Mission

Through the growth and stewardship of permanent endowment funds and the distribution of income to a broad range of eligible organizations, Vancouver Foundation, in meeting community needs, provides philanthropic leadership to improve the quality of life for all British Columbians.

Values

In pursuit of this mission, Vancouver Foundation believes: > that our position within the community is both an opportunity and a responsibility to provide philanthropic leadership; > that the endowment fund is a resource to benefit the people of British Columbia and we commit to steward these funds in a responsible manner; > in open, accessible, respectful, and ethical behaviour in our conduct with all people who come in contact with the foundation; > that our policies, programs and practices should enable and encourage human growth and dignity, inclusiveness, fairness and the equality of all people; > in working as a catalyst within the charitable sector to strengthen community capacity and volunteerism and to find solutions to shared challenges; > in partnerships that seek consensus and respect the integrity and autonomy of participants; > In encouraging and nurturing innovations and managing the risks inherent in creative philanthropy.

Chairman's Message

The opening page of this annual report presents a brief description of Vancouver Foundation together with recently adopted mission and values statements. Our intent in providing this information is to make the Foundation's vision and substance more tangible to those who participate in and are affected by its work. Although the wording and the context in which these statements appear are new, their essence is extracted from the Vancouver Foundation Act, an Act of the Provincial Legislature that established the Foundation.



The judicious management of the endowment capital entrusted by donors to the Foundation remains as ever a foremost priority. As with most funds of this type, we experienced disappointing performance in 1994, followed by encouraging total returns in 1995. To access higher total returns, we endeavour to keep a significant portion of the investments in equity markets. However, since gains from this type of investment are capitalized to the benefit of donor accounts, they are not available for distribution as income. While our capital continues to grow, the present interest rate regime is constraining the level of financial support we are currently able to offer the community.

The Board of the Foundation is active in many additional areas of governance and is also deeply interested in and committed to the process of discretionary grantmaking through our very effective Advisory Committees. After completing my first year as Chairman, I am more convinced that community foundations, individually and collectively, are uniquely positioned to play an important and expanding role in meeting some of the challenges being imposed by changing times. Vancouver Foundation, as a leader in the field of philanthropy, will as always have a key role to play in helping various communities to develop the necessary capacities to be both resourceful and resilient.

The year just past has been a busy one, with great demands placed upon all of those involved with Vancouver Foundation. With deep appreciation, I acknowledge the valuable contribution of each of the many volunteers who serve on our Advisory Committees and Board, and take this opportunity to thank in particular Risa Levine for her participation as a Director. Risa felt obliged to retire from the Board following her appointment to the B.C. Supreme Court.

The Foundation's staff are also to be commended, not only for effectively carrying out their normal duties despite the stresses of an office relocation and a new management information system, but also for rallying with force and dedication to new pressures that have been placed upon the sectors of society and communities we serve.


President's Report

Changing realities require Philanthropic Leadership from community foundations

Canadians are quickly realizing the effects of cutbacks in government spending and the impact these reductions will have on their communities. What they are also beginning to see is that the changes are broad and structural. It is not so much a prioritizing of needs and the strategic elimination of certain programs but rather horizontal cuts across many basic services.

While the drive is to erase indebtedness, the effect will be on the quality of community life in all parts of Canada. However, I believe that communities can rise to and surmount these challenges and in the process be stronger and make the country more united.

Communities have, for the most part, the skills and human resources to manage and accommodate the structural change that is underway. They may be latent and need to be developed and marshalled but they are present. Keep in mind the spirit of voluntarism and the resourcefulness of communities before government took on the broad responsibilities they have today. I am confident in the abilities to be found locally and trust in the wisdom of communities to sensibly direct their efforts toward realistic goals.

Re-writing the social contract will require the active and unselfish cooperation of the government, corporate and not-for-profit sectors. This interdependence is starting to become evident. The Federal government, in it's latest budget, made changes within the tax regime that will increase charitable donations. Corporations are recognizing and accepting greater responsibilities for civic participation in the communities from which their profits are generated. The not-for-profit sector, anticipating the financial support of its partners, is steadying itself for the task that it must take on.

The philanthropic sector, including community foundations like Vancouver Foundation as well as family and corporate foundations is also working more purposefully. Each foundation in its own way and often in concert with others, is providing the financial resources to community groups to build community resilience and self-reliance. To do this well, as the title of this Annual Report suggests, requires "more than money". It takes trust, intelligence and sensible leadership. Within Vancouver Foundation the considerations for making grants are fairly straight forward. Is there a demonstrated need? Has the necessary planning been done and are the required skills available? Is the project feasible and financially realistic? Can there be a long-term sustainable benefit? And, most importantly, is the community solidly behind the initiative?

But, the staff of Vancouver Foundation together with the Advisory Committees do so much more than simply assess grant applications. They are in touch with the shifting needs of communities. They help develop ideas. Sometimes they will identify critical gaps and bring together those organizations best able to respond. They will always encourage and work with the enthusiasm and expertise that is present in every community to make things happen - it's called "Philanthropic Leadership". The many grants we make in response to applications from community groups form the bedrock of what we do. But the "value added" component - the initiatives that we've helped introduce and support are key to the work of the Foundation. For example:

- > Developing an appreciation for the arts among school children is important but unfortunately, has not commanded a high priority in educational funding. Therefore the Arts in Education program (see page 9) started by Vancouver Foundation in cooperation with the Provincial Government and School Districts across British Columbia has become crucial.
- > While Vancouver Foundation has been established for more than 50 years, there are more and more community foundations like us being established every year in towns and cities across Canada. The notion of a permanent endowment created by donations from local citizens to provide financial support to meet local needs is taking on tremendous momentum. The community foundations are going to be increasingly important to the ability of locals to adapt to the structural changes taking place nationally. Although not alone, Vancouver Foundation was a key player in the development of an organization called "The Community Foundations of Canada". This national body serves to build and strengthen the community foundation movement and provides a collective voice for its' membership.
- > Recognizing the impacts of government cut-backs and the need to reinforce the capacities of communities and the agencies that serve them Vancouver Foundation made representations to the House Finance Committee (which was considering proposed tax changes to the 1996 Federal Budget) and worked with "The Community Foundations of Canada" and other key players to inform and educate the policy makers. The resulting changes reflected in the proposed tax framework will be crucial to the ability of the charitable sector to embrace and meet the challenges being presented to it.
- > The profound effects of the societal changes we are facing will soon be realized in the next two years rather than the next ten. And, whether we have been able to make the necessary shifts in how we meet the needs of our society will depend on how Canadian communities share, communicate and work together.

Creating a Lasting Legacy for

It has been said that the only wealth you keep forever is the wealth which you have given away.

The fact of the matter is that the legacy of our life only lasts for about two generations. Take a minute and think about it. You probably don't have any trouble identifying the names, occupations, dates and places of birth of your parents. And there's a reasonable chance that you can recall the same information about your grandparents, or at least a part of it. But beyond this juncture of the family tree, memories often fail.

If you have the desire to preserve the memory of your family heritage in perpetuity, you may wish to consider the creation of a fund in the name of your family with Vancouver Foundation. You may choose to establish a named family fund through a testamentary provision in your Will. Alternatively, as suited to your personal charitable goals and priorities, you may decide to create a fund now so you can enjoy the satisfaction of giving in your lifetime and receive immediate tax benefits.

You also have the option of designating your family fund as an "open fund", to which contributions may be added by anyone interested in supporting the purposes of the fund and your family members, or a "closed fund" that may be supported only by you and your family members. You may choose to take active part in the decisions that surround distribution of income from your fund or to leave this responsibility with Vancouver Foundation.

And you may tailor your contribution to your own charitable interests by choosing one or a combination of the four types of funds within Vancouver Foundation:

Unrestricted Funds allow your charitable giving to have the greatest possible impact. The income from this type of fund is applied to the community's most pressing current needs and has the flexibility to respond to problems as they emerge. All grants awarded from unrestricted funds are made only after applications for funding have been considered and approved by an Advisory Committee made up of informed community representatives.

Field of Interest Funds may be established with the income to be distributed through one or more of the Foundation's fields of interest, which are represented in this annual report. Gifts of this kind give broad discretion to the Advisory Committees to select the agencies that can most effectively achieve your charitable intent.

Advised Funds create a permanent and personal vehicle for charitable giving. During your lifetime, you or your chosen advisor(s) may suggest potential charities to benefit from your fund. When you or other designated advisors no longer wish, or are unable, to make recommendations, your fund can continue its charitable giving as an Unrestricted or Field of Interest Fund.

Designated Funds direct income to one or more specific charitable organizations. Vancouver Foundation will carry out your wishes so long as the named organizations function as they did when you started the fund. If an organization ceases to exist or substantially changes its purpose, Vancouver Foundation is empowered to redirect the income from your fund for a purpose similar to the one you selected.


No matter what type of fund you select, your family fund in effect becomes a living part of your family history. And it will go on giving in your name in accordance with your stated charitable wishes for the benefit of your grandchildren's generation, and all of the generations that follow thereafter. The ability of Vancouver Foundation over the last fifty years to improve the quality of life across the province has been made possible by the desire of individuals to leave a lasting legacy for the communities which contributed to their success. To help make donors more aware of the gifting options that are available to them, the Foundation has established a volunteer Development Advisory Committee and appointed two staff members to a new planned giving team. 

PARENTING

The Indian Homemakers Association received a grant to assist in the delivery of a traditional parenting skills program aimed at helping young aboriginal mothers. The program teaches practical, healthy parenting skills and develops a sense of self-esteem and empowerment—through lessons in traditional family health systems and history. Elements of the program include early childhood development, parent/child relations and nutrition. Interwoven throughout the contemporary teachings are traditional skills such as regalia making; the understandings derived from the medicine wheel and knowledge of family history.





P.A.C.E

Prostitution Alternatives Counselling and Education Society (P.A.C.E.) received a grant from Vancouver Foundation to undertake an outreach, education and referral initiative which would assist sexually exploited individuals engaged in or at risk of entering prostitution. The two-year grant provides for a full-time advocacy worker and a part-time coordinator of services to work with street youth, schools, police, and community agencies to assist in finding alternatives and establishing preventative programs for youth at risk. The P.A.C.E. Society was founded by former prostitutes who recognized the lack of services available to persons engaged in prostitution. The organization provides critical access to housing, detox, food, clothing, emergency shelter, employment, job training and daycare and the means to help sex-trade workers find practical alternatives to the lives in which they are trapped.






SCOUTING

Scouts Canada, through the Burnaby Regional Council, received a grant to help them start the first comprehensive, multi-cultural initiative in Scouting British Columbia. The project is aimed at ensuring that Youth from all backgrounds feel welcome in Scouting and that the movement is representative of the communities it serves. The funding has enabled an Advisory Committee to be formed that is made up of representatives from ethno specific groups and multi-cultural agencies.



- 1. In order to determine if your project meets basic criteria and falls within our areas of interest, telephone or write to request a copy of our General Funding Guidelines and Advisory Committee Goals (Arts and Culture; Child and Family; Education; Environment; Health and Welfare; Youth). Note: Vancouver Foundation can only support registered charities so you must have a federal charitable tax number.
- 2. Once you have reviewed this material, prepare an outline of your proposed project. You are welcome to phone or meet with a Program Director to discuss your idea. However, the volume of requests is large and we have found that a written enquiry is most effective.
- 3. The proposal should be clear and brief (no more than 2-3 pages). It should provide the following information: > mandate of the applicant organization > needs or specific problems that the project will address > activities that the organization is proposing to undertake (plan of action) > proposed timeline > geographic scope of the project >indication of community support > projected budget including other funding sources and the amount requested from Vancouver Foundation Note: Vancouver Foundation does not provide 100% funding. We look for an investment by your own organization, contributions from the community and support from other funding sources.
- 4. The Program Director reviews your proposal to determine basic eligibility and viability. After making this preliminary assessment, the Program Director may write back for more information. If the Foundation is interested in considering the project, the Program Director invites you to submit an application. Since this pre-application process can take over a month, you are advised to send your enquiry at least four weeks before the application deadline.
- 5. Vancouver Foundation has three annual deadlines for receiving completed applications. They usually fall in early January, April and September. It takes approximately twelve weeks from the time you apply until you get the

- final decision. However, including the enquiry stage, an applicant should allow at least four months. Since the Vancouver Foundation does not provide retroactive funding, it is important to plan well in advance.
- 6. A five-page application form must be completed in full and submitted prior to the deadline. With the application, you are asked to provide specific attachments (e.g. your organization's Board of Directors and financial statements). The appropriate Advisory Committee will review only the material explicitly requested by Vancouver Foundation.
- 7. Prior to consideration by the Advisory Committee, the Program Director thoroughly assesses your application. You can expect to meet with or discuss by phone the details of your proposal with the Program Director. Occasionally, an Advisory Committee member will also contact an applicant. As part of the assessment, the Program Director routinely consults with other funders and informed people in the field.
- 8. Advisory Committees are made up of volunteers who are community leaders and respected professionals. At scheduled Advisory Committee meetings, members consider the staff report, discuss each application, and then make a funding recommendation. The Committee's funding recommendations are presented to the Distribution Committee (made up of those members of the Board of Directors who also chair the Advisory Committees). The Distribution Committee makes the final decision and approves all grants.
- 9. You receive a letter advising of the Board's decision and outlining the terms and conditions of any grant that has been awarded.
- 10. After a grant has been awarded, Vancouver Foundation expects the following: > interim and/or final reports > a possible site visit by the Program Director > approval from the Program Director prior to any substantial alterations in plan > proper fiscal management and reporting > acknowledgement of support from Vancouver Foundation.

Notes to Financial Statements December 31, 1995

1. Purpose and status
Vancouver Foundation was established in 1943 and became incorporated Vancouver Foundation was established in 1943 and became incorporate through an Act of the Provincial Legislature in 1950. The income from funds donated and bequeathed to its perpetual endowment is used to provide for charitable purposes throughout British Columbia. Through its responsible and responsive stewardship, the Foundation serves three major constituencies: its donors, the charitable sector and the community. The Foundation is registered with the Charities Division, Revenue Canada, Taxation and is classified as a public foundation. As such it is exempt from federal income taxes and can issue charitable donation receivits. donation receipts.

2. Consolidated and other trust fund: The Consolidated Trust Fund comprises those assets over which the Foundation exercises discretionary investment control within guidelines established by the Board of Directors. The Other Trust Funds comprise those assets over which the Foundation does not exercise discretionary investment control and which are administered in accordance with specific directions from the donors.

3. Accounting policies
The following accounting policies used by Vancouver Foundation
are stated below to assist in understanding the Foundation's financial statements

attatements.
BEQUESTS AND GRANTS Bequests are recorded upon receipt of the donated assets. Bequests in a form other than cash or marketable securities are recorded at values assigned by the Board of Directors. Grants are recorded when paid by the Foundation. INVESTMENTS Investments within the Consolidated Trust Fund are valued at current market prices on the last business day of the fiscal period. Unrealized gains or losses arising as a result of the revaluation of investments to current market prices as well as any realized gains or losses arising from investment transactions are reflected as capital surplus. Investments within the Other Trust Funds are stated at cost and any realized gains or losses arising from investment transactions are included as part of contributed principal.
FIXED ASSETS Commencing in 1995, Vancouver Foundation capitalizes the cost of major capital additions and amortizes the cost of these assets over their estimated useful lives as follows:

Computer and office equipment 5 years straight line

Computer and office equipment Office furniture Leasehold improvements 5 years straight line 10 years straight line straight line over the term of the lease (10 years)

Prior to 1995, the cost of fixed asset additions was expensed when incurred. This change in accounting for fixed assets has not been adjusted on a retroactive basis as the impact of doing so would not

adjusted on a retroactive basis in a state of the material.

INVESTMENT INCOME Interest income on bonds, mortgages and short-term notes is accrued as earned. Dividends which have been declared are recorded as income on the date of record set

for the dividend.

ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES Administrative expenses and trust company fees are recorded on an accrual basis.

4. Restrictions on principal and income
Substantially all of the contributed principal and capital surplus of the
Vancouver Foundation and the income from contributed principal is restricted as to payment.

5. Transfer from W.J. Van Dusen Foundation During 1994, the W.J. Van Dusen Foundation transferred all of its capital assets to the Vancouver Foundation. This transaction was effective February 28, 1994, with a total market value of \$43 million (cost \$38.1

million) being transferred. The W.J. VanDusen Foundation has been maintained as a non-operating entity incorporated under the Society Act of Alberta. Two of its Directors are officers of the Vancouver Foundation and the third Director is a Director of the Vancouver Foundation.

(1994-\$658,300). This artwork was bequested to the Foundation in
1990 and 1992. No amount has been recorded in the financial
statements for this artwork. The Foundation's intention is to sell these
paintings once market conditions are strong enough to maximize
proceeds on disposition. Once disposed of, the amount received will
be recorded as an investment in the Consolidated Trust Fund.
