REPORT FROM THE VANCOUVER FOUNDATION



In this 44th Annual Report of the Vancouver Foundation, we are pleased to be able to give an account of another year of significant growth, both in terms of aggregrate capital and the distribution of income in aid of people throughout British Columbia.

At the close of our fiscal year 1987, the Foundation had 371 funds under administration, representing capital in the amount of \$194,025,031. This is an increase of over \$27 million due, in large measure, to the addition of 26 important funds.

As a result of the careful management of these assets, and despite the economic events of 1987, investment income to the Foundation totalled \$14.85 million last year. This compares quite

favourably with the \$13.6 million recorded in 1986. These monies enabled our Foundation to make grants and other distributions, totalling over \$13.5 million, to hundreds of deserving organizations. These groups were active in a variety of fields, including the arts, education, youth programs, medicine and child welfare.

The people who make all of this possible are our donors. Since 1943 generous individuals from Vancouver and a host of other communities have contributed funds for our work. We owe them a tremendous debt of gratitude, for without their philanthropy the Foundation would simply not exist.

It is to these donors, past and present, that we also owe a duty. That duty includes raising the level of philanthropy in our society. We know that we can do so much more. In fact, as the 1980's draw to a close, we find that we must do more.

To that end, we hope to embark on a program of raising the profile of the Vancouver Foundation – to set an example to all British Columbians. And to encourage more people to make bequests and establish trust funds. We seriously lag behind the magnitude of this type of giving which has become the norm with our neighbours in the United States. We know British Columbians can be a generous people; we owe it to all those who have contributed to the Foundation over the years to make philanthropy a larger part of our lives.

We need to duplicate, on a year-round basis, the tremendous outpouring of support given to those who catch our collective imagination, like Terry Fox and Rick Hansen. With this goal in mind, it is particularly pleasing to have the Man in Motion Legacy Fund vested in the Foundation. This \$19.6 million fund, produced through the extraordinary efforts and courage of Rick Hansen, is a national fund, directed by an Advisory Panel appointed by Mr. Hansen, towards spinal cord research and rehabilitation. While this new fund represents a unique challenge to the Vancouver Foundation, the opportunity presented by it should produce substantial benefits to disabled persons immediately and in the years ahead.

The close working relationship between the Vancouver Foundation and the W.J. VanDusen Foundation was maintained in 1987, as in past years. While the direction and control of the W.J. VanDusen Foundation rests in Calgary, Alberta, income of \$2,243,526 on assets of \$34,236,030 was distributed in British Columbia. The assets and distributions of the W.J. VanDusen Foundation are reported within the pages of this Annual Report.

We are also pleased to report our relationship with the United Way continues to be strong and productive. In 1987 the Foundation provided over \$960,000 to the United Way for its important work. A representative of the United Way of the Lower Mainland is a member of our Foundation's board.

Administration costs of the Foundation amounted to less than five percent of total income last year, including trust company fees. This illustrates forcefully the Board's commitment to economy in Foundation operations.

We record with sadness the death in 1987 of the Board's immediate past Chairman and former Executive Director, Mr. G. Peter Kaye. His years of service and leadership have left the Foundation stronger, and our community a better place. His record of service is outstanding and should serve as a model to us all.

We also wish to report the re-election to our Board for an additional term of Mr. P.J. Armer, representing the Canadian Bankers' Association, Pacific Subsection. The Foundation has benefited greatly from his expertise and enthusiasm.

The members of the Foundation's advisory committees continued their record of thoughtful work in 1987. All committee members are volunteers who give of their time to help make the Vancouver Foundation responsive to the needs of all people in British Columbia. Their work is crucial to our success and we record our deepest appreciation for those efforts.

Our conscientious staff continues to perform the Foundation's work in an exemplary fashion. We are grateful for their efforts and take pride in their outstanding accomplishments.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 1987

1. Consolidated and other trust funds:

The Consolidated Trust Fund comprises those assets over which the Foundation exercises discretionary investment control within guidelines established by the Board of Directors. The Other Trust Funds comprise those assets which are administered in accordance with specific directions from the donors and/or which do not qualify under the British and Canadian Insurance Companies' Act as consolidated trust fund investments.

2. Accounting policies:

The following accounting policies used by Vancouver Foundation are stated here to assist in understanding the Foundation's financial statements.

(a) Bequests and grants-

Bequests are recorded upon receipt of the donated assets. Bequests in a form other than cash or marketable securities are recorded at values assigned by the Board of Directors. Grants are recorded when paid by the Foundation.

(b) Investments -

Investments within the Consolidated Trust Fund are valued at current market prices on the last business day of the fiscal period. Unrealized gains or losses arising as a result of the revaluation of investments to current market prices as well as any realized gains or losses arising from investment transactions are reflected as capital surplus. Investments within the Other Trust Funds are stated at cost and any realized gains or losses arising from investment transactions are included as part of contributed principal.

(c) Investment income-

Interest income on bonds, mortgages and short-term notes is accrued as earned. Dividend income is recorded when received.

- (d) Office equipment and leasehold improvements are recorded and expensed when paid.
- (e) Administrative expenses and trust companies' fees are recorded when paid.

3. Commitments:

Vancouver Foundation has commitments for grants totalling \$4,088,000 payable in 1988 and 1989 out of distributable income.

Vancouver Foundation also has lease commitments related to office space approximating \$65,200 per year during the period from 1988 through 1991 and \$70,300 per year during the period from 1992 through 1996.

HOW CAN YOU HELP IN THE WORK OF THE VANCOUVER FOUNDATION?

Here are a number of options available to you, and some general information about the structure of the Vancouver Foundation.

The Vancouver Foundation is a non-profit corporation established under the *Vancouver Foundation Act* of British Columbia. It is registered as a Public Charitable Foundation under the *Income Tax Act of Canada* and is authorized to issue receipts for taxation purposes under that Act.

1. LIFETIME GIFTS

Under our rules of administration, Vancouver Foundation will carry out the wishes of a donor, provided these are charitable in nature and conform with the provisions of the statutes noted above.

A gift may be made by letter or Deed of Gift. Such a letter or Deed of Gift should declare the purposes of the gift and the distribution of the income arising therefrom. This letter or Deed of Gift will then be officially acknowledged by the Vancouver Foundation. Gifts may also be made anonymously.

SPECIAL FUNDS

Direction may be given by a donor to establish a special fund bearing the name of the donor or any other name to be associated perpetually with the gift and any subsequent additions thereto. To establish a special fund the initial gift must be at least \$10,000.00. A special fund may either be a closed fund (limited to gifts from the original donor and relatives) or it may be an open fund (to which others may also contribute).

Gifts may also be made in any amount for addition to an open fund.

Discretion may be given by a donor to the directors of the Vancouver Foundation to apply the gift, and the income derived therefrom, to any charitable object or organization. Or the donor, when establishing a special fund, may state the persons upon whose discretion the directors may rely in distributing monies from the fund.

COMMUNITY FUND

Gifts may be given to the Foundation's Community Fund. The income from this fund will be disbursed for charitable purposes as determined from time to time by the directors of the Foundation.

GENERAL FUND

If a gift is to be used at the discretion of the directors, and if no special fund is to be established, the gift will be added to the General Fund. Income from this fund has traditionally been given to the United Way of the Lower Mainland.

2. TESTAMENTARY GIFTS BY WILL

A testator who wishes to make a gift to Vancouver Foundation will be advised by his or her solicitor that the same choice of a gift may be made by will as by a lifetime gift. Such a testamentary gift may be for a specific amount or for the residue of an estate or any portion thereof, as the testator determines.

3. ENDOWMENT FUND

Voluntary charitable organizations may establish memorial or endowment funds with a minimum of \$10,000.00 in the Vancouver Foundation. These funds would be administered under terms which conform with that organization's own charitable objects. Under these circumstances the annual income will be applied by the Vancouver Foundation in accordance with these objects.

4. OTHER RELEVANT STATUTES

Because there are other public statutes relating to charitable gifts made during a donor's life or by will, professional advice should be sought before a gift is made or a will containing such a gift is prepared. Vancouver Foundation, however, welcomes enquiries from potential donors; preliminary discussions regarding gifts or bequests can be arranged at any time.
