The Vancouver Foundation was formed in 1943 when ten far-sighted individuals recognized the need for a permanent endowment fund to support charitable endeavours in British Columbia. Acting on an initial bequest of \$1,000 from Miss McKay, each of these generous people contributed a further \$10,000. The original capital of \$101,000 has now grown, through continuing bequests and careful management, to over two hundred and twenty million dollars. More importantly, since 1943 the Vancouver Foundation has distributed in excess of \$100 million to a multitude of worthy organizations and endeavours.

In addition to Miss McKay, the original contributors to the Vancouver Foundation included Gordon Farrell, F. Ronald Graham, George Kidd C.B.E., W.H. Malkin O.B.E., C.T. McHattie, H.R. MacMillan C.C., C.B.E., D.Sc., LL.D., Chris Spencer C.B.E., W.J. VanDusen, A.H. Williamson O.B.E. and the Hon. W.C. Woodward.

Since our last report to the community, Vancouver Foundation has experienced several significant events, changes and achievements which I would like to share with you:

- In 1989 Dr. J. D. McGann, Executive Director since 1975, retired after twenty-five years of dedicated service to Vancouver Foundation. Through Dr. McGann's commitment and leadership Vancouver Foundation grew and prospered. During his tenure our foundation assisted a greater number of groups and individuals from a wider range of communities than ever before. I am sure you all join me in wishing David best wishes in his retirement.

- To fill the gap created by Dr. McGann's retirement, Richard H. Vogel, Q.C. joined Vancouver Foundation as our new President and C.E.O. Mr. Vogel is a lawyer and former Deputy Attorney General of British Columbia. He has enjoyed a distinguished career in law and senior levels of government, and has an extensive community and military service background. Welcome, Dick.
- During the calendar year 1988 we received 21 new funds, including the \$20 million Rick Hansen Man-in-Motion Legacy Fund, bringing the total number of public and private funds and foundations to 392. By mid-1989 this total reached 408.
- Our capital fund at December 31, 1988 stood at \$221 million. This represents an increase of ten percent over 1987, and an increase of ninety percent over a mere five years ago. By mid-1989 Vancouver Foundation's capital fund stood at \$227 million.

- In 1988 Vancouver Foundation made grants totalling \$15,479,636 to more than six hundred organizations throughout British Columbia, improving the lives of many thousands of our fellow citizens.
- In April 1989 Vancouver Foundation made the largest

This followed a pledge of \$1 million in 1988 to Simon Fraser University for business and liberal studies programs at SFU's new downtown campus.

- In September, 1988, for the first time in our history, Vancouver Foundation's quarterly program of giving resulted in more grants being made to organizations outside Vancouver than in the city after which we are named.

As you can see from these highlights, Vancouver Foundation has been very busy. I am personally grateful to my colleagues on the Board of Directors for their guidance. The collective wisdom and experience of this talented group ensure that Vancouver Foundation will continue to thrive. The members of the Board have discharged their duties with foresight, care and dedication, and our foundation is in their debt.

It is with regret, therefore, that I report the departure from the Board of the Hon. Allan McEachern, the Hon. Beverley McLachlin, Mr. J. S. Cameron and Mrs. Beverly Field. These Board members have served Vancouver Foundation faithfully bringing their many skills to the stewardship of our organization.

I am pleased, however, to welcome to our Board the Hon. William Esson, Mr. John Barnett and Mr. Stanley Kwok. I look forward to their involvement and am confident Vancouver Foundation will be well-served by their broad range of experience and skills, and steady guidance.

Let me also express my personal gratitude to the unpaid volunteers who advise Vancouver Foundation on a range of important matters, from investment and administration to the areas of charitable activity supported by Vancouver Foundation. Vancouver Foundation firmly believes in the encouragement of volunteers in our society, and relies heavily on the contribution of the time and energy of talented and experienced people from other professions, organizations and walks of life. Those retiring from committees since our last report include Mrs. D. Finnigan and Mrs. J. C. Maddin (Arts), Mrs. Mary Angus, Mrs. G. C. Hyatt Jr. and Dr. R.A. We are extremely grateful for all of the many gifts made to Vancouver Foundation, both in terms of funds and personal service. The work undertaken by Vancouver Foundation provides important and lasting benefits to our province, making British Columbia a better place to live.

These contributions of money and time also demonstrate the commitment of so many people around the province to philanthropy and community participation in the well-being of those in need. These gifts underline the importance of a permanent endowment fund, such as Vancouver Foundation, that will continue to grow and provide income to serve these needs in perpetuity.

## HOW YOU CAN TAKE PART IN THE WORK OF VANCOUVER FOUNDATION

Vancouver Foundation is a non-profit corporation established under the *Vancouver Foundation Act* of British Columbia. It is registered as a Public Charitable Foundation under the *Income Tax Act of Canada*, and is authorized to issue receipts for taxation purposes.

There are many ways in which you can assist in the work of the Vancouver Foundation. Two of the most important are volunteering your time and talents, and establishing a fund or making a gift.

### Lifetime Gifts

Under our rules of administration Vancouver Foundation will carry out the wishes of a donor, provided these are charitable in nature and conform with the provisions of the statutes noted above.

A gift may be made by letter or Deed of Gift. Such a letter or Deed of Gift should declare the purposes of the gift and the distribution of the income arising therefrom. This letter or Deed of Gift will then be officially acknowledged by Vancouver Foundation. Gifts may also be made anonymously.

### SPECIAL FUND

Direction may be given by a donor to establish a Special Fund bearing the name of the donor or any other name to be associated perpetually with the gift and any subsequent additions thereto. To establish a Special Fund the initial gift must be at least \$10,000.00. A Special Fund may either be a Closed Fund (limited to gifts from the original donor and relatives) or it may be an Open Fund (to which others may also contribute). Gifts may also be made in any amount for addition to an Open Fund.

Discretion may be given by a donor to the directors of Vancouver Foundation to apply income derived from a Special Fund to any charitable object or organization. Or the donor, when establishing a Special Fund, may state the persons upon whose discretion the directors may rely in distributing monies from the fund.

### COMMUNITY FUND

Gifts may be made to the Foundation's Community

our broadest fund and the one to which we direct donors who wish to support our activities generally.

### GENERAL FUND

If no Special Fund is to be established, and no designation of the Community Fund is made, a gift will be added to the General Fund. Income from this fund has traditionally been given to the United Way of the Lower Mainland.

### Testamentary Gifts by Will

A gift to the Vancouver Foundation may be made by will as well as by a lifetime gift. Such a testamentary gift may be for a specific amount or for the residue of an estate or any portion thereof, as the testator determines. The ultimate disposition of a donor's testamentary gift is entirely dependent upon the precise wording of the will, so reference should always be made to the *Vancouver Foundation Act* when drafting a will.

### Endowment Fund

Voluntary charitable organizations may establish memorial or endowment funds with a minimum of \$10,000.00 in Vancouver Foundation. These funds are then administered under terms which conform with that organization's own charitable objects. Under these circumstances the annual income is applied by Vancouver Foundation in accordance with these objects.

### RELEVANT STATUTES

Because there are other public statutes relating to charitable gifts made during a donor's life or by will, professional advice should be sought before a gift is made or a will containing such a gift is prepared. Vancouver Foundation, however, welcomes enquiries from potential donors; preliminary discussions regarding gifts or bequests can be arranged at any time.



The Vancouver Foundation was formed in 1943 when ten far-sighted individuals recognized the need for a permanent endowment fund to support charitable endeavours in British Columbia. Acting on an initial bequest of \$1,000 from Miss McKay, each of these generous people contributed a further \$10,000. The original capital of \$101,000 has now grown, through continuing bequests and careful management, to over two hundred and twenty million dollars. More importantly, since 1943 the Vancouver Foundation has distributed in excess of \$100 million to a multitude of worthy organizations and endeavours.
