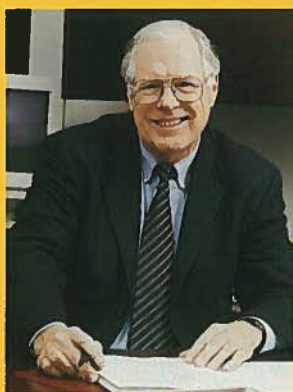
## BUILDING ON STRENGTH

It is with a strong commitment to strengthening communities across British Columbia that I report to you as the new Chair of Vancouver Foundation. Although it has only been a year since I was elected Chair, I have been aware of the scope and importance of the work of the Foundation for more than a decade, first as a member of a number of its advisory committees and later as a member of the board. From my new vantage point, I remain confident that Vancouver Foundation continues to be well placed to respond effectively to the changing social and economic realities within our province.

Vancouver Foundation has a well-deserved reputation as an organization you can trust. And in times of economic uncertainty, it is the work of the standing committees of the board—audit, investment, executive, nominations and distribution—that inspire confidence in the soundness of the organization and its policies. Over the past year, the investment committee in particular has helped Vancouver Foundation navigate through some tumultuous times.

The first nine months of 2001 saw stock markets and corporate profits fall significantly as world economies slid into recession. Skittish investor reaction to the events of September 11 only exacerbated the situation. While markets rose in the final quarter, generating a 6.9% return for the Foundation in the consolidated trust fund, the overall return for the year was -4.7%. However, this return compares favourably to world equity markets whose negative returns were often in double digits. Within the components of the consolidated trust fund, Canadian stocks added value over our benchmark and bonds were in line with the benchmark, while the global stock component underperformed. Despite the latter setbacks, our investment managers believe the fund is properly structured to achieve the Foundation's long-term objectives.

The economic downturn also meant the investment committee faced challenges in setting the Foundation's distribution rate. The committee's mandate is to set a distribution rate that provides the optimum flow of funds to the charitable sectors Vancouver Foundation supports while ensuring this rate represents a prudent portion of




the consolidated trust fund's total returns and preserves the purchasing power of the fund. To maintain the current distribution rate—5.5% of the average portfolio market value, over the previous 12 quarters—the committee recommended drawing upon part of the substantial capital gains accumulated over prior years (see graph on pg. 23). By maintaining the level and consistency of distributions in 2001, we ensured that our

fund holders' charitable objectives were met and that there was sufficient funding to help meet the challenges faced in the communities Vancouver Foundation serves.

The dedication of Vancouver Foundation's standing committees of the board was augmented by the hard work of our staff and advisory committee volunteers. Last year, our 19 staff and 120 volunteers managed 750 endowed trust funds and reviewed more than 1,000 grant applications, approving approximately 400. Equally important, they continued to work to build the capacity of communities across the province to do effective local granting. The broad representation of experience and skills on our board and advisory committees, together with the integrity and energy of our outstanding staff, make Vancouver Foundation an informed convener, collaborator and catalyst for the philanthropic sector.

## INFORMED CHOICES

Sun Tzu\* and Peter F. Drucker\*\* would probably both agree on the importance of intelligence in the long-term success of any endeavour. It permits the effective deployment of resources, the identification of gaps and opportunities for strategic partnerships, as well as the recognition of those crux points where relatively little can achieve a lot.

Vancouver Foundation's stakeholders are neither monarchs nor shareholders, they are donors and not-for-profit organizations that help build the communities we serve. For them, we strive to generate and employ intelligence to accomplish our mission which is to improve the quality of life for all British Columbians.

Over the last year the challenges created by government cutbacks and a severe economic downturn have and will continue to stretch the capacities of the charitable sector and likely sap the vitality of many communities.

The compounding horror of September 11th was inflicted far away from our part of the world. Nevertheless, it is affecting our society and altering the operating context of Vancouver Foundation. Indeed, we are already seeing accepted norms in the areas such as social justice and environment compromised. The charitable sector's ability to advocate for and deal with these challenges and our society's ability to make the right choices will demand the sharing of intelligence and the affirmation of values.

In all competent organizations, including Vancouver Foundation, governance is at the heart of the effective functioning of the Board of Directors. It is where our integrity is rooted and through which the vision of the Foundation is realized. And the first rule of good governance



is that the Directors be given the information necessary so that they may challenge proposals and make sound decisions. Vancouver Foundation's Governance and Nominations Committee is charged with overseeing and reporting to the Board on the effectiveness of our system of governance, its process and performance. In so doing, it must ensure that the information gathering and reporting mechanisms are in place and fully engaged.

Stewardship, in large part, is the protection and prudent enhancement of the Foundation's financial resources which fuel its grantmaking programs. Effective stewardship requires intelligence gathered from a variety of perspectives to arrive at the right balance for long-term sustainability and growth. Vancouver Foundation, through its Investment Committee, employs the services of five different money managers as well as outside investment counsel which report quarterly to inform the Committee's investment decisions and distribution policy.

Adaptability and an orientation toward service are crucial concentrations for the Foundation's efforts in meeting the needs of its donors. The philanthropic context is shifting, in positive ways, and we are responding with a range of gifting vehicles and a greater ability to accommodate donors who wish to be more informed and engaged in their grantmaking. As a consequence Vancouver Foundation is today able to accept retractable and flow through funds as well as permanent endowments. In addition, there is the option of having capital placed in a socially responsible investment fund.

Increasingly donors wish to receive information about trends and granting opportunities within their areas of interest. One result is that Vancouver Foundation has assigned staff dedicated to respond to this desire for engagement—gathering data, organizing briefings on issues of common interest to donors as well as arranging visits to those agencies donors may wish to support. The goal is to help fundholders expand their philanthropic horizons and achieve their charitable objectives.

Granting programs represent the front line of our work. They form the point at which our donor's wishes are fulfilled, the services of not-for-profits strengthened and community self-sufficiency enhanced. Sixty years of successful grantmaking with some \$443 million distributed for charitable endeavours across British Columbia has taught us the importance of having an informed perspective. We have also learned that identifying opportunities for encouraging and nurturing innovation and finding the leverage points for real progress means managing the risk inherent in creative philanthropy.

Each of the Foundation's fields-of-interest Advisory Committees is made up of people who are informed and expert. Through them and the province-wide network of community foundations we are kept aware of grassroots challenges and opportunities. While this intelligence helps us to be purposeful, it is the evaluation of our grantmaking that keeps us open to the need for continuous improvement. Two recent evaluations on the sustainability of projects funded and the success rate for achieving intended outcomes reinforce the value of what we do. At the same time the results of these studies push us to come up with those indicators of community impacts that will guide our efforts to improve the quality of life in the province. The input of our volunteer committees and the gauge provided by evaluations are key. However, the demonstrated value of the Foundation's historical trust in and responsiveness to the local community's ability to identify and overcome challenges is fundamental.

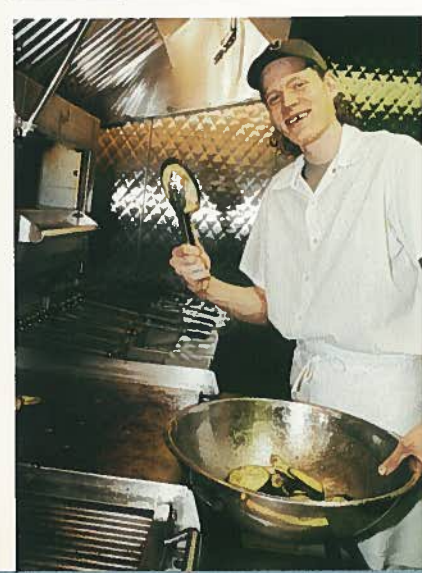
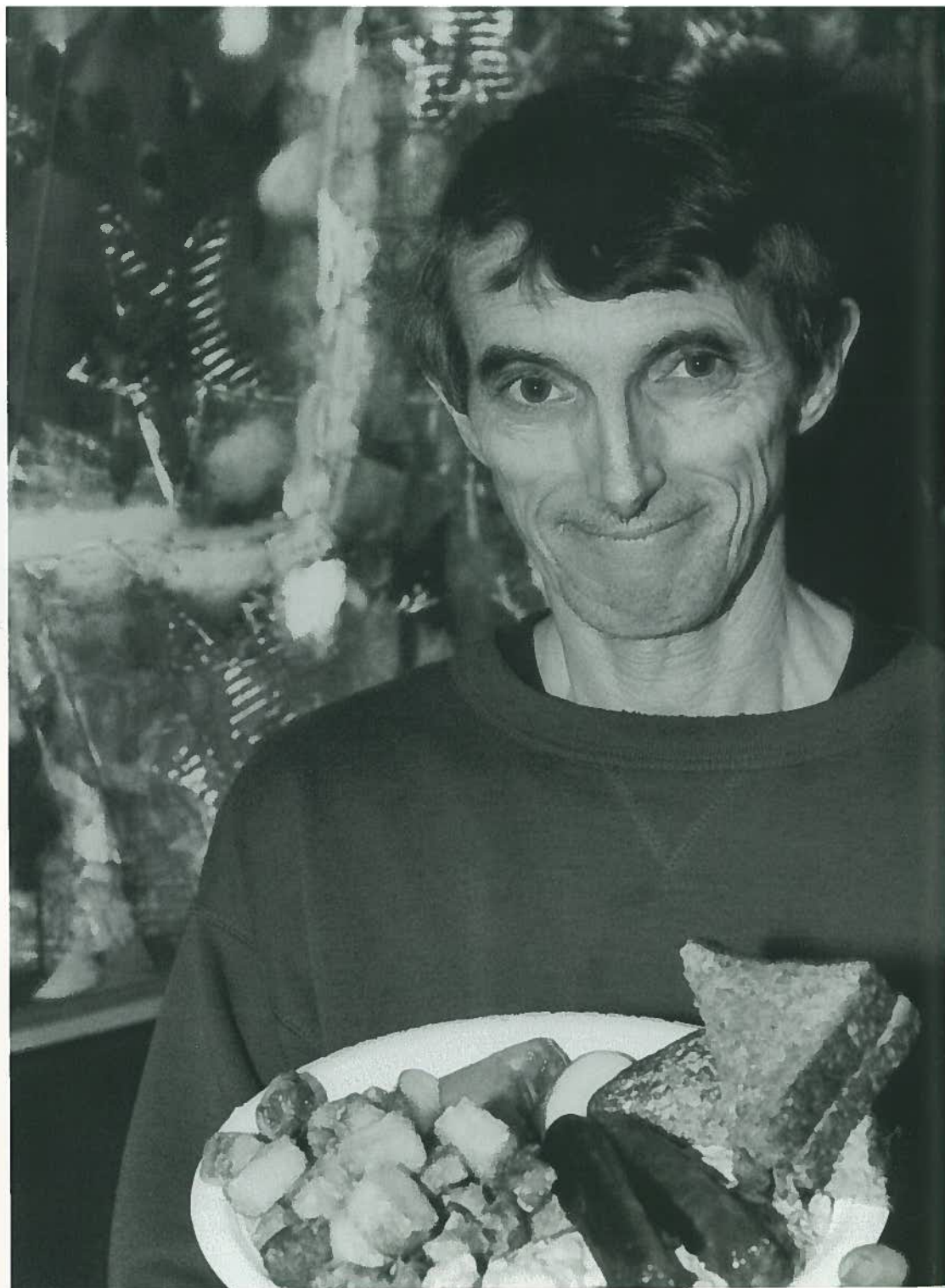
Sensible forward thinking and the development of sound strategies are in very large part based on intelligence gained in the field. Also required is a willingness to listen to good counsel and an openness to change.

# Strengthening COMMUNITY CAPACITY

THE POTLUCK CAFÉ PROVIDES FOOD, TRAINING  
AND NEW HOPE FOR THOSE LIVING  
IN VANCOUVER'S DOWNTOWN EASTSIDE.

When Luc Paradis first started working as a cook at the Potluck Café, it took him 45 minutes just to peel and chop a clove of garlic. Today he can prepare a breakfast of fried eggs, hash browns, pancakes and bacon for up to 30 people in under an hour.

Two years ago, Paradis was one of countless young men struggling to survive on the streets of Vancouver's Downtown Eastside.

With drugs, alcohol and crime all around him, Paradis says he was "extremely anti-social and basically up to no good."

But then he heard about an opening as a cook at the Potluck Café, which serves three meals a day to low-income residents of the Portland Hotel on East Hastings, and decided it was time for a change. Although he had no previous cooking experience, he got the job and quickly learned the skills necessary to run a large restaurant kitchen. But more important, he learned how to enjoy life again. "This job literally saved my life," said Paradis. "It has given me a routine and a reason to get up in the morning."

Wendy Pedersen, manager of the Potluck Café, says helping people like Paradis get back on their feet is one of the main goals of the restaurant. "When people who have troubled backgrounds—whether with addictions, abuse or the law—are given a job and the chance to prove themselves, it really boosts their self esteem," said Pedersen. "Once you build into their lives the structure that employment provides, it gives them that little extra edge of control that they can use to make positive choices."

Located in the basement of the Portland Hotel, the Potluck Café employs 11 residents of the Downtown Eastside, providing them with basic restaurant training, from food preparation to cooking and serving. In addition to making free breakfast, lunch and dinner for hotel residents, staff deliver deli sandwiches to local bars so the patrons have something to eat at least once day.

"A lot of people down here don't have enough money to eat properly, if at all," said Pedersen. "And if they do, food is not always the first choice for where their money will go. We work with the Portland Hotel to try to stabilize their lives through housing and regular meals."

Despite the program's success, its government funding runs out at the end of May, meaning the Café will have to become economically self-sufficient to stay open. So last fall, Pedersen and her staff decided to start a banquet and catering business and use the profits to support the training and free meals programs. With support from Vancouver Foundation, she hired a professional executive chef, developed a detailed business plan and began catering events on a trial basis just before Christmas. This spring she plans to buy new catering equipment, including a specially-designed delivery bike, and open the Café to the public.

The project is just one of several given grants by Vancouver Foundation as part of the Downtown Eastside's "community directions" initiative, which builds on the energy and dynamism of people living in the neighbourhood. Developed in consultation with numerous non-profit organizations, community directions outlines a set of principles—such as inclusiveness, community participation and respect for diversity of opinion—to guide the development and implementation of projects that respond to community needs in the Downtown Eastside.

Paradis hopes the Potluck Café can make a go of it—for his sake and for those he cooks for. "I like working here," he said. "I get to feed people who normally don't get fed. It helps give me a more positive attitude towards life."

## Animal Welfare

**PURPOSE:** To support the provision of initiatives and programs that contribute to the welfare of animals in BC.



# Protecting ANIMALS

## THE BC SPCA'S NEW CERTIFICATION AND LABELING PROGRAM WILL HELP PROTECT ANIMAL WELFARE ON FARMS ACROSS THE PROVINCE.

Egg laying hens on commercial farms spend nearly all their lives cooped up in battery cages not much larger than a bread-box. Stacked row upon row, the wire-mesh cages contain up to five hens each, leaving little room for nesting, pecking or even moving around. Conditions are so cramped in some cages that the birds can't properly stretch their wings or stand upright near the back of the cage where the floor slopes to catch the laid eggs.



"When you put animals in such confined situations, they can't express their normal behaviour," said Alyssa Bell-Stoneman, Farm Animal Program coordinator with the BC SPCA. "They get very distressed and certain diseases are spread more easily. For some perspective, try to imagine being bed-ridden with a few other people for over a year."

Determined to help improve the living conditions for egg-laying hens as well as broiler chickens, pigs and dairy cows on farms throughout the province, the BC SPCA began to develop a certification and labeling program in 1999 with a grant from Vancouver Foundation. Based on the organic foods model and the British RSPCA's "Freedom Foods" program, the program will place "SPCA Certified" labels on farm products brought to market in accordance with enhanced animal welfare standards.

To develop humane and economically viable standards for animal housing, feeding, handling and transportation, the SPCA set up "species advisory committees" made up of government specialists, animal welfare scientists, SPCA staff and other agri-business representatives. They also conducted consumer surveys to gauge public willingness to pay more for certified farm products and met with farmers throughout the province to explain the program and encourage them to join.

"This program will simultaneously raise the welfare of farm animals and provide a business opportunity for local farmers to distribute their products to a

lucrative niche market," said Craig Naherniak, director of education for the BC SPCA. "It's a win for animals, a win for local farmers and a win for consumers."

This spring, the BC SPCA will launch the program with two egg farms and one broiler chicken farm. The eggs and chickens will be sold at Capers stores in the Lower Mainland and Victoria.

Brad Reid owns and operates a five-acre broiler chicken farm in Langley that will participate in the pilot program. Growing up on a farm in Saskatchewan, he says he was taught early about the importance of treating animals properly. However, he joined the program because he feels the trend towards industrial farming is not only bad for the animals, but bad for business. "In the short term, it will make a lot of people money," he said. "But in the long run, putting more birds in smaller spaces encourages the spread of disease and the use of chemicals and antibiotics to deal with disease, which ultimately hurts the quality of the product."

According to Dr. David Fraser, a professor in the UBC faculty of agricultural sciences and a member of Vancouver Foundation's animal welfare advisory committee, the SPCA program is part of a recent worldwide trend to develop niche market programs that assure customers of the animal welfare standards used by the producer. Sensing a shift in public opinion, large restaurant chains like McDonald's and Burger King have also started working with national food production associations to develop more stringent animal welfare standards.

"It's an astonishing development," said Dr. Fraser, who has been invited to work with Burger King to create humane treatment standards for the animals used by its restaurant chain. "I've been involved with animal welfare issues since 1971, and I've seen more change in the last few years than the previous quarter century."

# Empowering YOUTH

AN INNOVATIVE PROGRAM GIVES  
TEENAGED GIRLS A WHOLE NEW OUTLOOK  
ON THE SUMMER—AND PERHAPS LIFE.

These days, growing up is more complicated than ever. Some would say it is especially difficult if you're a young woman.

Issues of self-esteem, body image, sexuality and substance abuse confront girls head-on at an increasingly early age.

Unfortunately, few settings exist where teenaged girls can explore these issues freely and with the support of a non-judgmental adult.



Power Camp Vancouver was founded to give girls such a setting. What began as an after-school workshop in high schools is now a two-week summer day-camp program geared toward girls in their early teens. Camp founders Christina James and Stephanie Glube are recent university graduates. Their youth helps them connect with the girls, yet they have the maturity to ensure a safe, constructive environment. The two got the idea from the original Power Camp that began in Ottawa.

In their early teens, most of the "campers" felt too old for traditional day camps and were looking for something different. "It's made a big difference for some of the girls because they get to try new things that they might not do at school or home," said James. "We're also creating a safe space where people can talk about their experiences or tell stories about the things that have happened to them. A major part of the program is peer mentorship. If given the opportunity, the girls can learn a great deal from each other."

Nhuy Pham attended Power Camp last summer. Through the camp, she was encouraged to ride a bicycle for the first time. "In school, if you try something and you can't do it, the guys make fun of you," she explained.

While the program is based in community centres, program participants do activities all over the Lower Mainland. Power Camp's mandate is to make use of services that already exist in the community and make connections with other organizations. These

include everything from the Vancouver Aquarium to Big Sisters. "In some groups some very serious issues have been brought up," said James, who stresses that the girls are never judged or reprimanded for anything they say. "We've been able to acknowledge what has happened, then go away and do research on different resources in the community that they can take advantage of to help them further."

James and Glube plan all of the activities, but leave time for the girls to try things they want to do. Some of the workshops are geared to give the girls skills they can use to cope with challenges they might face today, or in the future. Topics include communicating with your parents and self-defense techniques. In the body-image workshop, the girls discussed ageism, racism and sexism. "We even made up the word 'weightism'," said Elana Scramstad, a Power Camp participant.

The grant application from Power Camp was originally approved by the Youth Philanthropy Council, but the proposal later caught the interest of Mr. and Mrs. Sawers, who decided to support the grant from the Sawers Family Fund held at Vancouver Foundation. "We wished to support Power Camp in order to help young adolescent girls face the many challenges that impact their lives at a crucial state of their development," said Mrs. Sawers. "We are pleased to have the flexibility in our fund that enables us to respond to a program such as Power Camp."

Glube and James have committed to run the program until the end of summer 2002. They're currently searching for other leadership to help expand the program. "This has been such a fundamental year of getting things started," said James. "We've gotten most of our funding for the year from Vancouver Foundation—that's been a huge help."

# Enhancing COMMUNITY RESOURCES

## BUILDING A PLAYGROUND AT THE NISGA'A ELEMENTARY/SECONDARY SCHOOL BROUGHT THE COMMUNITY OF NEW AIYANSH CLOSER TOGETHER.

The old playground at the Nisga'a Elementary/Secondary School in the remote northern community of New Aiyansh was built more than a quarter century ago. Rusted and falling apart, it did not meet national safety standards and stood as a reminder of the years of neglect suffered by the First Nations' community. Making matters worse, it was the only recreational amenity for hundreds of kilometres around, used by students, mothers and toddlers alike.

Two years ago, Ellen Torng decided it was time to build a new playground. A member of the school's parent advisory committee, she wanted her 11-year-old son and others to have better opportunities to stay active and healthy. But more than that, she wanted to build a sense of community.

"I wanted to get parents more involved in the school and demonstrate that if we work together we can accomplish good things," said Torng. "I also wanted to empower the kids to believe that they can make a positive contribution to their community."

Torng recruited eight parents to join a development committee to guide the fundraising and construction of the playground. To overcome the community's lingering mistrust of the school system, a legacy of Canada's infamous residential schools, she held meetings in parents' homes and sought group consensus for every decision. Students also got involved, helping with bake sales and fundraising door to door.

With a lead grant from Vancouver Foundation, the committee raised \$80,000 to buy the playground materials and began construction last summer. The whole community volunteered to help out. "It was such a great atmosphere," said Torng. "Everybody showed up at 8:30 a.m. even though they were volunteers. Some of the volunteers had children attending the school,

others had grandchildren. People were always dropping by to see how things were going. It was really fun."

The community marked the opening of the playground with a traditional Nisga'a ceremony, attended by regional elders, Vancouver Foundation and a number of corporate sponsors. The ceremony was presided over by members of the Nisga'a Lisims government and the playground committee, and featured traditional Nisga'a dancers and singing followed by an elaborate feast.

The new playground features two jungle gyms, two slides, two swing sets and rocking toys for young toddlers. "The park," as it's called by everyone in town, has become a community focal point, a place where parents go to meet and kids go to play.

Danny Gonu, a 13-year-old student who helped fundraise for the playground says he likes the "bigger slides and better monkey bars." "It makes me feel good to know I helped build something everyone likes," he said.

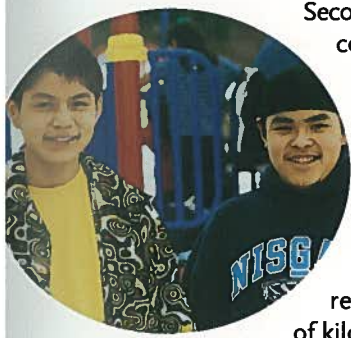
Torng says the playground has had a positive impact that extends far beyond the swing sets. "There's been noticeable difference among the kids," she said. "They have a more positive outlook and are more willing to get involved in the community. And parents are more willing to come on to the school grounds and meet with teachers. It's really helped build relationships."

But above all, Torng says she cherishes the sense of pride the playground committee got from developing a project and following it through to completion. "Some of the best volunteers I've ever worked with are in New Aiyansh. The playground would not have been possible without the committee. I had the idea, but they had the energy and resources to make it work."

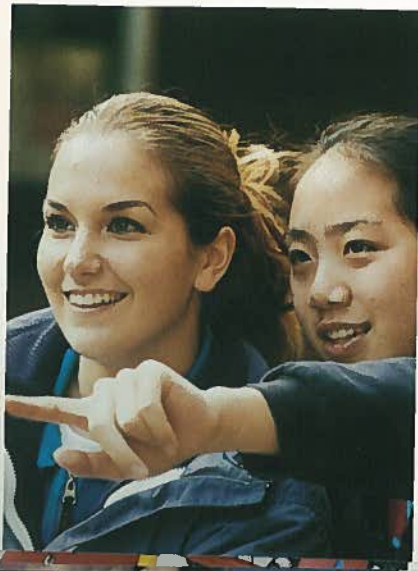
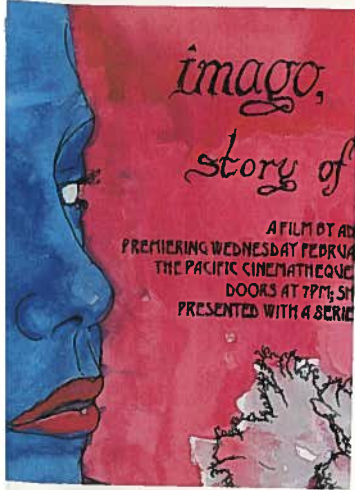

# Providing LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

## PACIFIC CINEMATHEQUE'S SIGHTS AND SOUNDS TRAVELLING VIDEO PRODUCTION PROGRAM INTRODUCES STUDENTS TO THE WORLD OF FILMMAKING.

When Adam Shamash was 12-years-old, he and his friends made low-budget horror movies. Camcorder at the ready, they would spend hours making plastic dummies and planning elaborate schemes for their destruction. Then they would film the ensuing mayhem.



"One of my friends was into pyrotechnics so there was usually an explosion of some kind," remembered Shamash with a laugh. "It was really cheesy.

We just did it for fun."

It wasn't until Grade 10, when the Sights and Sounds Travelling Video Production Program visited his school, University Hill Secondary, that Shamash began to pursue filmmaking more seriously. Through the program, Shamash was introduced to the basics of film making, from story development and scriptwriting to storyboarding, filming and editing. He learned how to operate a camera and got to work first-hand with professional filmmakers.

"I was really surprised that such a program existed for high school students," said Shamash. "It was a phenomenal opportunity for students to come together, be heard and express themselves."

Now 19-years-old, Shamash is an emerging screenwriter and director who has already made three short films. This fall he plans to study film at Concordia University in preparation for a career as an independent filmmaker.

Sights and Sounds is run by Pacific Cinematheque, a non-profit society whose mandate is to promote an understanding and examination of contemporary visual culture. Started in 1998, the program provides hands-on experience to students who want to learn more about the art of filmmaking. Professional instructors travel

with cameras, lighting and editing equipment to high schools across the province offering one-to four-week film training classes. They also work with school officials to develop the curriculum and skills necessary to create their own film production programs. Last year, with the support of Vancouver Foundation, five instructors visited 25 schools to provide film training for over 650 students.

"If you want to educate kids to live in a media culture, traditional media analysis is not enough," said Stuart Poyntz, education director of Pacific Cinematheque. "You also need to build their production skills so that they can give a voice to their creativity."

Students who have graduated from Sights and Sounds can also gain work experience credits for career development programs in their schools by mentoring younger students who are new to the program. Adding to the career development opportunities, Pacific Cinematheque has partnered with the Centre for Digital Imaging and Sound to offer 50 scholarships of \$1,000 for post-secondary courses offered by CDIS.

However, Poyntz says the main goal of the program is not to train students for film industry jobs, but to help them express themselves through the moving image. "We work with students to come up with story ideas and help them find ways to tell their stories on the screen. Although we provide them with the technical skills to do that, they are secondary to giving students a sense of what it means to be an artist creating a vision."

### A DONOR'S LEGACY ENCOURAGES TODAY'S TOP YOUNG CONTEMPORARY ARTISTS.

As the face of society evolves and changes, so does the art that reflects it. Today's young artists are choosing new media to explore the themes and philosophies of this new century. While painting and sculpture remain mainstays, everything from video and audio to C-prints and duratrans are emerging in contemporary art.



No doubt, a keen observer of this trend would have been Helen Pitt. While she was alive, Helen Pitt supported and corresponded with many young artists. Although she passed away in 1976, her legacy of supporting the arts lives on. This year marks the 40th anniversary of the Helen Pitt Fund for Fine Arts, designed to give financial support to students in fine arts. A resident of Vernon, Pitt was inspired to establish the fund after attending high school graduation ceremonies where, "watching the lads and lassies coming to the platform for their scholarships, I thought how splendid it was that there were such things. Then it struck me that there was a hole in the fabric, that in the varied number presented, there was not one for an art student."

In 1961 Pitt decided to establish a bursary fund of \$10,000 with Vancouver Foundation. The fund grew substantially until her death in 1976 when a bequest from her estate increased the fund to \$400,000. Each year, fine art students from all over the province receive bursaries and awards from the fund, and every three years an exhibit has been held to showcase the work of winners of the Graduating Year Awards.

Carie Helm coordinated the 2001 Triennial Awards Exhibition, which was held at the Kelowna Art Gallery. A recent graduate of fine arts herself, she envisioned the exhibition as an opportunity to appreciate the work of her peers, while offering them a chance to display their work in a major exhibition at a public gallery. "The award benefits the artists financially, but they also get

a lot of experience and a lot of good exposure," said Helm. "Many people don't ever get to see this type of art. The exhibit was well received in the community."

Gwenessa Lam, a recent Graduating Year Awards recipient, is exhibiting her latest work at the North Vancouver gallery where she now works as the assistant program and gallery coordinator. A 2001 graduate of UBC's Fine Arts program, she was nominated for the award by her faculty. "It was wonderful to learn I'd won," said Lam. "I was really encouraged by the award, especially having just graduated and having doubts as to where my artwork stood. It was great to meet the other artists and generate new ideas, hear the thoughts behind the different works. The exhibit made me feel part of a larger community."

Since its formation, the Helen Pitt Fund has granted over \$1.4 million in bursaries to high school and post-secondary students in the Vernon area and throughout British Columbia. Over the years, dozens of educators and artists have generously volunteered their time to adjudicate the awards. Their time and energy has paid off as many bursary and award recipients, such as Renee van Halm, have gone on to become noted artists.

Van Halm received a bursary in 1974 when she was 23 years old. Today, she is an instructor at Emily Carr and a member of Vancouver Foundation's Arts and Culture Advisory Committee. Her most recent exhibition, entitled *Dream Home*, was exhibited at the Contemporary Art Gallery this spring.

"Awards and bursaries such as these are really important," said Van Halm, "In addition to the money, which is always helpful, they demonstrate to young artists that their work is valued in the community."

# Understanding

## OUR ENVIRONMENT

NOBODY KNOWS HOW MANY ROCKFISH LIVE IN BC'S COASTAL WATERS. THE SIERRA CLUB HOPES TO FIND OUT BEFORE THEY DISAPPEAR ALTOGETHER.



Rockfish are a mysterious, poorly understood species. Small, bony and perfectly camouflaged, they are hard to spot as they lurk among the rocky reefs off the coast of BC. Complicating matters, they cannot be brought to the surface to be studied since the change in pressure causes their swim bladder to rupture, killing them within hours. All of which might not matter if there weren't grave concerns that rockfish are being fished to the verge of extinction.

"We are witnessing the collapse of the inshore rockfish fishery," said Vicky Husband, conservation chair of the Sierra Club of BC. "If we don't do something about it right now, rockfish will go the way of the East Coast cod."

Until recently, rockfish were considered worthless by commercial fishers because of their size and low flesh content. But the decline of traditional West Coast fisheries and a growing Asian market for rockfish have turned the reclusive species into a big money maker. There are now more than 100 boats in the rockfish fishery. Rockfish have also become increasingly popular with BC's 240,000 licensed sports fishers. Moreover, millions of rockfish are caught and thrown back dead every year as part of the "bycatch" of large industrial trawlers. Today, an estimated 60% of all fish caught on the BC coast are groundfish species such as rockfish.

Most agree that the increased fishing has put pressure on rockfish stocks. The difficulty is that nobody knows how much. Incomplete and unreliable catch statistics make it unclear exactly how many rockfish are being fished. In addition, it is difficult to tag and count rockfish populations because of their reclusive nature and sensitive swim bladders. However, scientists do know that rockfish take a long time to mature and can live for more than 100 years, meaning they reproduce very slowly and will take a long time to recover.

"We don't really know how many rockfish are left, and that's part of the problem," said the Sierra Club's Sharon

Chow, who has worked closely with Husband on the rockfish campaign. "But we do know that there aren't the kind of numbers there used to be and that the species is undergoing what we call a precipitous decline."

Alarmed by this decline, last spring the Sierra Club of BC commissioned an independent report on the state of the groundfish fishery which showed that inshore rockfish were in serious trouble. Based on the report's findings, the Sierra Club called for a moratorium on focused commercial and sport inshore rockfish fishing coast-wide until more was learned about the species and a conservation strategy was in place. They also held a series of meetings with federal Department of Fisheries and Oceans officials to encourage them to act on their recommendations. Then last November, they participated in an historic public assembly of more than 100 rockfish fishery stakeholders, including commercial and recreational fishing industry organizations, environmental groups and coastal First Nations, to explore ways of protecting rockfish and saving the fishery.

As a result of this activity, last December the federal fisheries minister promised to drastically cut the allowable rockfish catch rates and to close significant portions of rockfish habitat to all fishing. He also committed to create a comprehensive catch monitoring program and a long-term conservation strategy by the end of 2002.

Vancouver Foundation has funded the Sierra Club of BC to work with the government to develop a rockfish conservation plan in the coming year and hold a series of public consultation meetings to raise awareness of the dangers of continued over-fishing of BC's rockfish.

"Our goal is to see a sustainable rockfish fishery here on the coast that employs people and provides fishing opportunities without wiping out the species," said Husband.

# Supporting MEDICAL RESEARCH

EARLY LANGUAGE INTERVENTION PROGRAMS HELP CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES LEARN TO TALK. A UBC PROFESSOR WANTS TO KNOW HOW WELL THEY HELP KIDS WHO ARE NOT LEARNING ENGLISH.

When Rishika Sodhi hadn't spoken a word by the time she was nearly two years old, her parents knew there was a problem with her language development.

Diagnosed with cerebral palsy at the age of one, she had already experienced delays in the development of her motor skills. Now it appeared her speech would be affected too.

"I was very concerned," said her mother Gajindera Sodhi. "I started to wonder what would happen if she never learned to talk."

Rishika's pediatrician put the family in touch with the Centre for Ability, a Vancouver-based clinic that provides therapeutic services for families with children who have developmental disorders such as cerebral palsy, autism and Down syndrome. The centre sent a speech and language therapist to the family home to assess Rishika and develop a customized early language intervention program. Gajindera Sodhi, a full-time homemaker, began to play a number of rhyming and word repetition games with her daughter. She also started to talk aloud in both English and Punjabi to Rishika all day long to encourage language acquisition.

Now four-years old, Rishika can speak in coherent sentences and is working on expanding her vocabulary. "It has made such a difference in Rishika's life and ours," said Gajindera Sodhi. "You used to be able to see the pure frustration in her face when she couldn't get the words out to express what she was thinking or feeling. She's a much happier child now."

For children with disabilities like Rishika, early language intervention programs that rely on parent-child interaction strategies, such as playing rhyming games, have proven enormously successful for enhancing language acquisition. However, these programs are based exclusively on practices from Western cultures and are usually conducted in English even with families

for whom English is neither the first nor the home language. Rishika's anecdotal success notwithstanding, there is no empirical evidence to suggest that such programs work as well—if at all—across language barriers.

According to Dr. Judith Johnston, a professor in the UBC School of Audiology and Speech Science, and a board member at the Centre for Ability, this lack of evidence is more than just a academic concern. Every year, the centre works with over 650 families that speak 19 different languages.

"The centre simply doesn't have the budget to hire speech and language therapists who are fluent in all these languages," said Dr. Johnston. "More to the point, such therapists don't exist. So every day we send out English speaking therapists to work with families who speak English as a second language without any real proof that it's helping."

To shed light on the subject, Dr. Johnston is preparing to conduct a study with the help of a grant from Vancouver Foundation that will measure the language development progress of 12 pairs of children with similar developmental disabilities who work with an English speaking speech and language therapist. One child from each pair will speak English while the other will speak either Cantonese or Punjabi. A third child on the centre's six-month waiting list will provide a control for each of the pairs.

Dr. Johnston hopes the study, the first of its kind anywhere, will show that early language intervention is beneficial regardless of the language used to implement the programs. But whatever the outcome, she says the findings will shape both public policy and our understanding of childhood language development.

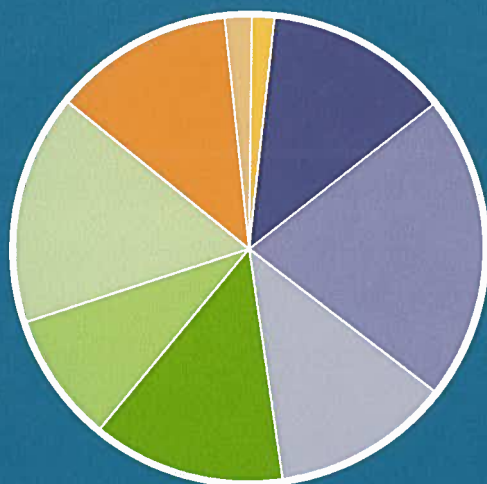

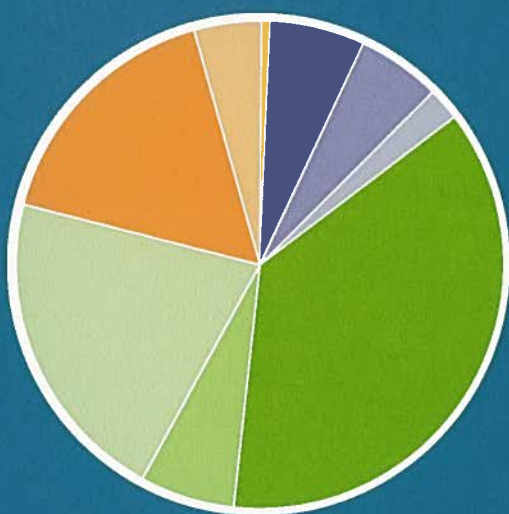
# TOTAL 2001 DISTRIBUTION

\$31 MILLION



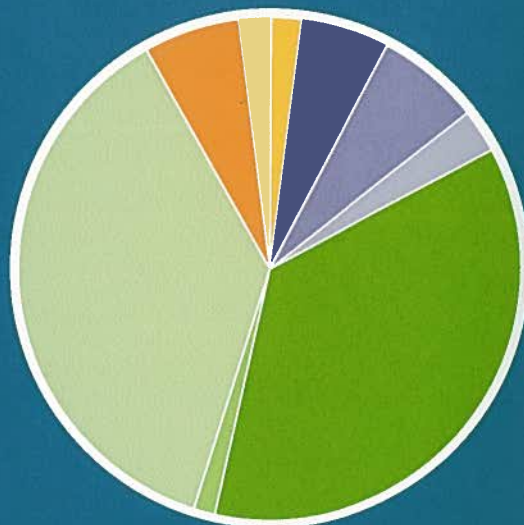

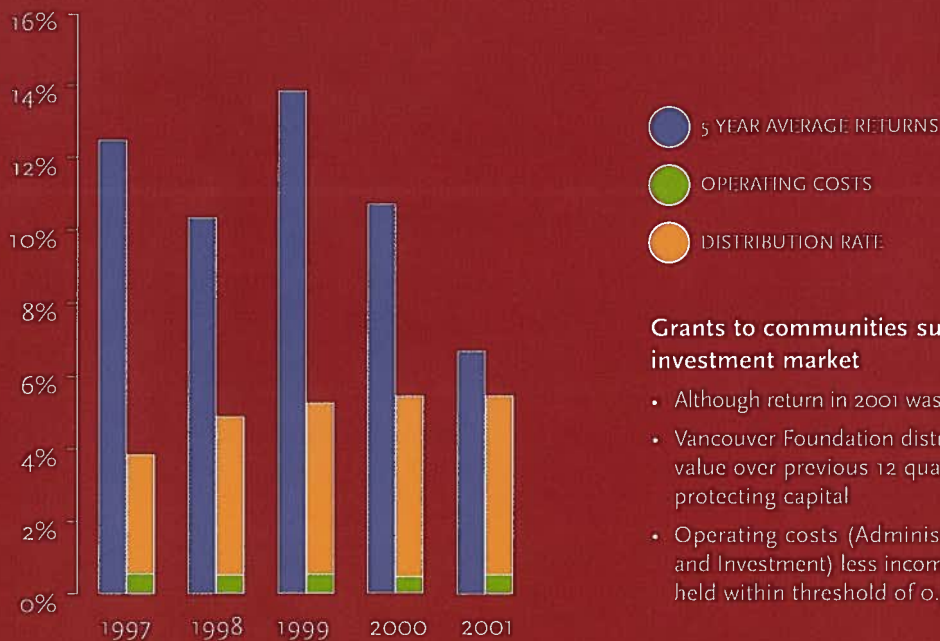

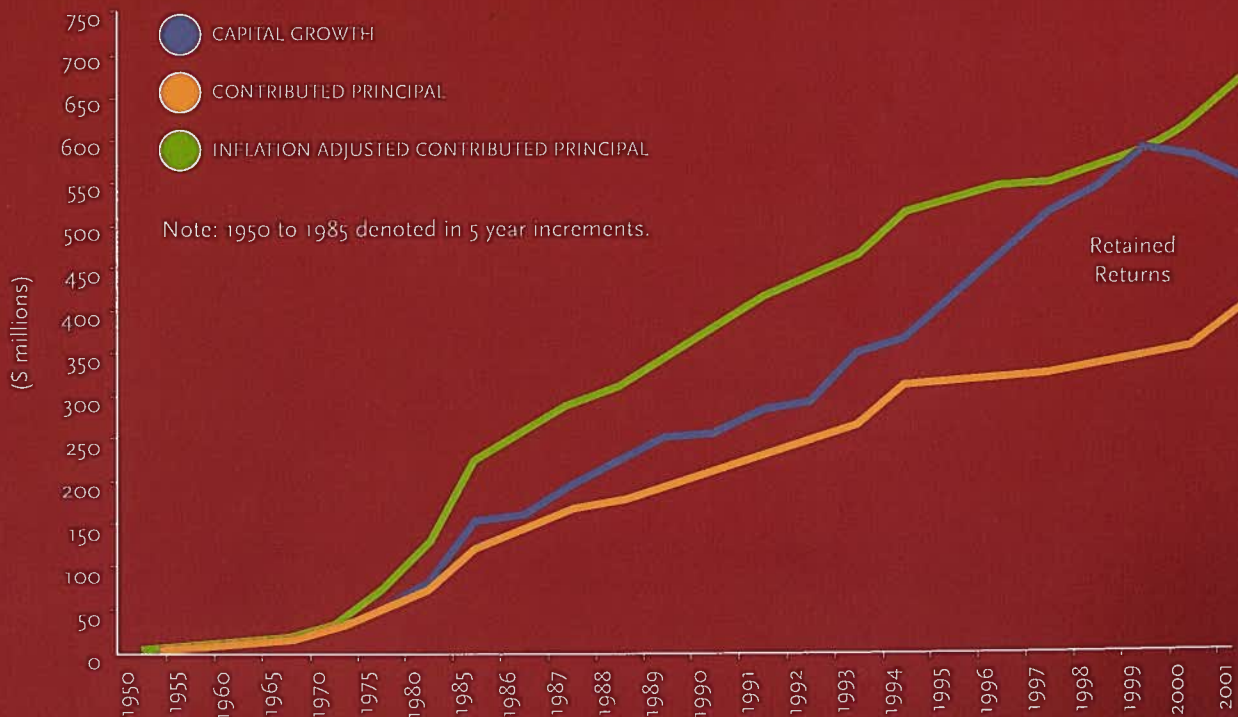

# NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

## DECEMBER 31, 2001 AND 2000

### 1 Purpose and Status

Vancouver Foundation (the "Foundation") was established in 1943 and became incorporated through an Act of the Provincial Legislature in 1950.

The income from funds donated and bequeathed to its endowment is used to provide for charitable purposes throughout British Columbia. The Foundation serves three major constituencies: its donors, the charitable sector, and the community.

The Foundation is registered with the Charities Division, Canada Customs and Revenue Agency and is classified as a public foundation. As such, it is exempt from federal income taxes and can issue charitable donation receipts.

### 2 Consolidated and Other Trust Funds

The Consolidated Trust Fund comprises those assets over which the Foundation exercises discretionary investment control within guidelines established by the Board of Directors. The Other Trust Funds comprise those assets over which the Foundation does not exercise discretionary investment control and which are administered in accordance with specific directions from the donors.

### 3 Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies used by the Foundation are stated below to assist in understanding the financial statements.

#### BEQUESTS AND GRANTS

Bequests are recorded upon receipt of the donated assets. Bequests in a form other than cash or marketable securities are recorded at values determined by the Board of Directors. Grants are recorded when paid by the Foundation.

#### INVESTMENTS

Investments within the Consolidated Trust Fund are valued at current market prices on the last business day of the fiscal period. Investments within the Other Trust Funds are stated at cost and any realized gains or losses arising from investment transactions are included as part of contributed principal. Should the carrying value of the investments exceed market value, the investments are written down to market value if management considers that there is a permanent impairment in value.

#### FIXED ASSETS

The Foundation capitalizes the cost of major capital additions and amortizes the cost of these assets over their estimated useful lives. Lease inducements received in conjunction with the Foundation's lease are offset against the cost of leasehold improvements. Management has determined the estimated useful lives to be:

Computer and office equipment	3 to 5 years straight-line
Office furniture	10 years straight-line
Leasehold improvements-net of lease inducements	straight-line over the term of the lease (10 years)

#### INTEREST AND DIVIDENDS

Interest on bonds, mortgages and short-term notes is accrued as earned. Dividends which have been declared are recorded as income on the date of record set for the dividend.

## OPERATING EXPENSES

Administration expenses, program expenses and investment management and custodial fees are recorded using the accrual basis.

## 4 Investments

### CONSOLIDATED TRUST FUND

The bonds and debentures in the Consolidated Trust Fund are represented by Canadian fixed interest bonds and debentures, with a weighted average term to maturity of 8.95 years (2000-9.1 years). The effective interest rate on these bonds and debentures is 4.9% (2000-5.7%).

The common shares and convertible securities in the Consolidated Trust Fund are represented by the following:

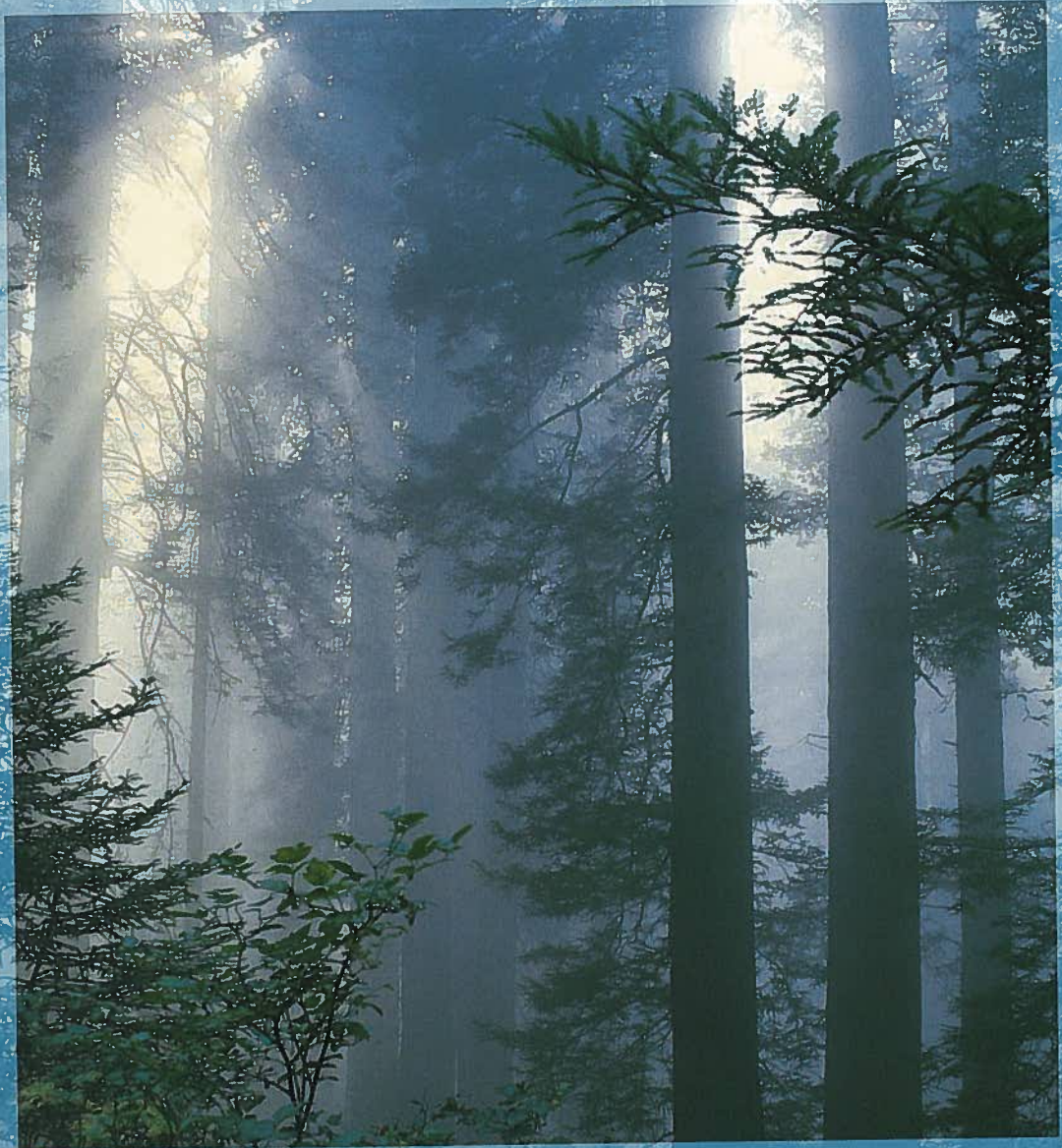

## HOW TO SET UP A FUND

The process for establishing a fund is quite simple and straightforward. Just follow the steps below.

1. Call us. During the course of the conversation, Foundation staff will gather information from you detailing the type of fund you wish to establish. Staff will then draft a letter for you, tailored to your specific needs, which will include the following information:

- The name of the proposed fund
- How the income is to be used (charitable purposes of the fund)
- Whether it is to be an open or closed fund
- For a non-profit organization establishing its own agency endowment fund, we will need to include your BC Societies registration number, your Federal Charity registration number, a copy of the Society's Constitution and By-laws, and a copy of your most recent annual report and financial statements.

We will ask you to review the letter, amend it if required, and return it to us with your signature.

2. Using this information, we draw up a Deed of Gift (a trust document setting out the terms of the fund) for you, have it approved by our legal advisor and forward it to you for you to review. We encourage you to discuss this matter with your own independent legal advisor to ensure the Deed of Gift's contents correspond to your original intents.

3. Once you are sure the Deed of Gift is acceptable, it should be signed and returned to the Vancouver Foundation with a cheque for \$10,000 (minimum) which will serve as your fund's initiating capital. If you are unable or prefer not to contribute \$10,000 at one time, Vancouver Foundation provides you with the option of contributing to a start up fund.

4. The executive staff of the Foundation then approve the Deed of Gift and present the established fund at the next meeting of the Foundation's board of directors.

## HOW TO APPLY FOR A GRANT

To find out whether your project meets Vancouver Foundation's basic criteria, please contact our office. The Foundation supports only registered charities with a federal charitable tax number/business number.

To begin, all grant applicants must submit a letter outlining the proposed project in less than four pages. The letter should:

- Introduce your organization and its mandate
- State the community priorities the project will address
- Detail the scope of the project, including a timeline
- Demonstrate community support for the project
- Provide a detailed budget, including funding from Vancouver Foundation and other sources.

One of our program directors will review your proposal to determine basic eligibility. You may be contacted for further information. If the project qualifies, you will be invited to submit a formal application by a specified deadline. You will be provided with an application form with detailed instructions for its completion.

A thorough assessment of the application will be completed before it goes forward to the appropriate advisory committee. Meeting or phone discussions with Foundation staff are likely and, as part of the assessment, other funders may be consulted.

The advisory committee will then consider your application and make a recommendation to the Foundation's board of directors. You will receive written notification of the board's decision, along with terms and conditions.

Vancouver Foundation has three annual deadlines (January, April and September) for receiving completed applications. Letters of intent should be submitted at least four weeks prior to the application deadline. Grant decisions usually take about 12 weeks.
