THE FOUNDATION Formed in 1943, Vancouver Foundation has grown to become the steward of some 630 endowment funds established by individuals, businesses and not-for-profit agencies. Vancouver Foundation is governed by a volunteer Board of community representatives, and benefits directly from the informed counsel of more than 85 additional volunteers serving on its Advisory Committees. Income derived from the investment of the pooled capital of Vancouver Foundation's endowments is distributed to support the activities of charitable organizations across British Columbia.

MISSION Through the growth and stewardship of permanent endowment funds and the distribution of income to a broad range of eligible organizations, Vancouver Foundation, in meeting community needs, provides philanthropic leadership to improve the quality of life for all British Columbians.

VALUES In pursuit of this mission, Vancouver Foundation believes:  $\sim$  that our position within the community is both an opportunity and a responsibility to provide philanthropic leadership;  $\sim$  that the endowment fund is a resource to benefit the people of British Columbia and we commit to steward these funds in a responsible manner;  $\sim$  in open, accessible, respectful, and ethical behaviour in our conduct with all people who come in contact with the foundation;  $\sim$  that our policies, programs and practices should enable and encourage human growth and dignity, inclusiveness, fairness and the equality of all people;  $\sim$  in working as a catalyst within the charitable sector to strengthen community capacity and volunteerism and to find solutions to shared challenges;  $\sim$  in partnerships that seek consensus and respect the integrity and autonomy of participants;  $\sim$  in encouraging and nurturing innovations and managing the risks inherent in creative philanthropy.

In the investment sector, interest and inflation rates remained at the low end, while national and international equity markets continued to deliver higher returns. These conditions required that we continue to actively review and adjust our investment portfolio to improve total returns.


In our grant making activities, we faced other pressures created by reduced government funding and increasing demand for services. In response, our grant making emphasized innovative ways of adding to the value of our discretionary grants, the area in which we invest in human capital.

To enhance our ability to make advances in both areas, the Board has approved a proposal for changes to the Vancouver Foundation Act in the current sitting of the legislature. These changes will permit a

more appropriate spending policy while requiring a higher level of diligence to preserve financial capital.

As ever, our capacity to fulfill our mission remains supported by the hard work of our small, dedicated staff and the wise counsel of our volunteer advisors and board members.

# REPORT FROM THE PRESIDENT AND CEO

In this annual report we celebrate the common wealth of community and the opportunity that exists for each of us to contribute to a better quality of life in British Columbia. Although the report focuses on Vancouver Foundation's role, we have endeavored to demonstrate the vitality of the community we serve. The unique assets that are present within the public, private and voluntary sectors provide an essential platform for our work.

In 1997, to determine how we may best build on this platform to address the current and future needs of BC's not-for-profit sector, we undertook a major research project which we named the Social Reconnaissance Project. Continuing cutbacks in government funding and the accelerated rate at which community needs are growing have left the sector deeply stressed. And while we appear to be a large organization, our operational resources are limited. Our goal, therefore,

was to ascertain where we could strategically make the greatest impact in helping to respond effectively.

Over a period of seven months we spoke with 221 not-for-profit organizations across BC, individually and in focus groups, about their needs, capacities and resources.

We also spoke with 68 government and non-government funders and other knowledgeable informants throughout

North America and Europe. In analyzing the project's findings, we discovered that by far the most significant of needs related to the strengthening of capacities, within BC's communities as well as in the not-for-profit agencies that serve them.

Our decision to focus on capacity-building took into account our mission, our values and our position as the largest community foundation in Canada. Working in cooperation with the national organization, Community Foundations of Canada, Vancouver Foundation is ideally situated to help build capacity within BC's community foundations, both in terms of the

endowment capital that is raised and the ability of the community foundation to respond to community needs. By helping to build strong community foundations in BC, we can help strengthen our communities.

We also considered our many years of experience in helping communities and not-for-profit organizations build on their existing strengths through collaboration.

Vancouver Foundation has both initiated and supported many programs that unite government, the corporate sector and the not-for-profit sector in responding to community needs.


One of these, Partners in Organizational
Development, provides small grants to
not-for-profit organizations throughout BC
for specific developmental needs. Another,
the Vancouver Arts Stabilization Team,
equips arts organizations with the resources
to strengthen organizational effectiveness,
erase long-term debt and increase liquidity.
Recently, we launched Youth in Philanthropy,
a province-wide program that is creating
opportunities for young people to gain

leadership skills while fueling the development of community foundations.

We also recently organized a symposium called Vancouver's Tomorrow as a vehicle to engage concerned leaders in the public, private and voluntary sectors in collaboratively enhancing the health and well-being of the community. Jointly sponsored with the Canadian Centre for Philanthropy, this event provided a forum for the three sectors to discuss changes in their roles and responsibilities and begin to set collective priorities.

We will continue to direct our resources towards building community capacities through supporting projects like these. But if we are to fund vital programs that build on the existing assets of our communities and our not-for-profit organizations, we require increased discretionary income. By giving Vancouver Foundation discretion in the distribution of income from their endowments, our donors can significantly enhance the value of their investment in the common wealth of our community.

Equally important is the vast, untapped human wealth in BC's communities. Each of us has so very much more to give than money. I encourage you to be generous in making a personal investment in your community through volunteering your time and energy. The dividends are outstanding.






RETURNS AND DISTRIBUTIONS Total returns from investments show a 5-year rolling average of 12.39%. After deducting the costs of administration and fund management (approximately 0.5% of market value per annum), the balance is divided between retained returns (capital gain) and income available for grants and distributions (interest and dividends) which have been directly affected by declining interest rates.



CAPITAL GROWTH AND PRESERVATION Vancouver Foundation's capital over the last 54 years has grown to more than \$515 million. This growth is the result of contributions of \$332 million from our donors and the balance is from capital gains from investments.



# PLANNED GIVING VANCOUVER FOUNDATION

#### WHY GIVE DISCRETION?

We welcome all gifts from donors. However, it is discretionary funds that best enable us to respond to the acute needs of the community.

#### Flexibility Gives Your Charitable Gift Greater Impact

For more than half a century Vancouver Foundation has served British Columbia by offering its citizens the opportunity to create permanent charitable endowment funds. During this time 630 funds have been established by individuals, corporations, not-for-profit agencies and other organizations.

The income that is generated through the investment of these funds is returned to the community according to each fundholder's instructions. While not-for-profit agencies typically establish funds for their own benefit, with income directed back to their organization, other fundholders have a wide range of options. At one end of the spectrum, they may name the specific charitable organization or organizations that will benefit from their fund's income. At the other, they may choose to give the Foundation broad discretion in distributing income. Donors may also opt to allocate a portion of the income from their fund for discretionary purposes and advise us on how they wish the balance to be distributed.

Where discretion is given, the Foundation's Board, working in tandem with our many community advisors, is able to direct endowment income to the areas of greatest need. Rather than being "locked in" for community needs that may ultimately become obsolete, funds can be used to address new problems as they emerge. This increased flexibility allows us to serve our donors and the community as a whole to the fullest extent possible.

#### "Value Added" Approach Overcomes Roadblocks to Giving

Today, as never before, donors are anxious to ensure their charitable gift will make a difference. Those who choose to support specific agencies are often involved with the organization and know their contributions are well-placed. Others must contend with mixed messages — incentives to give are often countered by signals to hesitate.

The 1996 and 1997 Federal budgets contained a number of income tax incentives to encourage charitable giving by individuals and corporations in Canada. In addition to increasing the allowable limit for charitable gifts, the government has introduced significant incentives for gifts of appreciated properties, especially publicly-listed securities.

Contradicting these positive measures is the current wide-spread public concern that not all charities are being operated as they should be. The accountability and governance of Canada's charitable

organizations are currently the subjects of a panel of community leaders sponsored by the national Voluntary Sector Roundtable.

For donors who wish to ensure that their contributions will directly respond to current and future community needs,

Vancouver Foundation's "value-added" approach to grant making offers peace of mind.

Discretionary funds are distributed in response to grant applications in seven fields of interest: arts and culture; child and family; education; environment; health and welfare; youth; and medical services. All applications are rigorously evaluated by the Foundation's programming staff for sustainability and financial viability before being carefully considered by an Advisory Committee made up of community representatives who are widely experienced in the field. A steady rotation of members ensures the committees retain a fresh outlook and broad perspective.

By taking a proactive role in determining and responding to community needs, Vancouver Foundation brings real value to the granting process. What's more, in channeling donors' discretionary funds to the community's most pressing needs, we are often able to attract substantial "levered" support from other funding sources.

# Gifting Options Can Be Tailored to Your Present and Future Philanthropic Objectives

In planning your charitable giving, it is important to consider

your own interests, priorities and objectives, the time frame within which your gift will be available, and the degree to which you want to be involved in putting it to work.

Depending on your personal situation, you may wish to consider setting up a fund in your own name giving either complete or partial discretion to the Foundation or specifying a broad area of interest coinciding with any of the fields of interest represented by our advisory committees. Some donors choose to advise us on the distribution of income from their fund during their lifetime, with discretion reverting to Vancouver Foundation on their death.

Recognition for discretionary grants is attributed to the donor and their fund, in keeping with the fundholder's wishes.

Donors who would like to support the Foundation's work on a discretionary basis but do not wish to establish a fund may contribute to our Community Fund or to one of our field of interest Anniversary Funds, as listed on page 33.

# NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 1997 AND 1996

#### I.Purpose and status

Vancouver Foundation (the "Foundation") was established in 1943 and became incorporated through an Act of the Provincial Legislature in 1950.

The income from funds donated and bequeathed to its endowment is used to provide for charitable purposes throughout British Columbia. The Foundation serves three major constituencies: its donors, the charitable sector and the community.

The Foundation is registered with the Charities Division, Revenue Canada, Taxation and is classified as a public foundation. As such it is exempt from federal income taxes and can issue charitable donation receipts.

#### 2.Consolidated and Other Trust Funds

The Consolidated Trust Fund comprises those assets over which the Foundation exercises discretionary investment control within guidelines established by the Board of Directors. The Other Trust Funds comprise those assets over which the Foundation does not exercise discretionary investment control and which are administered in accordance with specific directions from the donors.

#### 3.Accounting policies

The following accounting policies used by the Foundation are stated below to assist in understanding the financial statements.

#### Bequests and grants

Bequests are recorded upon receipt of the donated assets. Bequests in a form other than cash or marketable securities are recorded at values determined by the Board of Directors. Grants are recorded when paid by the Foundation.

#### Investments

Investments within the Consolidated Trust Fund are valued at current market prices on the last business day of the fiscal period. Unrealized gains or losses arising from the revaluation of investments to current market prices, as well as any realized gains or losses arising from investment transactions, are reflected as retained returns from investments. Investments within the Other Trust Funds are stated at cost and any realized gains or losses arising from investment transactions are included as part of contributed principal. Investments are held by CIBC Mellon Global Securities Services Company, which acts as custodian on behalf of the Foundation.

#### Fixed assets

The Foundation capitalizes the cost of major capital additions and amortizes the cost of these assets over their estimated useful lives. Lease inducements received in conjunction

with the Foundation's lease are offset against the cost of leasehold improvements. Management has determined the estimated useful lives to be:

#### Investment income

Interest income on bonds, mortgages and short-term notes is accrued as earned. Dividends which have been declared are recorded as income on the date of record set for the dividend.

#### Operating expenses

Administration expenses, program expenses and investment management and custodial fees are recorded using the accrual basis.

#### 4.Investments

#### Consolidated Trust Fund

The bonds and debentures in the Consolidated Trust Fund are represented by Canadian fixed interest bonds and debentures, with a weighted average term to maturity of 8.8 years.

#### 6.Artwork

During 1997, the Foundation disposed of artwork, which was bequeathed to the Foundation in 1990 and 1992, for \$519,675 (U.S. \$375,000). The proceeds have been reinvested and recorded as an investment in the Consolidated Trust Fund.

#### 7.Commitments

The Foundation has firm grant commitments totalling \$8,553,041 (1996 - \$7,189,659). These include grants which will be paid out of fund returns pending distribution as follows:

Contributions to dosed funds may only be made by the fundholder, by their family members or through in memoriam gifts.

# DISCRETIONARY FUNDS

When the donor or their designated advisor(s) no longer wish, or are unable, to make recommendations, the fund can continue its charitable giving as an Unrestricted or Field of Interest Fund.

# APPLYING FOR A GRANT VANCOUVER FOUNDATION

#### CRITERIA

To determine whether your project meets Vancouver Foundation's basic criteria, we encourage you to contact our office for written funding guidelines and Advisory Committee goals in the appropriate field of interest. Note that Vancouver Foundation is only able to support registered charities, so you must have a federal charitable tax number/business number.

We ask that all grant applicants submit an initial letter of enquiry outlining your project in less than four pages. The letter should:

- > introduce your organization and its mandate;
- > state the issues or community priorities the project will address;
- > describe activities to be undertaken and time frame;
- > detail the geographic scope of the project;
- > demonstrate community support for the project;
- > provide a proposed budget, including funding from Vancouver Foundation and other sources.

Keep in mind that Vancouver Foundation does not provide 100 percent funding. We look for an investment by your own organization, contributions from the community and support from other funders. Your proposal will be reviewed by one of the Foundation's Program Directors to determine basic eligibility and you may be contacted for further information. If the Foundation is interested in considering the project, you will be invited to submit a formal application by a specific deadline. The Program Director will provide a five-page application form with detailed instructions for completion.

Prior to consideration by the appropriate Advisory Committee, your application will be thoroughly assessed by the Program Director. You can expect to meet with them or discuss the details of your proposal by phone. As part of the assessment, the Program Director routinely consults with other funders and informed people in the field.

The Advisory Committee will then consider your application and make a recommendation to the Foundation's Board of Directors. You will receive written notification of the Board's decision, along with the terms and conditions of any grant that has been awarded.

Vancouver Foundation has three annual deadlines for receiving completed applications, the first Friday in January, April and September. We recommend that letters of inquiry be submitted a minimum of four weeks prior to application deadlines. You can expect a final decision on your grant application within approximately twelve weeks of the deadline.
