

In reporting on Vancouver Foundation's thirty-ninth year of service to British Columbia we look forward in 1983 to celebrating our 40th Anniversary. In 1943, with World War II still at its peak, ten Vancouver citizens had the foresight to appreciate the need for a permanent endowment sufficient to provide income for ongoing support of a variety of worthy community causes. Their inspiration came from W.J. VanDusen who suggested the creation of Vancouver Foundation. The ten founders each contributed an equal amount and quickly built the initial capital to \$101,000, including a bequest of \$1,000 from the Estate of Alice G. McKay. Their efforts provided the early leadership and subsequent guidance upon which Vancouver Foundation has grown. Today, this organization which they created administers funds totalling more than \$122,000,000.



BOARD OF DIRECTORS REPORT FOR 1982



G. Peter Kaye Chairman of the Board

As we prepare to mark the 40th Anniversary of the founding of Vancouver Foundation it is heartening to record that new levels of achievement were reached in 1982. During that year Contributed Principal increased by a net amount of \$7,217,710 (Gross \$8,314,793) to a total of \$86,377,331. At year end the assets represented by this sum had appreciated in value to a total of \$93,929,562 or 23.8% over the opening figure of \$75.820.236. The assets of the W.J. Van-Dusen Foundation, which we administer under an agreement with the Trustees of that Fund, showed a similar percentage appreciation in value so that at December 31st, 1982 we had assets totalling in excess of \$122,000,000 in value under our administration for charitable purposes an increase of 22%.

Income for the year from both these sources increased to a new record level of \$11,615,122, against which our administrative expenses of \$288,430 were charged.

In a year of national recession when the charitable agencies we serve in the community were facing the problems of inflated costs of operation and increased demands on their services, our Directors adopted the policy of distributing the maximum amount that our income levels would prudently allow. Thus, our total distributions for 1982 reached a total of \$10,642,666 as compared with \$8,852,767 in 1981 again a new record. It remains the policy of the Board to distribute, with discretion, the maximum amount that our income flow will allow in order to meet the demands and needs of the agencies we support. This has been consistently in excess of the minimum that the Income Tax Act of Canada demands.

An examination of the Distribution Schedules included in this 1982 Report shows that the most significant increases in our grants went to the three public universities in British Columbia to bolster the resources they are able to allocate in 1983 for teaching and research in the Humanities. At the same time, sizeable increased grants were provided in 1982 to assist students in meeting their educational costs at universities, colleges and schools in the Province. Our total distribution to the United Way of the Lower Mainland in 1982 increased to \$972,157 from \$704,924 in the previous year, thus enabling that organization, serving 83 agencies, to meet its appeal objective. Child Welfare and Youth organizations catering to the health, occupational and recreational activities of that age group are experiencing heavy demands on their resources and received in the aggregate an increase of \$543,208 in the amount of our distributions in 1982. This was also true in respect of our grants for medical and health research and services which advanced by 20% in 1982 to a total of \$544,540.

In the past three years Vancouver Foundation and the W.J. VanDusen Foundation have instituted a policy of making matching grants from undesignated Funds to a number of charitable organizations who have been successful in adding to their Endowment Funds as a cushion for their longer term needs. It is intended to continue this Foundation policy thereby encouraging agency supporters to take advantage of this opportunity to build up resources for the future.

Times of economic stringency and restraint through which this Country and Province are passing place an increased burden of responsibility on those who have to make difficult administrative and judgement decisions. Our Board of Directors has been loyally served by the Foundation's administrative staff, and by the volunteer members of our Advisory Committees. Rotating changes in membership are recorded in this Report. Our thanks are expressed to those who have served in 1982. Particular mention should be made of F.B. (Ted) Hathaway, a member of our Youth Committee, who died in September. Martin N. Gifford who retired from the Board by rotation at the end of the year, and C.J. Shirley who relinquished his position on the Board on transfer to Ontario.

The arrangement we have enjoyed for a number of years to share office facilities with the Law Foundation of British Columbia terminated at their request at the end of 1982. We have negotiated a welcome reduction in the custodianship fees charged for Trust Company services, effective in 1983. Future predictions are difficult to make, but with the continued support that we expect from donors who recognize the role of Vancouver Foundation in the community we are hopeful that present levels of support for the agencies we serve can be maintained.







Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 1982

 The Consolidated Trust Fund comprises those assets over which the Foundation exercises discretionary investment control within guidelines established by the Board of Directors. The Other Trust Funds comprise those assets which are administered in accordance with specific directions from the donors and/or which do not qualify under the British and Canadian Insurance Companies' Act as consolidated trust fund investments.

2. Summary of accounting policies:

The following accounting policies used by Vancouver Foundation are stated here to assist in understanding the Foundation's financial statements.

(a) Bequests and grants -

Bequests are recorded upon receipt of the donated assets. Bequests in a form other than cash or marketable securities are recorded at values assigned by the Board of Directors. Grants are recorded when paid by the Foundation.

(b) Investments —

Investments within the Consolidated Trust Fund are valued at current market prices on the last business day of the fiscal period. Unrealized gains or losses arising as a result of the revaluation of investments to current market prices as well as any realized gains or losses arising from investment transactions are reflected as capital surplus (deficiency). Investments within the Other Trust Funds are stated at cost and any realized gains or losses arising from investment transactions are included as part of contributed principal.

(c) Investment income —

Interest income on bonds, mortgages and short-term notes is accrued as earned. Dividend income is recorded when received.

- (d) Office equipment and leasehold improvements are recorded and expensed when paid.
- (e) Administrative expenses and trust companies' fees are recorded when paid.

4. Commitments:

Vancouver Foundation has commitments for grants totalling \$1,821,220 payable in 1983 and 1984 out of distributable income.

5. W.J. VanDusen Foundation:

Vancouver Foundation acts as agent for the W.J. VanDusen Foundation and accordingly, the assets of that foundation are not included in these financial statements. Contributions to and distributions by Vancouver Foundation are made under the authority of the Trustees of the W.J. VanDusen Foundation. The total of the contributions received from the W.J. VanDusen Foundation and interest earned on funds pending distribution have exceeded the total of the distributions by \$147,503 as at December 31, 1982 (1981 - \$80,817) which amount is included in distributable income in these financial statements.

HOW TO MAKE USE OF VANCOUVER FOUNDATION

Vancouver Foundation is a non-profit corporation established by the Legislature of British Columbia under the Vancouver Foundation Act 1950. It is registered as a Public Charitable Foundation under the Income Tax Act of Canada and is authorized to issue receipts for taxation purposes under that Act.

1. Lifetime Gifts

Under its rules of administration, Vancouver Foundation will carry out the wishes of a donor provided these are charitable in nature and conform with the provisions of these Statutes.

A letter or Deed of Gift will declare the purposes of a gift and the income to arise therefrom. This will be officially acknowleged by Vancouver Foundation. Any gift

may be made anonymously.

Directions may be given to establish a SPECIAL FUND bearing the name of the donor or any other name to be associated perpetually with the gift and any subsequent additions thereto. To establish a SPECIAL FUND the initial gift must be in the minimum amount of \$10,000. A SPECIAL FUND may be a CLOSED FUND, limited to gifts from the original donor or relatives, or it may be an OPEN FUND to which others may contribute if so desired.

Gifts may be made in any amount for addition to an OPEN FUND already established by Vancouver Foundation for a wide variety of charitable objects and or-

ganizations.

Discretion may be given to the Directors of Vancouver Foundation to apply the gift, and the income to be derived therefrom to any charitable object or organization, or the donor when establishing a SPECIAL FUND may state the person or persons upon whose discretion the Directors may rely in distributing monies from the Fund for charitable purposes.

Gifts given to be used in the sole discretion of the Directors of Vancouver Foundation will be added to the Foundation's COMMUNITY FUND, the income from which will be disbursed for charitable purposes as may be determined from time to time by the Directors of the Foun-

dation.

If no SPECIAL FUND is to be established and no discretion is given to the Directors of Vancouver Foundation a gift will be added to the GENERAL FUND, the income from which has, by practice, been paid to The United Way of the Lower Mainland for health and welfare agencies.

2. Testamentary Gifts by Will

A Testator who wishes to make a gift to Vancouver Foundation will be advised by his or her solicitor that by Will the same choice of a gift to Vancouver Foundation may be made as might be done by lifetime gift. A testamentary gift may be for a specific amount or for the residue of an estate or any portion thereof.

3. Endowment Funds

Voluntary charitable organizations may, when authorized, establish Memorial or Endowment Funds (minimum \$10,000) in Vancouver Foundation for administration under terms which conform with their charitable objects. In these circumstances the annual income will be applied by Vancouver Foundation in accordance with the terms of such Funds.

4. Other Relevant Statutes

Because there are other public statutes which relate to charitable gifts whether made during a donor's life or by his or her Will, professional advice should be taken before a gift is made or the Will prepared containing such a gift. Vancouver Foundation, however, welcomes enquiries from potential donors and preliminary discussions regarding gifts or bequests can be arranged at any time.


