CONTINUING TO BUILD FOR A BETTER BRITISH COLUMBIA

A modest bequest of \$1,000 left to the Vancouver Foundation by Miss Alice C. McKay and the determination of Mr. W.J. VanDusen to build on that small beginning has, over the last 48 years, created great benefit for the people of British Columbia.

With that first bequest to the Foundation in hand, W.J. VanDusen challenged nine other founders to match his initial gift of \$10,000. Thus was created the Foundation's starting capital of \$101,000.

Today, through the contributions of many generous donors and under the continued stewardship of B.C.'s community leaders, the Vancouver Foundation's capital fund has grown to more than \$260 million, making it the fifth largest community foundation in North America.

The Foundation's effectiveness in addressing the province's changing charitable needs lies largely in its ability to monitor community concerns. In distributing funds, the Foundation draws extensively on the input of its advisory committees, which are comprised of volunteers who are active and experienced in a particular area. These individuals enable the Foundation to be informed, progressive and responsible in considering requests for funding.

At present, one third of the total funds administered by the Foundation are unrestricted and are used with a discretion exercised through the advisory committees to respond to current and emerging issues in B.C. The remaining two thirds have designated purposes and distribution of these funds is restricted.

Today, in the face of diverse and changing charitable needs that are very different from those of years past, the flexibility afforded by unrestricted funds is more important to the work of the Vancouver Foundation than ever before.

Donors may wish to consider setting up a fund in their own name giving wide discretion to the Foundation's Board or specifying a broad area of interest coinciding with any of the fields of interest represented by the Foundation's advisory committees: Child Welfare; Education; Youth; Arts and Culture; Health and Welfare; Environment; and Medical Research. Alternatively, donors who want to support the Foundation's activities in general may contribute to its Community Fund.

brought continued steady growth for the Vancouver Foundation and with it an enhanced capacity to respond to the changing charitable needs of the communities of British Columbia.

The Foundation remains confident in its outlook for the future and reflects with pride on the significant hallmarks of 1990:

- Twenty-two new funds were established with the Vancouver Foundation by individuals and charitable organizations, bringing the number of public and private funds and foundations to 438.
- The Vancouver Foundation's capital fund has grown to \$260,302,124.
- More than 767 grants totalling \$21,186,720. were made by the Vancouver Foundation to organizations throughout British Columbia.

These achievements would not have been possible without the skill and guidance of the Foundation's Board of Directors, the experienced counsel of its Advisory Committees, the dedication of its small professional staff, and, most importantly, the generous support of its donors. With gratitude, the Foundation acknowledges the significant contributions of all of these individuals who comprise this important partnership.

In June 1990 Mr. Richard Mulcaster was promoted to President of Vancouver Foundation. Mr. Mulcaster has 12 years experience in the Foundation and replaced Richard H. Vogel, Q.C., who stepped down as President after a short but productive tenure.

Sincere appreciation is expressed to departing Board members Mr. H. Clark Bentall and Ms. Christine Dryvynsyde. Mr. Bentall has served on the Executive Committee and the Investment Committee as well as acting as Vice-Chairman of the Board. He has been a member of the Board for the past 11 years. Ms. Dryvynsyde, who served initially as an Advisory Committee member, has chaired the Child Welfare Committee for the past eight years and has been a member of the Distribution Committee.

Newly appointed to lend their experience and judgment to the Foundation's Board of Directors are Ms. Sandra Wilking and Ms. Risa Levine.

With the introduction of a new by-law limiting the terms of Advisory Committee membership to three years, a number of outstanding members have stepped down after many years of valued service to the Foundation. 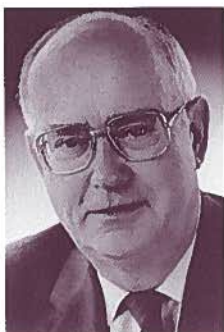
In serving its three main constituencies—its donors, the non-profit sector and the community as a whole—the Vancouver Foundation remains committed to its values of trust, open communications and vitality.

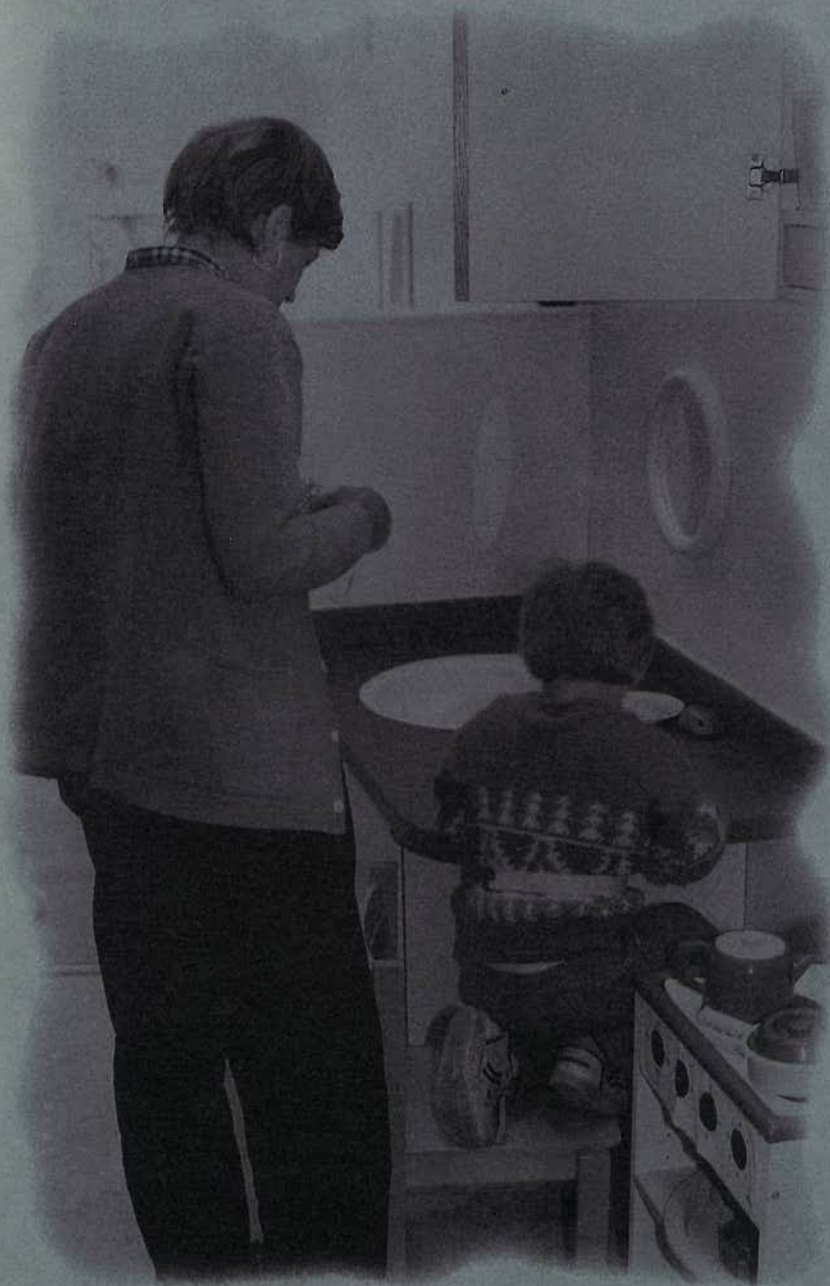

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 1990

1. CONSOLIDATED AND OTHER TRUST FUNDS

The Consolidated Trust Fund comprises those assets over which the Foundation exercises discretionary investment control within guidelines established by the Board of Directors. The Other Trust Funds comprise those assets which are administered in accordance with specific directions from the donors and/or which do not qualify under the British and Canadian Insurance Companies' Act as consolidated trust fund investments.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies used by Vancouver Foundation are stated here to assist in understanding the Foundation's financial statements.

Bequests and grants

Bequests are recorded upon receipt of the donated assets. Bequests in a form other than cash or marketable securities are recorded at values assigned by the Board of Directors. Grants are recorded when paid by the Foundation.

Investments

Investments within the Consolidated Trust Fund are valued at current market prices on the last business day of the fiscal period. Unrealized gains or losses arising as a result of the revaluation of investments to current market prices as well as any realized gains or losses arising from investment transactions are reflected as capital surplus. Investments within the Other Trust Funds are stated at cost and any realized gains or losses arising from investment transactions are included as part of contributed principal.

Deferred revenue

Proceeds received on the sale of covered call options are deferred until the earlier of the date exercised or the expiry date.

Office equipment and leasehold improvements

The cost of office equipment and leasehold improvements are recorded and expensed when incurred.

Investment income

Interest income on bonds, mortgages and short-term notes is accrued as earned. Dividends which have been declared are recorded as income on the date of record set for the dividend.

Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses and trust companies' fees are recorded on an accrual basis.

3. RESTRICTIONS ON PRINCIPAL AND INCOME

Similar to most foundations, substantially all of the contributed principal and capital surplus of the Vancouver Foundation and the income from contributed principal is restricted as to payment.

4. STATEMENT OF CHANGES IN FINANCIAL POSITION

A statement of changes in financial position has not been presented as management does not consider it meaningful in the circumstances.

5. COMMITMENTS

Vancouver Foundation has firm grant commitments totalling \$2,868,192 which will be paid out of distributable income as follows:

HOW YOU CAN TAKE PART IN THE WORK OF VANCOUVER FOUNDATION

Vancouver Foundation is a non-profit corporation established under the Vancouver Foundation Act of British Columbia. It is registered as a Public Charitable Foundation under the Income Tax Act of Canada and is authorized to issue receipts for taxation purposes.

There are many ways in which you can assist in the work of the Vancouver Foundation. Two of the most important are volunteering your time and talents, and establishing a fund or making a gift.

LIFETIME GIFTS

Under our rules of administration Vancouver Foundation will carry out the wishes of a donor, provided these are charitable in nature and conform with the provisions of the statutes noted above.

A gift may be made by letter or Deed of Gift. Such a letter or Deed of Gift should declare the purposes of the gift and the distribution of the income arising therefrom. This letter or Deed of Gift will then be officially acknowledged by Vancouver Foundation. Gifts may also be made anonymously.

SPECIAL FUND

Direction may be given by a donor to establish a Special Fund bearing the name of the donor or any other name to be associated perpetually with the gift and any subsequent additions thereto. To establish a Special Fund the initial gift must be at least \$10,000.00. A Special Fund may either be a Closed Fund (limited to gifts from the original donor and relatives) or it may be an Open Fund (to which others may also contribute).

Gifts may also be made in any amount for addition to an Open Fund.

Discretion may be given by a donor to the directors of Vancouver Foundation to apply income derived from a Special Fund to any charitable object or organization. Or the donor, when establishing a Special Fund, may state the persons upon whose discretion the directors may rely in distributing monies from the fund.

COMMUNITY FUND

Gifts may be made to the Foundation's Community Fund. The income from this fund is disbursed for charitable purposes as determined from time to time by the directors of Vancouver Foundation. This is our broadest fund and the one to which we direct donors who wish to support our activities generally.

GENERAL FUND (UNITED WAY)

If no Special Fund is to be established, and no designation of the Community Fund is made, a gift will be added to the General Fund. Income from this fund has traditionally been given to the United Way of the Lower Mainland.

TESTAMENTARY GIFTS BY WILL

A gift to the Vancouver Foundation may be made by will as well as by a lifetime gift. Such a testamentary gift may be for a specific amount or for the residue of an estate or any portion thereof, as the testator determines. The ultimate disposition of a donor's testamentary gift is entirely dependent upon the precise wording of the will, so reference should always be made to the Vancouver Foundation Act when drafting a will.

ENDOWMENT FUND

Voluntary charitable organizations may establish memorial or endowment funds with a minimum of \$10,000.00 in Vancouver Foundation. These funds are then administered under terms which conform with that organization's own charitable objects. Under these circumstances the annual income is applied by Vancouver Foundation in accordance with these objects.

RELEVANT STATUTES

Because there are other public statutes relating to charitable gifts made during a donor's life or by will, professional advice should be sought before a gift is made or a will containing such a gift is prepared. Vancouver Foundation, however, welcomes enquiries from potential donors; preliminary discussions regarding gifts or bequests can be arranged at any time.

Clauses showing how gifts may be made by will to Vancouver Foundation:

1. A Gift for the establishment of a personal or family fund, either Open or Closed:

To pay to Vancouver Foundation, a Corporate Body incorporated by Special Act of the Legislature of British Columbia, the sum of _____ to be held by the Foundation in a (Open/Closed) Fund to be known as the _____ Fund, and I direct that the income therefrom shall be paid out as follows: _____.

or

To Pay to Vancouver Foundation, a Corporate Body incorporated by Special Act of the Legislature of British Columbia, the sum of _____ to be held by the Foundation in a (Open/Closed) Fund to be known as the _____. I direct that the income therefrom be paid out at least annually, in the absolute discretion of the Directors of Vancouver Foundation, to be used in conformity with the objects of Vancouver Foundation and having regard to the fact of my interest in _____ (child welfare and/or arts and culture and/or education and/or youth and/or health and welfare and/or medical research and/or the conservation of natural resources).

2. A Gift to an "Open Fund":

To pay to Vancouver Foundation, a Corporate Body incorporated by Special Act of the Legislature of British Columbia, the sum of \$_____ to be added to the _____ Fund.

3. A Gift to the "Community Fund":

To pay to Vancouver Foundation, a Corporate Body incorporated by Special Act of the Legislature of British Columbia, the sum of \$_____ to be added to the Community Fund of the said Foundation.

4. A Gift to the "General Fund" (United Way):

To pay to Vancouver Foundation, a Corporate Body incorporated by Special Act of the Legislature of British Columbia, the sum of \$_____ to be added to the General Fund of the said Foundation.

5. A Gift to take effect following the decease of a lifetime beneficiary:

Upon the death of _____ to pay out the then residue of my estate to Vancouver Foundation, a Corporate Body incorporated by Special Act of the Legislature of British Columbia (select one of the following):

-to be held by Vancouver Foundation in a (Open/Closed) Fund to be known as the _____ Fund, and I direct that the income therefrom shall be paid out as follows: _____

or

-to be added to the Community Fund of the said Foundation.

or

-to be added to the General Fund of the said Foundation

6. A Gift of any lapsed bequests:

In case any bequest made by this my will shall by reason of the death of any named beneficiary or for any other reason fail to take effect, the property so bequeathed shall be delivered or paid to Vancouver Foundation, a Corporate Body incorporated by Special Act of the Legislature of British Columbia, to be added to the Community Fund of the said Foundation.
