAL FUND may be a CLOSED FUND, limited to gifts from the original donor or relatives, or it may be an OPEN FUND to which others may contribute if so desired.

Gifts may be made in any amount for addition to an OPEN FUND already established by Vancouver Foundation for a wide variety of charitable objects and organizations.

Discretion may be given to the Directors of Vancouver Foundation to apply the gift, and the income to be derived therefrom to any charitable object or organization, or the donor when establishing a SPECIAL FUND may state the person or persons upon whose discretion the Directors may rely in distributing monies from the Fund for charitable purposes.

Gifts given to be used in the sole discretion of the Directors of Vancouver Foundation will be added to the Foundation's COMMUNITY FUND, the income from which will be disbursed for charitable purposes as may be determined from time to time by the Directors of the Foundation.

If no SPECIAL FUND is to be established and no discretion is given to the Directors of Vancouver Foundation a gift will be added to the GENERAL FUND, the income from which

has, by practice, been paid to The United Way of the Lower Mainland for health and welfare agencies.

# 2. Testamentary Gifts by Will

A Testator who wishes to make a gift to Vancouver Foundation will be advised by his or her solicitor that by Will the same choice of a gift to Vancouver Foundation may be made as might be done by lifetime gift. A testamentary gift may be for a specific amount or for the residue of an estate or any portion thereof.

#### 3. Endowment Funds

Voluntary charitable organizations may, when authorized, establish Memorial or Endowment Funds (minimum \$10,000) in Vancouver Foundation for administration under terms which conform with their charitable objects. In these circumstances the annual income will be applied by Vancouver Foundation in accordance with the terms of such Funds.

#### 4. Other Relevant Statutes

Because there are other public statutes which relate to charitable gifts whether made during a donor's life or by his or her Will, professional advice should be taken before a gift is made or the Will prepared containing such a gift. Vancouver Foundation, however, welcomes enquiries from potential donors and preliminary discussions regarding gifts or bequests can be arranged at any time.
