YEAR IN REVIEW

Highlights of the 2003 Fiscal Year

- For the **Consolidated Trust Fund**, the investment return for the year ending December 31, 2003 was 9.1% (page 25).
- Since its establishment in 1943, Vancouver Foundation has made more than \$500,000,000 in **grants and distributions** (page 25).
- For decades, Vancouver Foundation has worked with government agencies, community groups, business leaders and residents to develop innovative solutions to the complex challenges in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside. In 2003, Vancouver Foundation seeded the **Four Pillars Fund** with \$250,000. In partnership with the City of Vancouver, Western Economic Diversification Canada, VanCity Credit Union and the Four Pillars Coalition, this fund will encourage community projects that make a difference in the lives of people suffering from problematic substance abuse.
- The BC Ministry of Human Resources established a \$20 million permanent endowment fund at Vancouver Foundation called the **Disability Supports for Employment Fund**. Approximately \$1 million in income generated by the fund will be distributed annually through grants to non-profit, registered charitable organizations. The purpose of this Fund is to provide disability supports to enhance the capacity of adults with disabilities to secure and retain employment and volunteer placements.
- An **external review** of our granting program was carried out in July as part of our efforts toward "continuous improvement" in our operations, as well as being a governance initiative by the Board. The review involved our peers from the Muttart Foundation, the San Diego Community Foundation and Volunteer Vancouver. The results indicated that Vancouver Foundation is regarded as a strong and valued contributor in all aspects of its work across the province and is seen as creative and flexible in its grantmaking.
- In October, 140 individuals from diverse communities, universities and government agencies gathered to discuss the topic of immigration and migration. This was the inaugural session in the **Community Dialogue Series**, hosted by Vancouver Foundation and Simon Fraser University's Morris J. Wosk Centre for Dialogue.
- **New fund types** were created to allow donors and agencies more flexibility:
 - **Retractable Funds** – trust funds established by eligible registered charities for a particular purpose, allowing the agency to withdraw capital under certain conditions.
 - **Pay-Down Funds** – distribute a portion of the capital and all of the income over a pre-established period of time.
 - **Private Funds** – recognizing that some people do not have the time and resources to administer their own private foundations, Vancouver Foundation is now offering this alternative. These new permanent endowment funds provide donors with a number of additional services, including research, marketing, specialized application forms and the option of having a web page dedicated to their fund.
- Vancouver Foundation was pleased to announce the creation of its **Investment Managers' Program** in 2003. This program allows new donors to have their funds invested outside Vancouver Foundation's Consolidated Trust Fund (CTF) or its Socially Responsible Investment Fund (SRI). Now donors can select their own investment managers to determine the assets in which they want to invest.
- In addition, BMO Financial Group and Community Foundations of Canada (CFC), launched **Supporting Your Community**. This program capitalizes on BMO's force of more than 2,200 investment professionals and Canada's more than 130 community foundations, to create more opportunities for donors to make charitable contributions that will have a lasting, local impact.

Invest in Communities

Ten years ago, for our 50th anniversary, we produced a poster illustrated by Joe Average showing the sun (Vancouver Foundation) giving warmth and support to heart-shaped flowers (charities in the community). The picture was titled "Many Happy Returns" – a double entendre for the benefits of investing in the community and the stock market. Now it is our 60th anniversary, and after the past three years, when the only satisfactory returns have been those derived from our work in the community, I am happy to report that in 2003 the stock market offered signs of encouragement. Last year, the investment return was 9.1%, and we expect similar performance in 2004.

Good governance is essential for maintaining the trust which is at the heart of Vancouver Foundation. Our first and best type of governance is the integrity and commitment of our staff and volunteers: those we are fortunate to have now, and those we will recruit in the future. We have also implemented more policies, procedures, declarations and control processes to comply with best practices.

In reviewing the various policy alternatives we are fortunate to have access to professional counsel particularly for financial, investment and legal matters. In this last respect the advice of Leo Amighetti and his colleagues, Edgar Frechette and Darrell Wickstrom at Fasken Martineau DuMoulin LLP, has allowed us to confidently deal with increasingly complex opportunities and challenges.

More and more, communities and the agencies that serve them are being forced by government cutbacks to be more self sufficient. That means making increased use of resources such as the experience, talent and time of volunteers.


In 1973, the then Chairman of the Board, Mr. W.J. VanDusen wrote in his annual report:

"Nowhere is this voluntary contribution more apparent than in the time and interest given to the affairs of Vancouver Foundation by our Board Members and Advisory Committees. These groups meet regularly throughout the year, and I pay respect for their devotion and appreciation of their efforts as we embark on another year in our pursuits of increasing human knowledge, alleviating human suffering and providing betterment for underprivileged and delinquent persons under the terms of our charter."

The manner of speaking has changed over the last 30 years, but the above sentiment and Vancouver Foundation's dependence on volunteers has not. In fact, today we count on the contributions of more than 140 volunteers whose knowledge and expertise are the distinguishing characteristics and outstanding strengths of the Foundation. On behalf of the Board of Directors, I thank Mike Burns, Iain Harris and George Marlatte for all that they gave during their terms as Directors, and welcome their outstanding replacements Diana Maughan, Hamish Angus and Robert Fairweather.

I would also like to thank our donors for their ongoing support. As we look ahead to the next ten years, we know that your generosity will help Vancouver Foundation continue to invest in our communities.

RESPOND TO CHANGE

When Vancouver Foundation was created in 1943, the world was a very different place. The population of Greater Vancouver was 410,000, while only 900,000 people lived in the entire province of BC. Many of the rural communities we know today were logging, mining or fishing camps set up to accommodate seasonal crews whose homes were in Vancouver. At that time, the Foundation's geographic mandate was limited to the Lower Mainland, and it was the steward of funds established principally to support the Community Chest (now United Way), and the Red Cross. With no "social safety net," it was the charitable work of a small number of social service agencies funded by Vancouver Foundation that provided for the welfare of citizens.

Over the decades, Vancouver Foundation has grown in response to a fast changing environment. Global influences such as transportation, communications, trade and migration patterns have broadened the range and scope of our programs.


To anticipate and respond to these rapidly changing circumstances, we rely on the strategic thinking and contributed energy and interest of the more than 140 volunteers who serve on our Board of Directors and Advisory Committees. Vancouver Foundation is the steward of almost \$565 million in capital and distributes over \$32 million to agencies across British Columbia. We now serve a population of 4,100,000, half of which reside in the Lower Mainland. Our programs and initiatives are shaped by the knowledge we gain through our relationships with the more than 40 community foundations now established in British Columbia, as well as the experience we share with our peers in North America and with emerging community foundations around the world. These exchanges have led to Vancouver Foundation's collaboration and involvement in a number of novel approaches to community building:

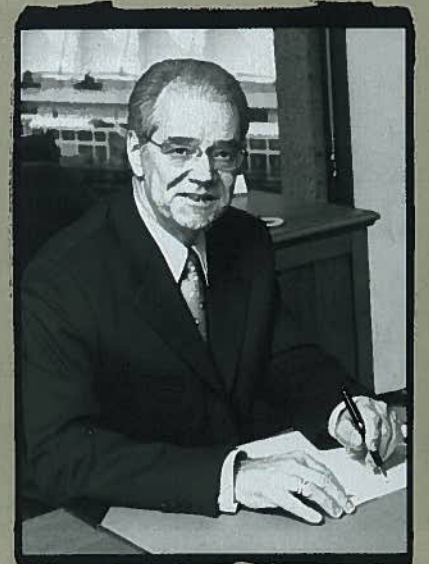
- Our LEAD Grants program is critical to the growth of more than 40 community foundations across British Columbia and the vitality of many rural towns. It is also being adapted by the World Bank through a pilot program that supports emerging community foundations in developing countries using small grants that engage citizens in building community capacity.
- The Neighbourhood Small Grants program (an idea sparked by the City of Savannah, Georgia) aims to draw neighbours together in networks of mutual support. Through community associations, small grants are distributed to fund projects such as creating a community garden or compiling an immigrant women's cookbook.
- The Youth Philanthropy Program is based on a program in Michigan and was introduced to Canada by Vancouver Foundation. This program sees young people from diverse backgrounds become grantmakers – deciding whether or not to support applications for youth-driven projects.
- The Four Pillars Fund supports initiatives following the treatment, prevention, harm reduction and enforcement approach to problematic substance use. With an initial focus on the Downtown Eastside, the fund will build on the capacity of individuals, families and communities to deal with the issue.

Community foundations in Canada and around the world have sought the advice of Vancouver Foundation because of our experience, judgment and the trust we place in the communities we serve. We are privileged to be at the forefront of a movement that is helping communities and not-for-profit agencies to engage each other and develop the competence and confidence to improve their quality of life. We will continue to recruit the best people to bring the innovation, creativity and leadership into Vancouver Foundation that will ensure our capacity to serve the province of British Columbia and the broad philanthropic community in perpetuity.

As we reflect on another year, I would like to thank our donors for their generosity, foresight and dedication. Thank you for sharing our vision of making British Columbia a province of strong and healthy communities.

LEAD THE WAY

All great organizations begin with a vision, and Vancouver Foundation is no exception.

Celebrating a historic milestone—our 60th anniversary—naturally casts our minds

back to the origins of this, the largest community foundation in Canada.

Now a legend of its own, these origins still inspire us today. When Alice MacKay left a \$1,000 bequest to help improve the quality of life in BC, W.J. VanDusen encouraged nine other families to join he and his wife Alma in giving \$10,000 each to create the Foundation's starting capital of \$101,000. Income from this fund, to be administered by the newly established Vancouver Foundation, would initiate perpetual support for the agencies served by the Community Chest and Council of Greater Vancouver, the organization we now know as United Way of the Lower Mainland. From this very first fund, Vancouver Foundation has grown into the organization we see today, managing over 800 separate endowment funds worth approximately \$565 million.



For 60 years, income from this initial fund has helped United Way of the Lower Mainland carry out their important mandate of providing programs and social services to the people of the Greater Vancouver area. These include assisting people living in poverty, investing in the future of children, youth and families, and helping people living with health conditions and disabilities.

"United Way is truly a unique organization playing a vital role in the Lower Mainland, and the endowment fund is an integral component of United Way," says Don Calder, Board Chair for United Way of the Lower Mainland. "It is important that we continually grow the endowment fund so that we can ensure the future long term sustainability of the organization and our ability to provide support to agencies and community services helping people throughout the Lower Mainland."

As United Way of the Lower Mainland grew and developed, Vancouver Foundation, through wise management and investment, helped to build up their fund, which is currently valued at \$20.6 million.



"Our roles are complementary," said Richard Mulcaster, Vancouver Foundation's President and CEO. "Our staff are regularly in touch with one another, involved in strengthening our communities. United Way raises money to give out each year, while we set up permanent endowment funds, the income from which can be distributed. They are the community's philanthropic chequings account, we're the philanthropic savings account."

Through its work across British Columbia, Vancouver Foundation is involved not only with United Way of the Lower Mainland but also with United Ways across the province, a total of 17 other organizations. As with United Way of the Lower Mainland, these cooperative efforts have generated countless benefits for the community.

"Having their permanent endowment fund at Vancouver Foundation ensures that United Way of the Lower Mainland will have steady income for its future," said Gerald McGavin, Chair of Vancouver Foundation's Board of Directors. "As we look into that future, we know that the relationship between Vancouver Foundation and United Way will continue to embody the vision of Alice MacKay, W.J. VanDusen and the thousands of donors who have understood and do understand the importance of creating permanent funding resources and of strengthening communities."

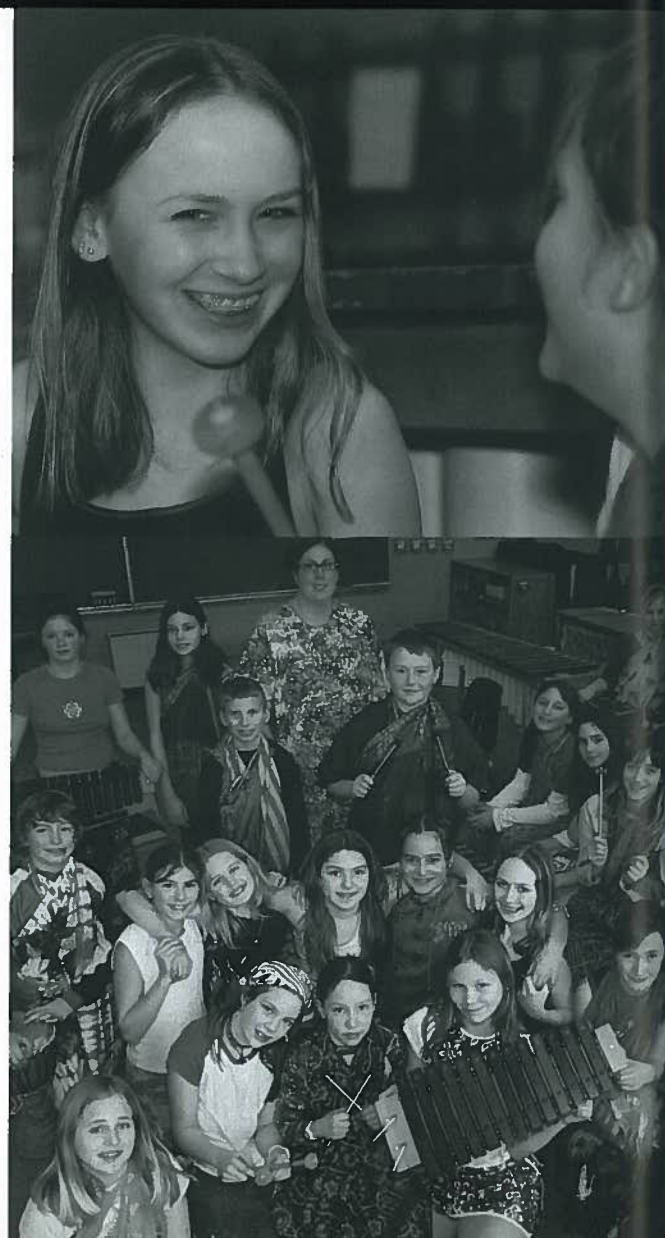
OPEN UP THE WORLD

At Arden Elementary School in the Comox Valley, the upbeat sounds of marimba music float through the halls. Each week, approximately 25 students from grades 3 to 6 gather to rehearse the catchy tunes that invariably cause listeners to dance and call for more. Under the tutelage of music teacher Jennifer Philp, the Arden Marimba Club performs at schools, seniors homes and other venues in the area.

The enthusiasm demonstrated by these students—who rarely miss practice—was sparked by performances by Marimba Mazuva, a Victoria-based group whose name has become synonymous with rhythmic Zimbabwean music in the Pacific Northwest since the early 1990s.

"Marimba Mazuva has so much energy that they inspired the staff and students to purchase marimbas and learn to play," said Philp. "And now that we have the club, each time the group returns the kids can make connections with them and be proud that they can play marimbas as well."

Marimba Mazuva's tour is just one of the initiatives funded by Artists in Education, a program created by Vancouver Foundation and the BC Arts Council in 1996, and administered by ArtStarts in Schools. Each year, this program provides \$580,000 to school districts across British Columbia, engaging approximately half a million students in more than 3,200 theatrical, musical, literary and artistic events.



"Vancouver Foundation's involvement in Artists in Education provides encouragement and the incentive to develop a program that probably wouldn't have started otherwise," said McGall. "Their investment leverages other matching funds from the school districts and parent advisory councils."

Jennifer Philp believes that the artists who connect with schools through Artists in Education inspire students to try the art form themselves, whether it is playing marimbas or singing acappella.

"These interactions are hugely inspirational for children," she said. "They open up their world, provide them with positive memories, and allow them to be involved in experiences that they themselves can find success with."

While Vancouver Foundation and the BC Arts Council have both been funding arts and culture in BC schools for over 25 years, their partnership with ArtStarts is a very successful mechanism for connecting students with professional artists. Together, these organizations have helped BC students develop an appreciation for the arts, turning performances and readings into exciting experiences.

"When students interact with artists like Marimba Mazuva, they experience the joy that only music and the arts can bring," said Helene McGall, district Vice Principal for Fine Arts and Aboriginal Education in Comox School District 71 and an ArtStarts Board member. "When they then participate, as in the Marimba club at Arden Elementary, they learn the discipline and commitment that go with preparing for a performance, which is all about life."

A recent review of the Artists in Education program found that incorporating arts events into a school's curriculum not only enhances students' awareness of the arts, but also has a positive impact on language development, and reading and writing skills. By complementing the regular curriculum, this program broadens students' perspectives and exposes them to cultural diversity.

SUCCEED THROUGH CHANGE

When women emigrate to Canada, they face the challenge of integrating into a society that often differs substantially from their own. Fortunately for new Canadian women in BC's Lower Mainland, they can turn to Pacific Immigrant Resources Society. Since 1975, this not-for-profit agency has provided programs and services that help to equip immigrant women and their children with the knowledge, skills, confidence and friendships they need to feel at home in British Columbia.

Pacific Immigrant Resources Society carries out their mission through initiatives such as English Second Language classes, leadership training and children's programs. However, these programs require the full-time efforts of staff and volunteers, leaving little or no time for the strategic planning and development that organizations need to remain effective.

"We're so often consumed by the day to day work, we don't have time and resources for planning and development," explains Jean Maloney, Executive Director of Pacific Immigrant Resources Society. "It ends up that someone's trying to accomplish these tasks off the side of their desk."



Partners in Organizational Development (POD) offers an answer to this dilemma, which is one shared by many not-for-profit agencies. Started in 1989 as the Technical Assistance Program, POD provides grants that will help British Columbia's not-for-profits respond to the changes they are facing in today's society. This usually involves hiring consultants who can assist with governance, financial planning, training, and implementing new strategic plans.

ArtsPOD is a sister program that builds capacity in arts and heritage organizations in BC, while VAST (Vancouver Arts Stabilization Team) focuses on similar needs for nine Vancouver arts organizations. Vancouver Foundation is a major funder of the POD, ArtsPOD and VAST programs, as they reflect our mission by helping to improve the quality of life for British Columbians.

"While there is a great deal of resilience among not-for-profit organizations in BC, many of them are stretched to the limit," said Richard Mulcaster, Vancouver Foundation's President and CEO. "They require technical assistance to help them build capacity, become stronger, and have the ability to cope with change."

Jean Maloney feels that their POD grant placed Pacific Immigrant Resources Society in a position where they are able to demonstrate solid outcomes to funders and donors, which helps attract much-needed support. They now have tools that staff can use to measure change. "For example, the number of women speaking English as a result of our programs is a measurable outcome," she said. "And we've been able to build on the work the consultant did with us in terms of fundraising plans and strategies."

Building on the success of current technical assistance offerings, Vancouver Foundation and other funding partners recently set up the Centre for Sustainability, which is an organization dedicated to increasing the capacity and effectiveness among not-for-profits in BC.



"One of our key strengths will be the ability to act as a central resource for organizations seeking tools for capacity building," said Kevin Ronaghan, Executive Director of the Centre for Sustainability. "But the plan is to be more than just that. In all we do, we want to be a catalyst for organizational development in BC's not-for-profit sector."

For Pacific Immigrant Resources Society, the effect of the POD grants goes to the organization's core. They feel stronger, and better able to cope with change. "It has re-focused us," Jean Maloney concludes. "We feel better equipped than ever before to support the women and children who benefit from our programs."

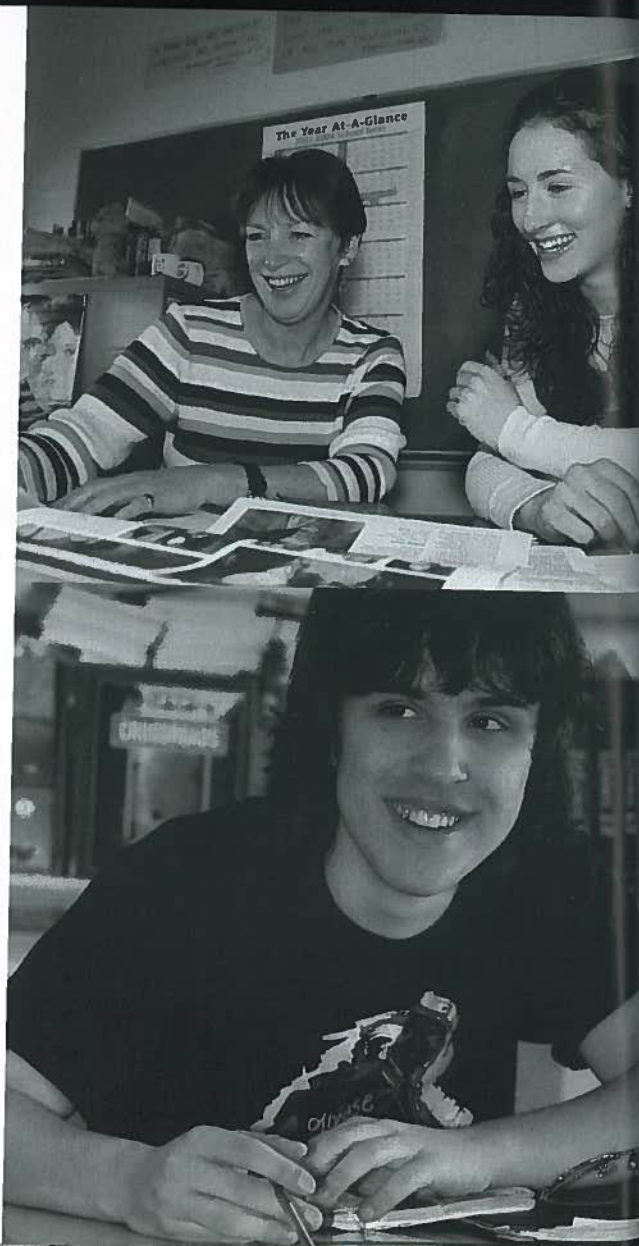
SPREAD THE WORD

"I started writing. I didn't write right away. Instead I brain stormed a bit."

With these words, Jackson Voong captured the essence of the writer's craft. In October 2003, the Grade 7 student from Nootka Elementary School in East Vancouver won *Write to the Point*, the Vancouver International Writers & Readers Festival's first writing contest for elementary students. Grade 10 student Emily Barca sits as student representative on the Festival's education committee and was involved in the judging.

"It was so amazing to see what 10 and 11 year olds came up with," she said. "They wouldn't normally think to sit down and write as it seems like homework. But when you expose someone to a writing contest, it changes their perspective."

Emily's love for writing stems from the enthusiasm of her creative writing teacher, Allison Sullings, English teacher at Eric Hamber Secondary School. Each year, Sullings takes students to Writers Festival events. Seeking to promote literacy and a passion for writing and reading in BC students, the Festival is currently in the second year of a three-year initiative to expand their Spreading the Word education program, which Vancouver Foundation is funding through a \$40,000 grant over the three years.



"The Writers Festival has had events for schools since our beginnings in 1988," said Alma Lee, Artistic Director for the Vancouver International Writers Festival. "But initially this only involved students coming to the Festival."

The Vancouver International Writers Festival wanted to inspire students who were unable to attend the actual festival, especially those in schools outside the Lower Mainland. The Spreading the Word program is allowing the Festival to accomplish this goal. As well as the writing contest, Spreading the Word's first phase included Writers in the Classroom, a one-week residency where a writer engages students with a week of workshops and readings. Last year's event in Nelson was highly successful; this year, the Writers Festival hopes to duplicate the success in Powell River.

To assist the Writers Festival in taking their educational initiatives around the province, CBC Television taped some of the events that took place at the 2003 Festival (October 21-26). From this taping, they have produced two videos. One is directed at children in Kindergarten to Grade 3 and features BC writers Bill Richardson and Chieri Uegaki while the other focuses on fantasy author Andrea Spalding and is suitable for Grades 6 to 9.

This initiative is the second in CBC Television's Gift of Communication, a partnership with Vancouver Foundation that profiles an organization with which Vancouver Foundation has an established relationship. Vancouver Foundation's contribution of \$10,000 is matched by CBC

Television, which contributes their communications expertise and broadcasting capabilities.

"We hope that CBC Television and Spreading the Word will help the Writers Festival to take their events and authors to schools and students throughout BC who would otherwise not be exposed to them," said Rae Hull, Senior Director of Network Programming for CBC Television. "This is a wonderful collaboration for us, given that the Festival celebrates Canadian authors, books and a love of reading, and we fully appreciate Vancouver Foundation's support and involvement in the initiative."

As the Spreading the Word videos go out to schools in the first half of 2004, the Festival hopes to encourage more BC teachers to engage their students in creative writing, as Allison Sullings inspired Emily Barca.

"Reading leads to knowledge, and knowledge leads to empowerment," said Alma Lee. "If children can't read and write, they start life with a huge disadvantage. This is why Spreading the Word is so important. Vancouver Foundation recognized that: they really understood what we wanted to do. Their support has been wonderful."

BREAK NEW GROUND

Kee Warner exudes a quiet confidence over the phone and in person, yet she is passionate about her belief in the abilities of kids with Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD). Approaching this age-old social issue from a different angle, she has achieved remarkable results.

For the last seven years, Kee has run camps for kids with FASD from her Whitecrow property near Burns Lake. Vancouver Foundation's Children, Youth and Families Advisory Committee provided a \$25,000 grant for funds to expand the camps to Lake Cowichan and Campbell River. "Our committee supports organizations whose projects encourage individuals and entire families to develop their innate capacities, recognizing their leadership and life skills," explains Judith Hall, Board Member and Advisory Committee Chair. "We also support new ways of looking at issues that might not be commonly accepted yet."



FASD is an invisible, long-term disability, caused by maternal alcohol consumption during pregnancy. Resulting in mental and physical disabilities in the child, it is the most common birth defect—more common than Spina Bifida and Down Syndrome combined. While it is entirely preventable, blaming mothers is not the answer; it is a community and social problem.

As with many disabilities, the key for parents, caregivers and their children is understanding how to live with the effects of FASD. Camp is often out of the question for kids with FASD as they may have behavioural issues. Yet both parents and their kids could use a break from the daily routine. Whitecrow makes it possible for families to spend eight days together. Kids take part in camp activities, while parents and caregivers participate in seminars learning effective interventions and communications.

Whitecrow is the only camp of its kind in Canada. This approach to working with children with FASD and their families is breaking new ground.

At Whitecrow, and at the two camps offered this year on Vancouver Island, participants explore new ways of relating to kids with FASD. The sooner parents and their community professionals understand a child's disability, the sooner adjustments can be made to help the child and their family.

Others are beginning to recognize Kee's leadership around FASD. The Ashoka Institute recently welcomed her into their small clutch of social entre-



preneurs: there are just four full Fellows and two associate Fellows in Canada. Internationally the Fellows' work is to reconsider traditional ways of addressing societal issues.

Community volunteers, existing FAS networks and others providing care, such as teachers and social workers, are included in the camps. Kee hopes the host community will develop expertise and confidence over two years, running the camp by themselves in the third year with Whitecrow as a mentor. Her vision is to have a camp in every province and territory in Canada within three years.

"The camps are incredible. By the end of the week, children have made friends and learned social skills, while parents and caregivers have learned by experience and from each other," says Bev Zorn, a camp leader and the mother of daughter with FASD. "The goal of reducing the number of children born with FASD is a dream for now, but we are learning the skills to live together."

With a dedicated concern for fostering early childhood development, Linda Reid, Minister of State for Early Childhood Development, established the Early Childhood Development Legacy Fund in 2001 with \$5,000,000. Drawing on Vancouver Foundation's grant-making expertise, the Children, Youth & Families Advisory Committee oversees granting from this fund. In 2003, Vancouver Foundation made 15 grants totaling \$288,581, including ECDL support to Whitecrow.



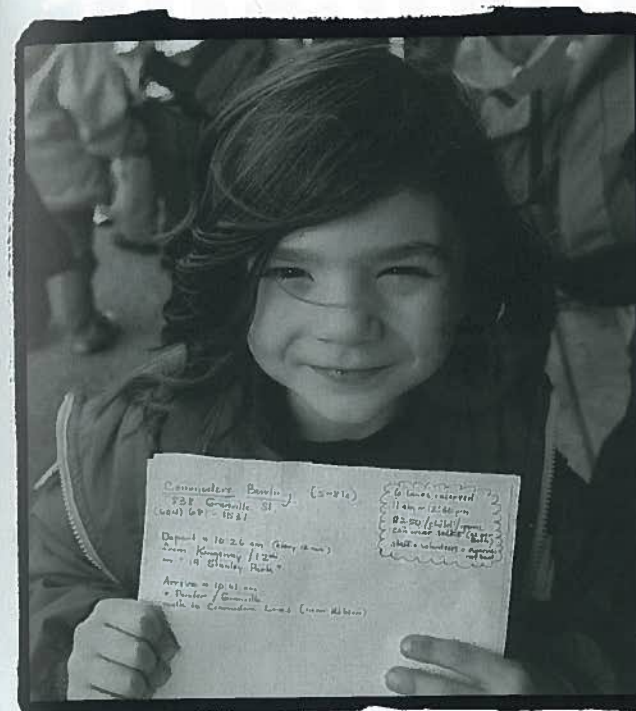
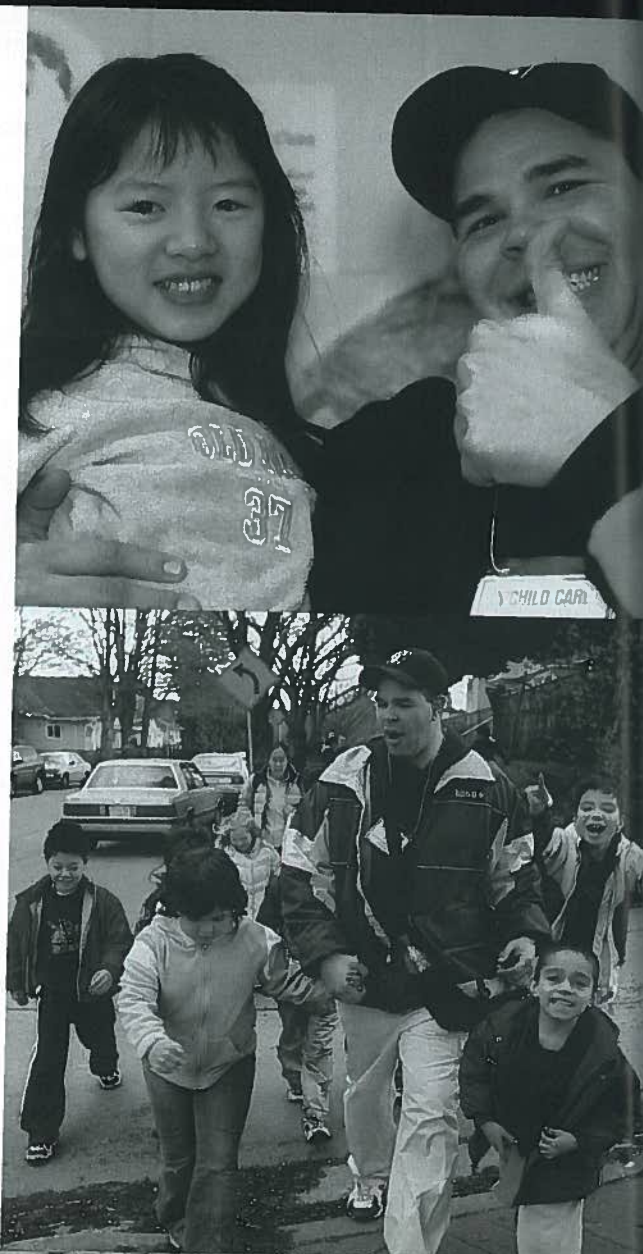

ENGAGE THE HEART

Corporate responsibility is on the rise. This, coupled with Vancouver Foundation's donor responsiveness, has led to a growth in the number of corporate funds held at Vancouver Foundation. The Foundation's grantmaking expertise and investment management is helping corporate donors meet their philanthropic goals.

Business Objects (formerly Crystal Decisions), an international computer software company, established two funds with Vancouver Foundation and have developed a community grants program with their employees and Vancouver Foundation's assistance. Their granting focus is on children from the ages of 3 - 18 years old who are living in poverty. More specifically, they support projects related to core curriculum and technology.

Business Objects' two funds have engaged their employees' hearts and their brains. Increasingly, employees are giving generously of their time, not just their dollars. Through their grantmaking, they have begun to understand the challenges of the communities in which they live and work.



"We have been impressed with the brilliant work being done in community," says Tracy Logan, who oversees Business Objects' corporate philanthropy program. "It is easy to become discouraged with the state of our society, and yet we are truly surrounded by caring people who are delivering quality, innovative programs. We are proud of our early efforts in the community and Vancouver Foundation has added value throughout the process—from administration, to education about grantmaking and community."

The KidSafe Project Society, a recent grantee, received support for their recreational reading program that serves over 200 inner-city school-aged children. This creative program engages children in reading, speaking, listening and writing activities, using drama to enhance literacy skills. Business Objects contributed \$10,000 from their fund while their employees also volunteered on the finance committee and assisted with promotions.

Duke Energy, another corporate fundholder striving to optimize its philanthropy, also works with Vancouver Foundation. In addition to their ongoing contributions throughout their operating areas—British Columbia, Alberta, Ontario, and the Maritimes—Duke Energy has a special interest in education and innovation in northeastern British Columbia. This has resulted in the creation of three funds with Vancouver Foundation, each with their own philanthropic objectives. In 2003, Duke Energy distributed 270 grants totalling \$1,686,958 through Vancouver Foundation.

"Vancouver Foundation brings experience and expertise that we are able to capitalize on," explains Rosemary Araujo, Community and Regional Affairs. "Community foundations are able to identify current trends and emerging issues, stimulate resources to address those needs and help our communities prepare for the future."

Duke Energy supports Northern Opportunities, a partnership aimed at enhancing opportunities for students to succeed in school, pursue post-secondary education and build careers in the trades/technology workforce. Through this initiative, Duke Energy is helping to build strong, vibrant communities. To ensure that the initiative is community-driven and collaborative, they have developed partnerships between the regional school districts, Northern Lights College, local First Nations, and industry and communities from South Peace to Fort Nelson.

When asked to highlight one particular grant, Rosemary explains, "We are particularly proud of the Aboriginal Support Program at North Peace Secondary School in Fort St. John. The purpose of this program is to support aboriginal learners to overcome educational barriers by celebrating First Nations culture, fostering a sense of belonging and assisting with a smoother transition to graduation."

With its corporate fundholders, Vancouver Foundation is combining its investment and grantmaking expertise in a way that makes good business sense. This approach to philanthropy is strengthening communities across the province through corporations that are committed to making a difference.

ENHANCE STRENGTHS

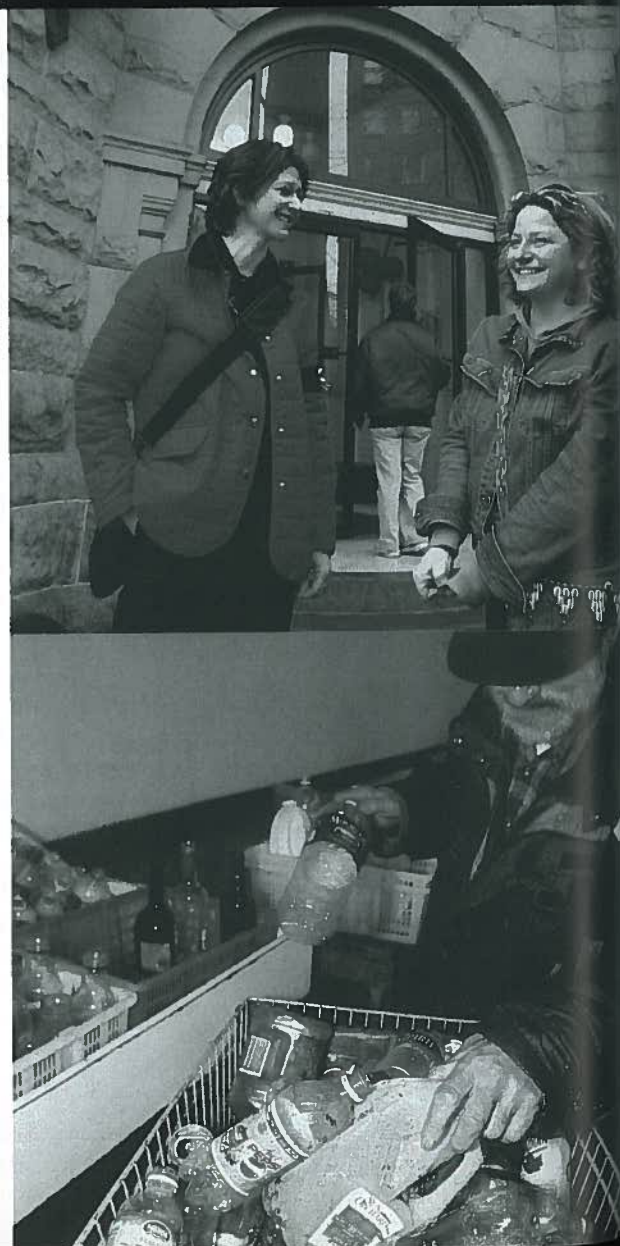
Strong leaders are vital to strong, healthy communities. Recognizing this, Vancouver Foundation supported three unique leadership initiatives in 2003. Approved by the Health and Social Development committee and also supported through Donor Advised Funds, these initiatives are: One Step Forward (United We Can), Community Leadership Institute (Collingwood Neighbourhood House) and Healing Communities (Naramata Centre).

United We Can, in partnership with Simon Fraser University's Learning Strategies Group, coaches individuals and groups in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside with One Step Forward. Ken Lyotier of United We Can and Jennifer Campagnolo of SFU began by asking, "What will bring out skills, encourage leadership and inspire problem solving?"

Both believe that the answer to this question is in the community, and that by working with community members, new leaders will emerge. "These new leaders are the bright lights in their communities—the ones who will help to uncover the latent talent and the solutions to the most entrenched problems facing the community of the Downtown Eastside," said Campagnolo.

Personal strengths, skills and limitations are explored through one-to-one coaching sessions and group workshops at United We Can, the Carnegie Community Centre and the Potluck Café.

"I have learned that I have innate strengths and skills that I can develop and enhance, and that by being more accepting of myself I can be more effective," said Sharon Kravitz, a participant from the Carnegie Community Centre. "I am more confident in both my personal and my professional life as a result."



Community leadership is one of the core values of Collingwood Neighbourhood House in southeast Vancouver. Their Community Leadership Institute was created after residents expressed a desire to develop skills such as meeting facilitation and fundraising, which can enhance their neighbourhood involvement. Mrs. Stewart, one of Vancouver Foundation's donors, has supported this project for the last two years from her donor-advised fund.

"Our perspective on leadership and community education is to offer skills development workshops open to the whole community, as well as a parallel opportunity to those who want a more comprehensive experience," explained Paula Carr, Collingwood's Director of Community Development. "This second group, working together on a more in-depth program, forms a core group that will learn together over two years."

Going forward into the coming year, the core group will be matched with community mentors and will complete their own leadership "passport" to track their personal goals and progress. "I have learned a lot about myself and my community from the process," said January, a core group member and one of the project's organizers.

For Derek Evans, Executive Director of the Naramata Centre in the Okanagan, strong leadership is linked with opportunities for respite and reflection, bolstered by solid skills. With Debbie Bell from SFU's Continuing Studies and a group of community workers, Evans developed Healing Communities, a cohort-based project bringing together 28 participants over two years.

Healing Communities was inspired by those working on the front-line in community organizations, particularly social service agencies. These individuals expressed a sense of frustration in the face of day-to-day pressures, and an urgent need to strengthen their effectiveness and organizational skills while at the same time developing a means of mutual support.

"These are leaders in their organizations," stated Debbie Bell, "but they need a chance to get away from their work and to share their experiences with others. One participant mentioned that his organ-



ization had 65 clients die of AIDS-related complications last year. Add this to the regular work in a day. No one can do this without support."

Patrice Pratt, Chair of Vancouver Foundation's Health and Social Development committee, reflects on the various leadership initiatives supported by the Foundation this past year. "Our committee supports initiatives that come from the community and build on people's strengths. These are the ones who will make a difference in their communities."

SUPPORT LEADERSHIP

Vancouver Foundation's approach to community capacity building is rooted in our belief that local communities know best and within them lie the abilities, skills and the understanding of local issues needed to respond creatively and effectively. This includes community foundations around the province.

Vancouver Foundation's Leadership Engagement and Development Program (LEAD) supports community foundations across BC by:

- Encouraging them to fund locally identified projects that build community capacity
- Increasing awareness with potential donors of community foundations as catalysts for constructive action
- Strengthening grantmaking in community foundations across British Columbia.

To participate in the LEAD program, community foundations must first outline their plan for linking community capacity building with their strategic objectives. Vancouver Foundation contributes funds for community foundations to redistribute as grants to their local not-for-profit organizations within a range of \$500 to \$2,500. Since the program started in 1999, more than 500 LEAD grants have been given to community or neighborhood projects throughout the province. The following briefly describes a handful of the projects undertaken during 2003.

CAMPBELL RIVER

The need to find employment is drawing young families and residents away from the community. In immigrant communities, this is particularly hard on seniors who, with limited English-speaking skills, are faced with a shrinking social circle.

With a LEAD grant provided by the Campbell River Community Foundation, the Multicultural and Immigrant Services Society worked with other community groups to support immigrant seniors. This included learning and practicing English, discovering other services and programs available to them, and broadening their social networks.

PARKSVILLE - QUALICUM

The residents of Trillium Lodge, a long-term care facility, now enjoy the simple pleasures of a therapeutic garden. Funded by the Parksville Qualicum Community Foundation's LEAD grant program, the project brought together community groups, garden clubs and students from the local high school.

PRINCE GEORGE

Prince George Community Foundation provided a LEAD grant to a budding local performance company called the Street Spirits Theatre Project. Drawing on the energies and interests of performers who were marginalized kids off the street, the company bases their material on relevant social themes such as family violence, safe sex and poverty. Audiences interact with performers by contributing ideas for solutions.

This LEAD grant paid for five performances, which introduced the company to the community. It also encouraged partnership with other community agencies in the solution finding process.

SOUTH OKANAGAN

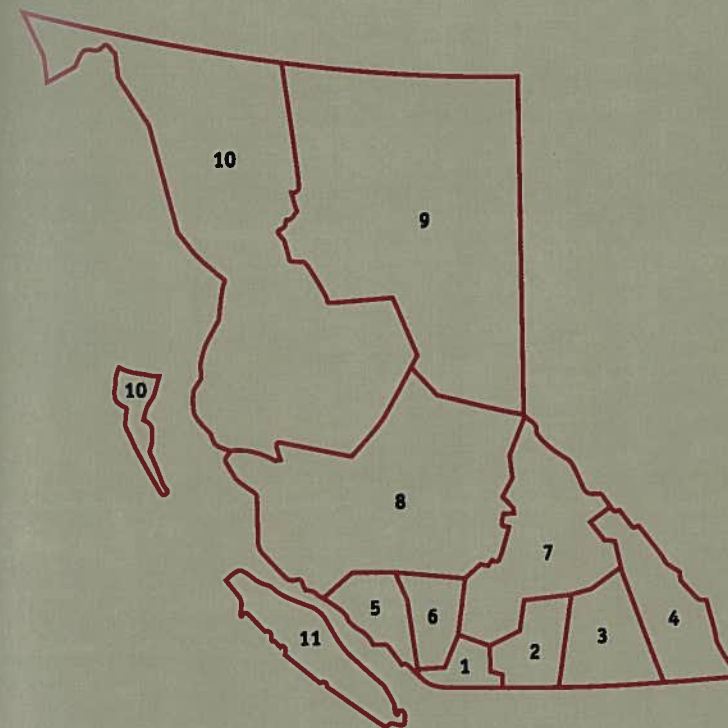
The South Okanagan Community Foundation was able to help the Osoyoos Desert Society develop facilities to transport and care for desert plants rescued from the threatened Antelope-Bush ecosystem. In cooperation with local vineyards, the society identifies areas earmarked for development, rescues the plants, and stores them until homes can be found either at golf and country clubs or other community sites needing restoration.

SURREY

Through its Youth Advisory Council, the Surrey Community Foundation provided a LEAD grant to help the Evergreen Foundation train high school students. This training prepares the students for leadership roles in schoolground naturalization projects and environmental education for "at-risk" peers.

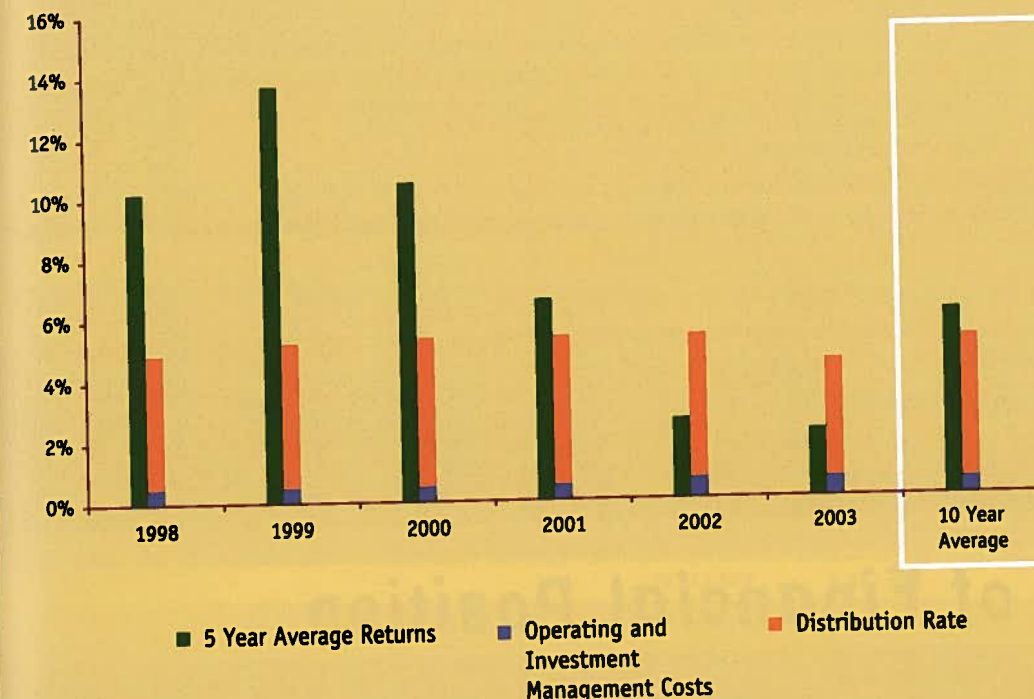

Investment Structure of Consolidated Trust Fund

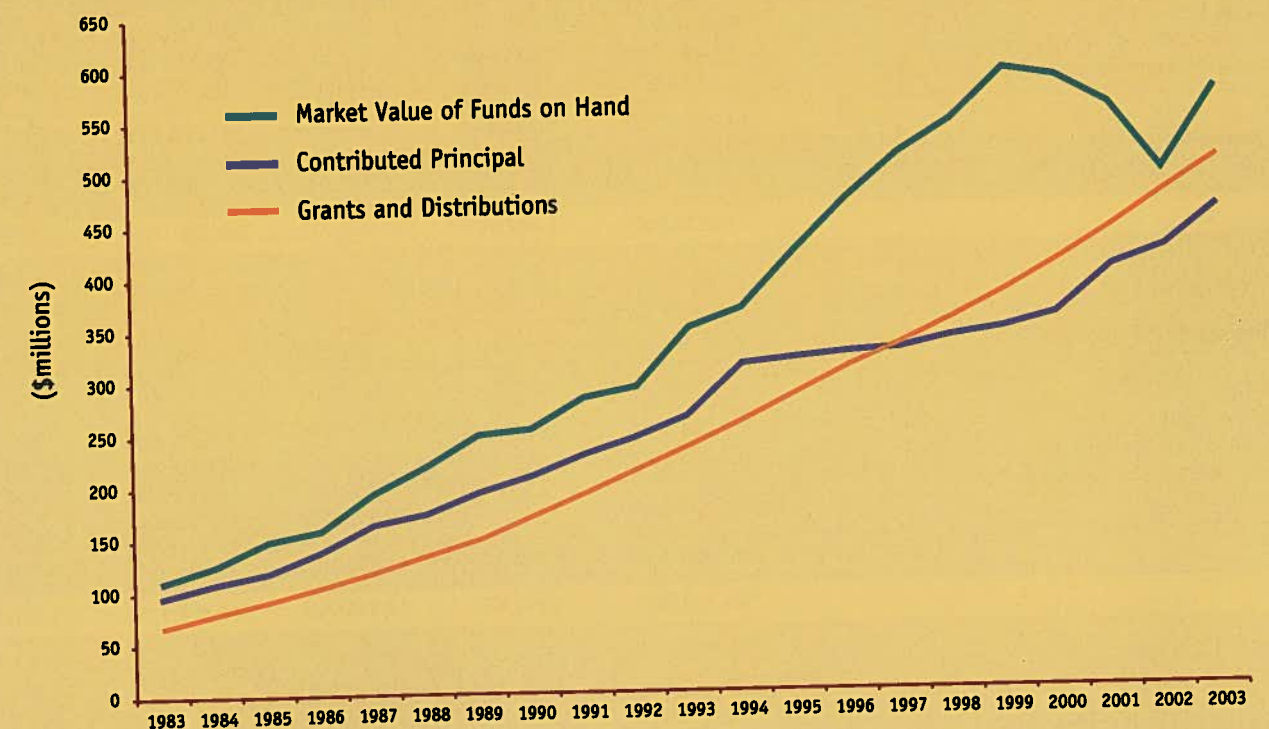

Notes to Financial Statements

DECEMBER 31, 2003

1 Purpose and status

Vancouver Foundation (the Foundation) was established in 1943 and became incorporated through an Act of the Provincial Legislature in 1950.

The income from funds donated and bequeathed to its endowment is used to provide for charitable purposes throughout British Columbia. The Foundation serves three major constituencies: its donors, the charitable sector and the community.

The Foundation is registered with the Charities Division, Canada Revenue Agency and is classified as a public foundation. As such, it is exempt from federal income taxes and can issue charitable donation receipts.

CONTROLLED ENTITY

On March 3, 2003, British Columbia Unclaimed Property Society (the Society) was incorporated under the Society Act of the Province of British Columbia. The purpose of the Society is to act as the administrator under the Unclaimed Property Act (British Columbia) and Unclaimed Property Amendment Act, 2003. The Foundation owns all of the shares in three corporations which are the sole members of the Society and thereby it is able to indirectly control the election of directors of the Society and the admission of new members to the Society. The Society's financial statements are not consolidated in the Foundation's financial statements but are shown separately under note 5.

2 Nature of the funds

The Foundation follows the restricted fund method of accounting for contributions to the Consolidated Trust Fund and Other Trust Funds.

CONSOLIDATED TRUST FUND

The Consolidated Trust Fund holds resources contributed for community endowment. The Board of Directors exercises discretionary control over the investment of these assets through external investment fund managers. Income earned on the Consolidated Trust Fund resources are reported in the Consolidated Trust Fund and at the discretion of the Board of Directors are either retained in the Consolidated Trust Fund or transferred to the Distribution and Administration Fund. Certain endowment funds with charitable tax status could be subject to partial withdrawal according to the terms of the deed of gifts.

OTHER TRUST FUNDS

The Other Trust Funds hold resources over which the Foundation does not exercise discretionary investment control and which are administered in accordance with recommendations from the donors. Distribution of these resources is administered in accordance with recommendations from the donors.

DISTRIBUTION AND ADMINISTRATION FUND

The Distribution and Administration Fund represents resources authorized and allocated for grants and distributions. These are held in interest bearing marketable securities payable in Canadian currency.

3 Significant accounting policies

INVESTMENTS

Investments within the Consolidated Trust Fund are valued at current market prices on the last business day of the fiscal period.

Investments within the Other Trust Funds and the Distribution and Administration Fund are stated at cost. Should the carrying value of these investments exceed market value, the investments are written down to market value.

PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

The Foundation capitalizes the cost of major capital additions and amortizes the cost of these assets over their estimated useful lives. Lease inducements received in conjunction with the Foundation's lease are offset against the cost of leasehold improvements. Management has determined the estimated useful lives to be:

Computer and office equipment	3 to 5 years straight-line
Office furniture	10 years straight-line
Leasehold improvements - net of lease inducements	straight-line over the term of the lease (10 years)

Operating expenses for 2003 include amortization of property, plant and equipment of \$68,973 (2002 -\$96,390).

REVENUE RECOGNITION

Contributions are recognized when received and deeds of gifts have been approved.

Bequests are recorded upon receipt of the donated assets. Bequests in a form other than cash or marketable securities will be recorded at values determined by the Board of Directors.

Interest on bonds, mortgages and short-term notes is accrued as earned. Dividends that have been declared are recorded as income on the date of record set for the dividend.

GRANTS

Grants are recorded when paid by the Foundation.

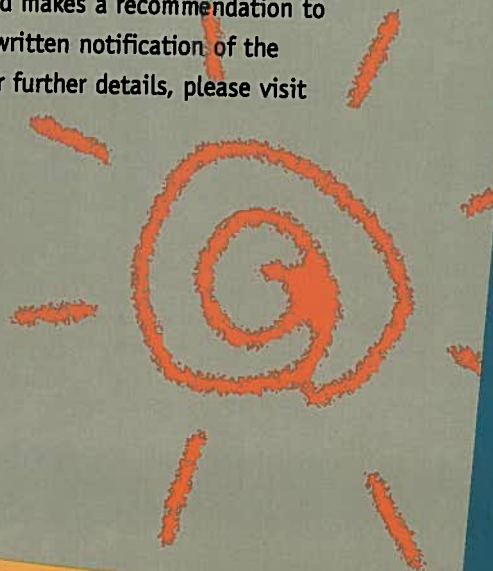

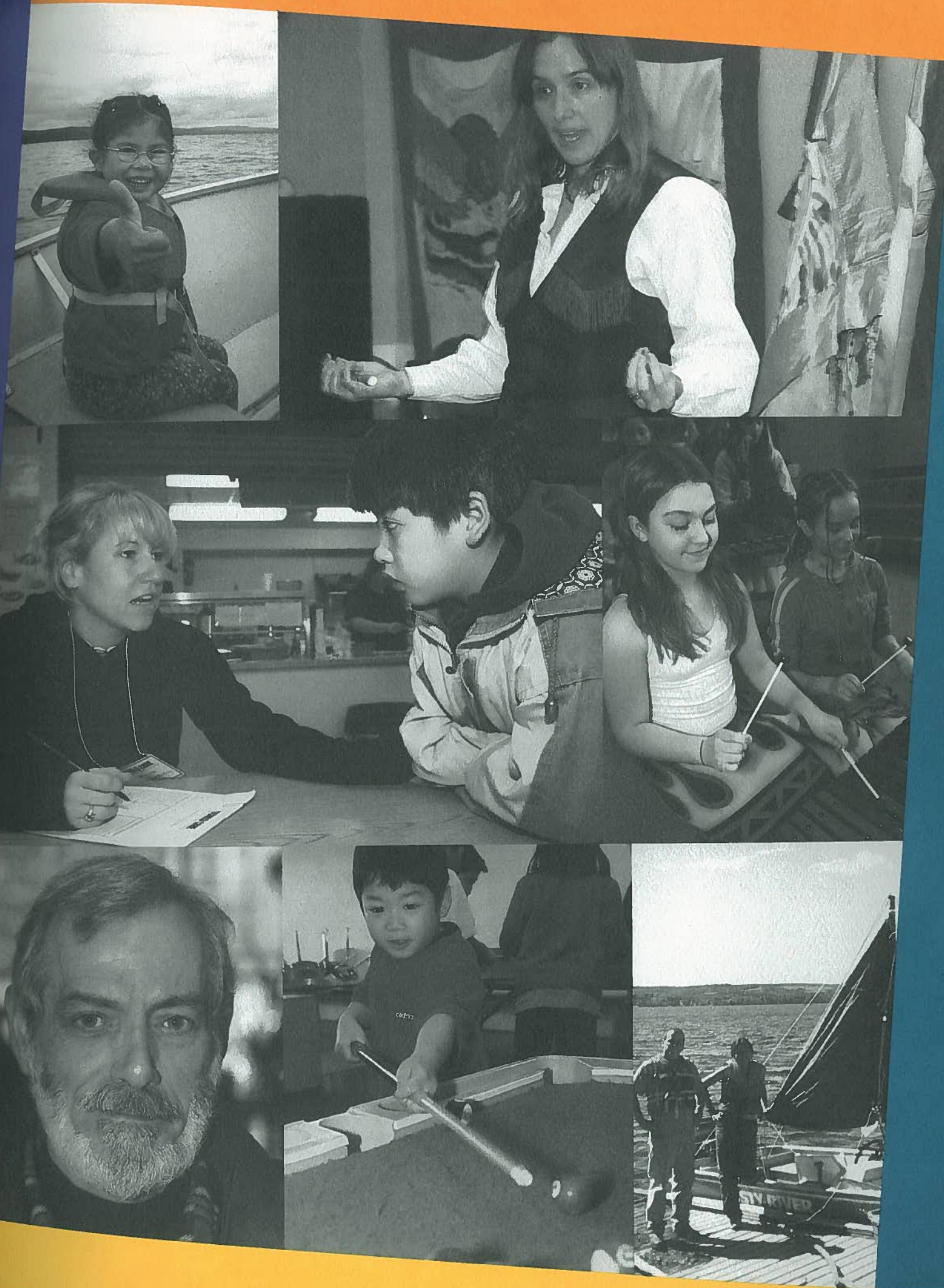
