CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

In the five decades since its formation as a society, Vancouver Foundation has marked many outstanding achievements. Most apparent is the growth of its capital fund from \$100,000 to more than \$300 million. Equally important, building on the vision of its creators, Vancouver Foundation has successfully kept pace with the increasingly complex needs of the British Columbia community and, in tandem with its capital growth, has expanded its capacity to respond to those needs.

To all of the individuals who have taken part in these achievements – our generous donors, the many citizens who have served on the Board of Directors and as volunteer advisors, and the Foundation's small, dedicated staff – I offer sincere thanks.

As we commemorate the 50th anniversary of what I proudly believe to be one of our province's greatest institutions, I am pleased to report on the significant accomplishments of 1992:

- Thirty-two (32) new funds were established with Vancouver Foundation, bringing the total number of public and private funds and foundations to 502.
- > The Foundation's capital fund increased by three percent to \$298,000,000.
- ➤ Charitable organizations across British Columbia received some 741 grants, totalling \$22,219,645.

In the fall of 1992, as part of its ongoing, long-term planning, Vancouver Foundation undertook its first ever formalized program planning process, one that involved all of its six Advisory Committees. These Committees are comprised of volunteers who contribute expert advice in their field and who play a vital role in keeping the Foundation in touch with the communities it serves. The program planning process effectively crystallized the purpose and goals of each Advisory Committee. As a result, Vancouver Foundation now offers greater clarity for charitable organizations seeking assistance and is able to take a more balanced proactive approach to its grant making.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I acknowledge with appreciation the valuable contribution of departing Advisory Committee members who completed their term during 1992: Environment – Ms. Liz Osborn; Youth – Mr. Joe Wai and Mr. Evan Adams; Education – Dr. Robin Brayne; and Child & Family – Dr. Archie Hardyment, Mr. Arne Olsen and Ms. Arlene Gladstone.

At the same time, I am pleased to welcome a number of new Advisory Committee members: Child and Family – Ms. Li Boesen, Dr. Judith Hall, Mr. Geoff Jopson, Mr. David Pranteau and Mr. Ron Yuen; Youth – Mr. Doug Soo; Education – Mr. David Kelpin, Mrs. Colleen Miller and Dr. Elmer Froese; and Arts & Culture – Mr. Willard Holmes.

With sadness, I report on the passing of Mr. Donald M. Clark, Q.C., who served as Legal Counsel to Vancouver Foundation from 1979 to 1990 and was subsequently made Honourary Legal Counsel. Mr. Clark's deep commitment to the Foundation's charitable purposes was reflected in his dedicated work toward this accomplishment. He will be greatly missed.

As we face the challenges of the future, Vancouver Foundation will remain focused on the three principal objectives that are central to its mission. The Foundation will:

- > Promote the sensible growth of income from contributed funds to achieve donors' charitable objectives.
- > Encourage and support those charitable organizations best able to carry out the purposes for which the Foundation was established.
- Provide philanthropic leadership and create and promote endeavours which improve the quality of life in the community.

As surely as we know that the charitable needs of tomorrow will be vastly different than those of yesterday and even today, we may rest assured in the knowledge

that Vancouver Foundation will be constant in its capacity to meet those needs, for the next 50 years and beyond.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

THE WAY THINGS WERE

The severe depression in the early thirties, with the consequent drain upon the financial resources of the provinces and municipalities, forced the Dominion Government into the relief field and in 1940 finally led to the establishment of a nation-wide plan of unemployment insurance.

In March, 1943, during discussion of a proposed Social Security Plan, the Prime Minister, the Rt. Hon. W.L. Mackenzie King said,"... industry is not merely a means whereby capitalists may increase profits, or workers find the means of gaining a livelihood through wages; but there exists also the right of the community, which makes possible the carrying on of industry, to expect to have the interest and well being of the community and its members considered in the rewards of the industry."

The plan being discussed involved the financial participation of the federal and provincial governments plus contributions from employers as well as employees – the first wefts and weaves of the social safety net.

The provisions of the national plan included:

- > Employment Training and Placement
- > Children's Allowances
- > Health Insurance
- > Disability and Old Age Pensions
- > Unemployment and Sickness Insurance
- ➤ Workmen's Compensation

Introduction of these schemes was to be coordinated with the existing welfare services operated by the provinces and cost-shared through grants-in-aid from the federal government.

THE WAY THINGS ARE

In March 1993, it was reported that British Columbia's welfare system was close to the breaking point with record numbers of people requiring assistance. More than 300,000 people – one in ten British Columbians – were on welfare, including 100,000 children.

A global restructuring of the economy, continued high levels of unemployment and a faltering national economy has fueled a growing demand for social services. At the same time, because of the massive national debt, the Federal Government is reducing transfer payments to the Provinces. It is cutting back – not just in social services, health and education, but across the board, in the arts and all of the other areas in which the Federal Government is involved.

The range of government programs has, of course, broadened tremendously since 1943 and so has our dependence on them. Now the responsibility for these programs is being shifted downward from federal to provincial to municipal governments, and in many cases, the task is taken on by the local community. In other words, back to the way things were.

If the trend is indeed one which sees the need for much greater inter-dependence, mutual support and cohesiveness at the community level – then the role of a community foundation like Vancouver Foundation has become increasingly important.

During 1992, much was done by our Advisory Committees towards addressing the emerging needs of British Columbia and this is reflected in the goals each Committee has set for itself. A growing number of the programs funded by Vancouver Foundation reflects our interest in building the resources of communities to bring about necessary change.

- > S.P.A.R.C. (Social Planning and Research Council of B.C.) initiated a program which provides assistance to communities to create or strengthen local social planning structures.
- > U.B.C., Faculty of Forestry (Centre for Applied Conservation Biology), has undertaken a project funded by Vancouver Foundation which is generating data to be used in the development of a Provincial Land Use Strategy for Biodiversity and Sustainable Development.
- > The Calmeadow Foundation operates a microenterprise project which has established community based, sustainable loan funds for groups of people in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside and within native bands across the Province.
- > Leadership Vancouver, initiated through Volunteer Vancouver with the assistance of the Vancouver Board of Trade and funded by Vancouver Foundation, trains future community leaders from all sectors, by enhancing their skills, increasing their understanding of emerging issues and giving them the cross-sectorial contacts to build bridges within the community.

THE FUTURE

Fifty years ago, W.J. VanDusen saw the need for a permanent fund created through the gifts and bequests of members of the community. Only the income from the capital would be spent and in a way that supplemented rather than supplanted the work of local agencies.

The philanthropic foundation he envisioned was to have broad purposes and be governed by and responsible to the community. Further, it would have the flexibility to re-direct funds from defunct purposes toward the emerging needs of society. Vancouver Foundation is the result – an informed and vital organization which supports charitable works across the province.

In the next generation, the principal challenge for the communities of British Columbia will be to anticipate and adapt to change. There will be less help from government, and that may not be a bad thing, but British Columbians will have to strive to understand each other, set realistic goals together and strive cooperatively towards their achievement.

Vancouver Foundation will encourage and support their efforts.

DONORS INFORMATION

Donors who wish to establish a fund with Vancouver Foundation may choose any of the following options. The initiating capital required to start a fund is \$10,000.

UNRESTRICTED FUND

This type of fund allows the donor's charitable giving to have the greatest possible impact. The income of the fund is applied to the community's most pressing, current needs and, over time, is redirected to respond to emerging problems.

All of the grants awarded to charitable organizations from unrestricted funds are made only after applications for funding have been considered and recommended by an Advisory Committee.

FIELD OF INTEREST FUND

The donor may establish their fund with the income to be distributed through any one or more of the Foundations six fields of interest.

DONOR ADVISED FUND

These funds are established with purposes corresponding to the donor's broad charitable aims. Thereafter, during the donor's lifetime, they or their appointees provide recommendations to the foundation, at least annually, as to which charitable organizations they would wish to see benefit from their fund's income.

DESIGNATED FUND

The income from these funds is directed to those specific charitable organizations named when the fund is established. While they can be initiated by individuals, designated funds are often started by the designated agency which makes contributions to its own fund.

OTHER GIFTING OPTIONS

If a donor wishes to support the work of Vancouver Foundation through a charitable contribution rather than by establishing a fund, a gift may be made for any of the following purposes.

- To be added to the Community Fund.
 The income from this fund is disbursed for charitable purposes as determined by the directors of the Foundation.
- > To a specified "open" fund.
- > To the United Way of the Lower Mainland Endowment Fund.

HOW TO ESTABLISH A FUND

The process for establishing a fund is quite straightforward.

- 1. The prospective donor writes a letter advising of their wish to establish a fund. The letter should include:
- (a) the name of the proposed Fund;
- (b) how the income is to be used (purpose of Fund); and
- (c) whether it is to be an open or closed fund.

NOTE: Any organization to be a recipient of income from the Fund is required to be a federally registered charity.

- 2. On receipt of the letter Vancouver Foundation draws up a deed of Gift, which is approved by our Legal Advisor and provided to the donor for review.
- 3. If the Deed of Gift is acceptable, the donor signs and returns it with the Fund's initiating capital of \$10,000.
- 4. The Deed of Gift is presented at the next quarterly meeting of the Board of Directors. If it is accepted, the donor is immediately notified to that effect and provided with an income tax receipt for the initiating capital. If for some reason the Fund is not accepted, the \$10,000 initiating capital is returned.

Standard clauses showing how gifts may be made to Vancouver Foundation by will or through an insurance policy are available on request.


EDUCATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

GOALS

➤ To assist in making the lifelong learning experiences positive, accessible, exciting and practical. ➤ To promote innovation in areas of study that are emerging, advancing rapidly or are in danger of being ignored. ➤ To address the learning requirements of target groups where there are specific needs because of culture, gender, race, economic, social, physical or mental reasons. ➤ To support programs that promote good citizenship, understanding and inclusiveness of diverse cultures, community responsibility and volunteerism. ➤ To encourage excellence, empowerment and enthusiasm among educators. ➤ To encourage institutional change to bring about greater educational equity for all students. ➤ To encourage alternative educational delivery systems where the funds are focused on the learner.



The Department of Mathematics and Science Education at U.B.C. is responsible for the training of elementary and secondary teachers. In the face of declining student enrolments in science and technology, the Department, in cooperation with the Langley School District, developed computer technology to deliver more effective teaching strategies.




CHILD AND FAMILY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

➤ To support initiatives within communities that promote full access to services for children and their families. ➤ To support initiatives that encourage the healthy development of children and their families. ➤ To support initiatives that develop social and physical environments to foster the optimum development of children. ➤ To advocate as a Foundation for the rights of children as endorsed and guided by the United Nation's Convention on the Rights of the Child. ➤ To support initiatives that advocate for the rights of children.



The Colt Daycare Program, run by the Richmond Youth Service Agency, enables many pregnant and parenting students to continue their high school education.



YOUTH ACTIVITIES ADVISORY COMMITTEE

GOALS

- > To promote health enhancing attitudes and behaviours in young people.
- > To promote activities which enable young people to be accepted and valued as contributing members at home, in school and in society at large.
- ➤ To promote cross-cultural activities that lead to better understanding among young people. ➤ To promote community initiatives that address basic needs of young people which include adequate food, health care, shelter and social supports. ➤ To promote projects which enhance the self-esteem, leadership skills and competency of young people.



After studying various alternatives, a task force of the Mission Community Services Society decided to develop their own model of Youth Centre. It was designed to offer programs which responded to the needs identified by local youth. With staff skilled in crisis intervention and counselling, the Centre is a demonstration project funded by Vancouver Foundation.



ENVIRONMENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE

GOALS

- ➤ To support processes which involve the affected constituencies in their planning, management and implementation. ➤ To assist the development and implementation of strategies achieved through consensual processes.
- > To support research projects, the need and methodology of which are seen to be well founded by the affected constituencies.



The Federation of British Columbia Naturalists' "Land for Nature Project" brought about a province-wide inventory of endangered natural spaces. Their work supports the development of a provincial land use strategy and provides important information for the Conservation Data Centre.




ARTS AND CULTURE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

GOALS

➤ To develop awareness, respect and appreciation for the arts. ➤ To improve access to education and training programs in the arts. ➤ To encourage artistic endeavours which broaden public awareness of our diverse cultures. ➤ To encourage coordination amongst arts groups that will help to build new audiences and/or make the most efficient use of resources by supporting: — collaborative productions, events or venues; — cross-fertilization of artistic or cultural ideas; — ventures to develop shared facilities or strategies (e.g., equipment, administrative/performance space, joint marketing). ➤ To encourage artistic endeavours that have not been done before. ➤ To strive for the highest possible standard in artistic excellence. ➤ To encourage operational efficiency through competent management and governance. ➤ To promote planning and action for long term financial stability.



STUDIO 58 is the Theatre Arts Program of Vancouver Community College. It offers intensive, conservatory style training in Acting and Production. Vancouver Foundation provided funding so that STUDIO 58 students could work with and learn from the professional actors of the New Bastion Theatre in a production of "Cyrano de Bergerac".




HEALTH AND WELFARE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

GOALS

➤ To encourage initiatives which support the development and facilitation of interagency cooperation. ➤ To encourage the development of skills and competencies for organizational and community development. ➤ To promote linkages between the social, health, economic and environmental sectors within communities. ➤ To assist families to more effectively carry out their essential functions of nurturing and supporting family members. ➤ To promote health in the broad sense — caring, safety and support — through prevention, remediation and treatment. ➤ To support seniors to maintain maximum independence and dignity.



The Surrey Come Share Society provides facilities and programs which enable socially isolated adults to participate in therapeutic activities and to develop social skills and relationships essential to their emotional and physical wellbeing. A crucial element of their Adult Day Care Program was the equipment, funded by Vancouver Foundation, which enabled seniors to benefit from a safe and enjoyable bath.



W.J. VANDUSEN

He has been called the pre-eminent philanthropist in the history of British Columbia. Fifty years after founding Vancouver Foundation, he remains the guiding spirit and greatest single contributor to what has become one of the largest community foundations in North America. He culminated a long and distinguished business career as Vice-chairman of MacMillan Bloedel and was widely respected for his rare judgement and managerial ability. Yet, despite his wealth and high position, he was a gentle man of simple values.

Whitford Julian VanDusen – affectionately known as Van – lived his life with a firm hand, a quiet voice and a generous heart. He believed in family, friendship, and hard work, and in placing obligations to others above claims upon them.

He was of the opinion that careful forethought and detailed planning were requisite to any decision. And though he could be severe against sloppiness and carelessness, his severity often covered an inner kindness. He was even-tempered, easy to talk to, quick to see the humourous side and well-liked by all he knew: a man who inspired loyalty.

A teetotaller, he politely accepted bottles of scotch and rye as gifts without comment over the years and on his death a large and rare whisky collection was found in his basement. He enjoyed playing bridge and spending weekends at a hobby farm he kept in Langley, B.C. where he recorded grain purchases, visitor's names and other eveyday details in a faithfully kept farm journal.

Although he could have afforded almost any personal luxury, he was not extravagant. He did not see the need for a swimming pool at his home and chose to nurse an old Cadillac he called Bessie over driving the latest new model.


Above all else, he was an intensely private man with a deep, underlying sense of the importance of the moral and spiritual, a conviction he rarely tried to put to words. He disliked being in the limelight, abhorred publicity about himself and was embarassed by the use of his name in conjunction with his gifts.

Whitford Julian VanDusen had no time for personal monuments, preferring instead to quietly make a monumental contribution to his fellow humankind. The purity and simplicity of his conviction is reflected in the words of unknown origin he chose to appear on the flyleaf of an early annual report for Vancouver Foundation:

I am only one
But I am someone,
I cannot do everything,
But I can do something.
What I can do, I ought to do,
What I ought to do,
By the grace of God,
I will do.



Born in Tara, Ontario on January 18, 1889, W.J. VanDusen graduated in forestry from the University of Toronto in 1912. He married Alma Blanche Heal shortly afterwards, with whom he had one daughter. In 1919 he joined the company that became MacMillan Bloedel and was active on the Board of that company until 1969. VanDusen founded Vancouver Foundation in 1943, serving as Chairman until 1977. He died December 15, 1978, one month short of his ninetieth birthday.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 1992

1. CONSOLIDATED AND OTHER TRUST FUNDS

The Consolidated Trust Fund comprises those assets over which the Foundation exercises discretionary investment control within guidelines established by the Board of Directors. The Other Trust Funds comprise those assets which are administered in accordance with specific directions from the donors and/or which do not qualify under the Insurance Companies' Act as consolidated trust fund investments.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies used by Vancouver Foundation are stated here to assist in understanding the Foundation's financial statements.

BEQUESTS AND GRANTS

Bequests are recorded upon receipt of the donated assets. Bequests in a form other than cash or marketable securities are recorded at values assigned by the Board of Directors. Grants are recorded when paid by the Foundation.

INVESTMENTS

Investments within the Consolidated Trust Fund are valued at current market prices on the last business day of the fiscal period. Unrealized gains or losses arising as a result of the revaluation of investments to current market prices as well as any realized gains or losses arising from investment transactions are reflected as capital surplus. Investments within the Other Trust Funds are stated at cost and any realized gains or losses arising from investment transactions are included as part of contributed principal.

DEFERRED REVENUE

Proceeds received on the sale of covered call options are deferred until the earlier of the date exercised or the expiry date.

OFFICE EQUIPMENT AND LEASEHOLD IMPROVEMENTS The cost of office equipment and leasehold improvements are recorded and expensed when incurred.

INVESTMENT INCOME

Interest income on bonds, mortgages and short-term notes is accrued as earned. Dividends which have been declared are recorded as income on the date of record set for the dividend.

ADMINISTRATION EXPENSES

Administration expenses and trust company fees are recorded on an accrual basis.

3. RESTRICTIONS ON PRINCIPAL AND INCOME

Similar to most foundations, substantially all of the contributed principal and capital surplus of the Vancouver Foundation and the income from contributed principal is restricted as to payment.

4. REFUND OF LEGAL FEES

During 1991, Vancouver Foundation won a court case which resulted in the refund of legal fees paid in the years 1988 through 1990.

5. COMMITMENTS

Vancouver Foundation has firm grant commitments totalling \$5,016,557 which will be paid out of distributable income as follows:

Selected applications which have been recommended by Vancouver Foundation's Advisory Committees and approved by its Distribution Committee are recommended to the Directors of the W.J. VanDusen Foundation for funding.

Originally established in 1968, B.C. Medical Services Foundation provides funding for the advancement of medical research through project grants, as well as scholarships, bursaries and loans to health sciences students.

The funds of B.C. Medical Services Foundation, combined with the health-related funds available through Vancouver Foundation and those of the W.J. VanDusen Foundation, total approximately \$1 million and are annually directed toward three specific areas of study: applied clinical research; health care research; and educational projects that are keeping with the Foundation's objectives.

THE GRANT APPLICATION PROCESS

Q: HOW DOES A CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION APPLY TO OBTAIN FUNDING FROM VANCOUVER FOUNDATION?

The Program Directors, who are responsible for our granting programs, would be happy to talk with you about your project ideas in the early stages of their evolution. We would not want you going to a great deal of effort in anticipation of applying to Vancouver Foundation if, in fact, the necessary qualifying elements are not in place.

STEP 1

Telephone or write to us and request a copy of our funding Guidelines. If you tell us which area you think your project fits, (either Child & Family, Youth, Arts & Culture, Education, Environment or Health & Welfare), we will also send the Goals and Objectives of the appropriate Committee.

STEP 2

Send an outline project proposal (you may wish to call first to check the idea out). The outline, without great elaboration, should explain the need, the project, the timeline, the cost, funding support from other sources, and how much assistance you hope Vancouver Foundation might provide.

STEP 3

The Program Director will review the outline proposal. They will look to see that your organization is a registered charity, assess the need for and viability of the project, determine that there is financial support from the community, as well as other sources, and that it can be sustained over the longer term. Once they have decided that the idea is sound and that it meets our funding criteria you will then be sent an application form. This stage in the process can take 4 to 6 weeks.

STEP 4

The Foundation has three funding cycles a year, each with a deadline for the receipt of application forms. The properly completed form, together with any other required materials, must be received by this date.

STEP 5

The application will be thoroughly assessed by a Program Director who will want to talk with you, in detail, about the project and may visit your program site. You can expect that contact will be made with other funding agencies you have applied to as well as people involved in your field.


STEP 6

Each of Vancouver Foundation's six areas of interest is served by an Advisory Committee made up of informed and expert individuals. They carefully consider each application, listen to the Program Director's report, and then decide whether a grant should be awarded, and, if so, for how much. Their recommendation is then reviewed by the Distribution Committee (made up of those members of the Board of Directors who also chair the Advisory Committees) which is responsible for approving all grants.

STEP 7

A letter is sent to the applicant advising of the outcome and setting out the terms and conditions of any grant that has been awarded.

The time from receipt of an application until a decision is announced is about 12 weeks. However, since Step 2 (the outline project proposal) may take 4 to 6 weeks, you should allow a total of at least 18 weeks.
